"But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you..." MATTHEW 5:44

It changes my heart and actions, allowing for a little more empathy for "my enemy." When we pray for others, even our enemies, it may soften their hearts as well.

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

An entry in <u>The Diary of Anne Frank</u> states: "I understand more and more how true Daddy's words were when he said, 'All children must look after their own upbringing.' Parents can only give good advice or put them on the right paths, but the final forming of a person's character lies in his own hands."

Jesus would agree. In today's Gospel Jesus continues his Sermon on the Mount. By

expressing his expectations for a disciple, Jesus makes clear that each disciple will have to make the choice to obey the words of Jesus, and find strength in this life and joy in Heaven, or go their own way and find something else, something not very pleasant.

The teachings we hear from Jesus today are not easy to hear or practice - turn the other cheek, go the extra mile, hand over your cloak and tunic. Of course, they weren't meant to be easy, they were meant to inspire and invigorate. Disciples of Jesus do not tremble at the cost, they embrace the challenge.

Jack Katz was born in 1941 and in 1962 he became a starting defensive lineman for the football team at the University of Florida. Whenever the coach had the linemen run wind sprints for conditioning, Katz always finished first, proving himself to be the fastest of the "big men" on the team.

Jack went to Coach Ray Graves and ask for permission to run wind sprints with the faster and smaller backfield players. Permission was granted.

For the next several days, Jack ran sprints with the running backs. He was last every time, which surprised no one. The coach went to him and asked if Jack wouldn't rather go back to winning races against the lineman, rather than lose, by a lot, every race against the backs.

Jack responded, "I'm not out here to outrun the linemen. I already know I can do that. I'm here to learn how to run faster; and if you've noticed, I'm losing by a little less every day."

Indeed, a lineman's job is not only to break through and scatter the line on the other team, but to tackle the quarterback and backfield players. Jack was preparing himself for an important goal: real-game tackles, and for his ultimate goal: success in life, which he found. Jack Katz went into business after graduation and founded the Panama Jack Company, an international dealer of suncare, swimwear, and tropical lifestyle products. His worth has been listed at \$300 million.

Jesus is speaking to disciples who already know how to love those who love them in return. He's teaching those who know already how to greet their friends. No big deal about that. But can these disciples volunteer to do what's more difficult, more challenging? Can we? Are not all of Christ's disciples, then and now, called to turn that other cheek and go that extra mile? Does the Lord not expect that we will love our enemies and pray for our persecuters? Yes, Christ does.

I believe Jesus would look for a bit of Jack Katz in all of us, hoping each of us would be the one who would tell Jesus we're ready for the next step, the bigger challenge, realizing we may struggle for a time; heck, we even may finish in last place. But we won't give up, we'll improve, we'll do better every day. As Otto Frank said, "children must look after their own upbringing." As God's children, we're looking after ours, doing what Jesus tells us to do.

#### **Return Palms**

Ash Wednesday is February 22nd. In anticipation of the start of Lent, all parishioners are asked to return the palms you received last year. Baskets will be available the next two weeks. Remember to bring those palms **before** Ash Wednesday!

#### ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

*Abstinence* means refraining from meat. *Fast* means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted).

All Catholics *from age 14 onward* (with no upper limit) are required to maintain *abstinence* on Ash Wednesday (February 22, 2023), all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday (April 7, 2023).


On **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**, *fasting* is obligatory for Catholics *from the ages of 18-59*. This fast is in addition to the abstinence from meat on those two days. No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.


