FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I was so honored last week to have Bishop Rice install me as your new pastor. Many thanks to everyone who helped make it so beautiful. Most importantly, I would like to extend to our Parish Council my gratitude for pulling together the reception that followed. It was a great time to spend with parishioners and get to know them a bit better.

At the same time as my installation, members of the Saint Vincent De Paul Society of our parish were hard at work and, in fact, all weekend were wrapping close to 1,000 presents for families in need. When one walked into the church hall, you could not help but be overwhelmed at the sight of numerous volunteers sorting and wrapping, and gifts everywhere. This is only possible through the generosity of our parishioners, which to me is so inspiring.

As you may know, this past December 8, Pope Francis inaugurated a Holy Year of Mercy, a time of Jubilee when the entire Church is called to focus on the merciful love of the Father. The Catholic Church first celebrated a Jubilee in 1300, when pilgrims journeyed to Rome in celebration and prayer. Jubilee years have been held over the centuries, usually every 25 years, the last one being the Great Jubilee of the Year 2000. We would have had a Jubilee next in 2025, but our Holy Father Francis has proclaimed this year to promote what has become the hallmark of his papacy: The Mercy of God. This year, all of us are invited and encouraged to encounter God's mercy in a new way, remembering that mercy comes before judgment and love always takes precedence over condemnation.

At his homily on December 8, opening the Holy Year of Mercy, Pope Francis said: "This Extraordinary Holy Year is itself a gift of grace. To pass through the Holy Door means to rediscover the infinite mercy of the Father who welcomes everyone and goes out personally to encounter each of them. This will be a year in which we grow ever more convinced of God's mercy. How much wrong we do to God and his grace when we speak of sins being punished by his judgment before we speak of their being forgiven by his mercy! But that is the truth. We have to put mercy before judgment, and in any event God's judgment will always be in the light of his mercy. In passing through the Holy Door, then, may we feel that we ourselves are part of this mystery of love. Let us set aside all fear and dread, for these do not befit men and women who are loved. Instead, let us experience the joy of encountering that grace which transforms all things."

Perhaps, it is a sign of God's providence that I begin my time as your Pastor at the same time that we begin this Year of Mercy. It has become so clear to me that God wants mercy and compassion to be at the heart of everything I say or do at Queen of All Saints, and I so want to bring God's mercy and compassion to this parish family.

Through the listening sessions so far, I have come to know that the parish has had its struggles in the past. I know that there are some hurt feelings. I know that some have left the parish. I know that the faith of some has been shaken. If you have experienced any of this, I am truly sorry, and I will do my very best this year – and in the years to come – to be a sign of God's mercy. We have a God who understands our humanity, suffers with us, and heals our wounds. God alone can heal our hearts, and it is this loving, merciful God that we are called to encounter this year. This is my hope and prayer for our parish in the year to come: that we will all experience God's mercy, that we will be compassionate and understanding of one another, that we will heal old wounds, and that we will invite people back to this Church to experience God's merciful love and a community transformed.

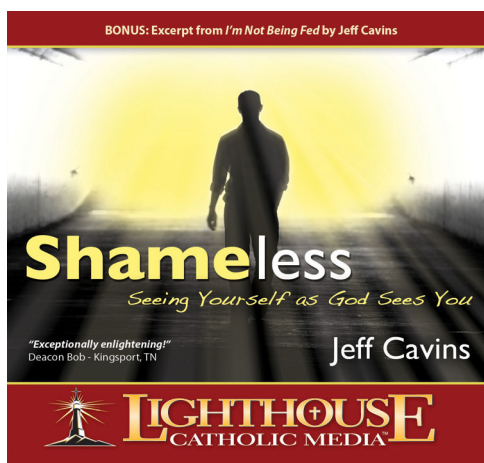

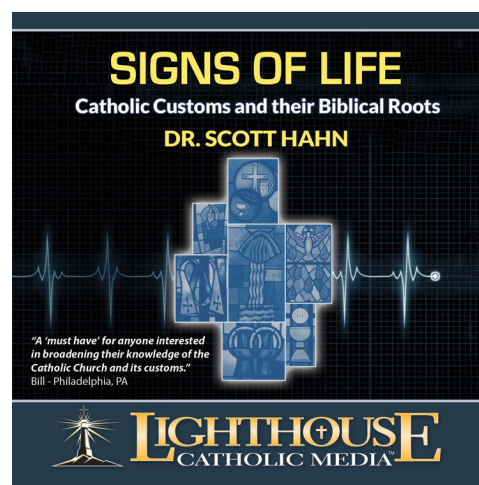

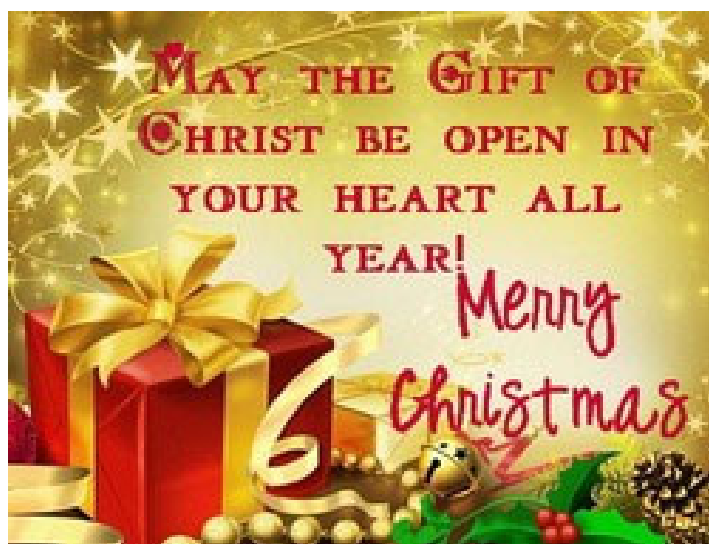
