
"Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?'" - JOHN 1:38

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Several years ago, I paid \$94.50 to have my picture taken. Even though the price was high, the picture turned out to be pretty crappy and I would not recommend the photographer to anyone! I'd love to get my money back, but the Arnold Police Department's *Photo Enforcement Division* informed me that they never promised "quality" photography....it was just good enough to catch my license plate as I was running a red light at Hwy 141 and Astra Way. I was on my way to celebrate Mass at Immaculate Conception Church in Arnold. I wasn't in a hurry, it's just that I wasn't



paying attention, probably daydreaming when the light changed to yellow, and I was caught unaware. Then in a moment of mild panic I had to decide to either slam on my brakes or go for it. I made the wrong decision and I had to literally pay the price!

Being caught "unaware" can get us into trouble and cause panic on occasion. This is also true in our spiritual lives. We can get lazy and sloppy in the practice of our faith, and we forget why we were created; why we live in this world and where we are headed. We have a half hearted (or non-existent) prayer life and our presence at Mass on Sunday becomes optional. Our spiritual awareness becomes dulled and little by little we slip into a state is spiritual "daydreaming", not paying attention to our purpose. And then suddenly we are caught off guard by a red light; the death of a loved one, cancer, the loss of a job, divorce....and we are awakened to reality in a painful, sobering way.

As much as I hated getting an expensive ticket, it did serve the purpose of making me drive with more awareness. Maybe that is how we should be going through life, with a little more awareness of what is important. Are you awake and aware of your journey towards God? Examine your spiritual life; make a conscious decision to embrace your faith in a deeper way and the next time you hear the words "say cheeeeeeese," and make sure it is not in the middle of an intersection in Arnold!


Adult Faith Opportunity

We will NOT be meeting this Thursday because a group of us will be en route to the March for Life. Pray for us!







Select the specific location by name. (ex. Queen of All Saints)

Click the roles associated with your employment/service at that location.

If you are active at only one location, this will be your "primary" location.

If you are active at more than one location, click the ADD PARISH/LOCATION button and repeat the steps above. With more than one location, please click the "This is my main/primary location" circle to indicate where you are employed or, if you are a volunteer, where most of your ministry or service is performed.

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding.
