"Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." MATTHEW 5:16

The more we recognize God's gifts, the more we want to share them. Good stewards recognize that God is working through them and they don't put themselves above the people they have been called to help.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

How far would you go to sit on a park bench? Would you go to Norway? In the winter? Many people do.

Rjukan is a small town in central Norway of just 3,500 people. It is located in a valley between two mountains. For six months a year, sunlight cannot reach the town. The citizenry has but two choices - complete darkness or dark shadows, all that is allowable because of the town's position between the two mountains. Any sunlight available during the winter, which in Norway is not much, is blocked by the two mountains. You can have darkness, or you can have shadows. Until 2013, until Martin Anderson had an idea.

Anderson convinced the people of Rjukan to invest in three giant mirrors and install them on the peaks of the surrounding mountains. These mirrors, placed 500 yards above the town, are solar-powered and computer-controlled and thus are able to steadily track the movement of the sun. The rays of the sun are reflected down to the town square, bathing it in great sunlight. Six park benches were installed in the square and every day, at the proper time, the people come to enjoy the light from the sun, which they can't physically see from mid-March to mid-September. But because of the mirrors, they can bask in its rays. And they do. They bring their babies in strollers. They bring the dog. They sit in groups enjoying conversation and a cup of coffee. It's the only place in town where one can enjoy the warmth of the sun, and everybody wants to be there. Even tourists, who come from across Norway just to sit in the one spot in an entire town where rays of the sun pour down. People are fascinated by the light that shines in Rjukan.

Jesus would like a similar fascination with the light that comes from him through us. This Light, too, offers warmth, the warmth of Christ's love. This Light, too, shines through the darkness, and the darkness will not overcome it. This Light, too, must be reflected, not because it is tracked by computers, but because it is spread by us, disciples who were first given the Light at our baptisms, people who strive daily to spread the Light of Christ by our words and our deeds. It has been said that light transforms the cold terror of night into the warm assurance of day. Light enables us to discover, to study, to discern, to behold the beauty of our world and the wonders of God's creation. Light warms, nurtures, sustains, reveals, and cheers. It is among the most generous of all physical properties. Sharing light is a wonderful thing to do.

There's a small village in rural India that has no electricity. People use tiny oil lamps to light their homes, just as people would have done in the time of Jesus. The temple in this village has a large frame hanging from its ceiling. Cut into the frame are hundreds of slots into which the tiny oil lamps can be placed. When the people go to the temple they carry their lamps from home to guide them in the darkness. Upon arrival at the temple, they place their lamp in one of the slots. By the time every villager arrives, the darkness of the temple has been transformed into a glorious sea of light.

We're blessed to have electricity in our church, but let us pray that we will have always in our parish the glorious Light of Jesus Christ. May our reflection of Christ bring warmth, comfort, and goodness to all who need relief from the darkness. This Light may not be discovered on a park bench. Let's pray it can be found in our church pews.


