

"You shall not carve idols for yourselves in the shape of anything..." - Exodus 20:4



FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

O Come Let Us Adore Him! (And Not Just At Christmas!)

As in any Catholic parish, the celebration of the Eucharist is the core that holds everything together. I is the reason that everything else exists, including, the school, PSR, and all sports programs and social activities. Without the Eucharist we would be nothing more than a social club or a private elementary school. We attend Mass on Sunday to worship and adore Christ who literally gives Himself to us and becomes a part of our lives. Many people wish that after receiving communion they could spend more time in prayer, reflecting on the greatness of God and adoring Jesus Christ, but the Mass comes to an end, and we all leave. Well, the truth



is that we CAN spend more time in prayer before the Eucharistic presence of Christ. Eucharist Adoration gives us the opportunity to spend that quiet time with Jesus. When the sacred host is placed in the monstrance and set on the altar, it captures the moment when the priest lifts the host at the altar during Mass, saying "This is my Body given up for You" and freezes that moment. Now, willing souls can spend time at their leisure in communion with Jesus, reflecting on their lives, praying for their loved ones, and contemplating the presence of the risen Christ right in front of them.

Up until now, we have only offered adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Tuesdays and on special occasions. We are now going to expand the opportunity for adoration by making the Blessed Sacrament available on Mondays and Wednesdays following the 8:15 Mass until 4pm. It will take place in the "Cry Room" which will be converted into a temporary adoration chapel for those days. (The cry room will still be used as a cry room during Masses). Tuesday Adoration will continue in church as always ending with Confessions, Perpetual Help Devotions and Benediction. We hope to expand even more to include Thursdays and Fridays in the future as soon as we get enough volunteers to fill the hours. Make a habit of dropping in for a visit during the day and while you are there tell Jesus I said "Hey!"

A NOTE FOR THE EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS

Dear Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, please remember to purify your Pyx. Especially if you have to fracture a host, there could be small particles left in your Pyx. Put water in your Pyx and consume it so no particles remain.

Also, when bringing the Eucharist to the homebound or sick, bring a small white purificator, which you can get in the sacristy, in case someone spits out part of the host. The residue will need to be put in a cup of water and brought to a Priest or Deacon, who will take it to the sacristy for proper disposition.



ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (February 14, 2024), and all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (March 29, 2024) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), fast as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.

Click "Register" below the LOG IN button (image at right).

Enter the passcode stlprotect when prompted.

Select the type of location where you are a volunteer or employee.

- *Parish or Parish School
- *Non-Parish School or Program
- *Archdiocesan Agency
- *Non-Archdiocesan Organization

Select the specific location by name. (ex. Queen of All Saints)

Click the roles associated with your employment/service at that location.

If you are active at only one location, this will be your "primary" location.

If you are active at more than one location, click the ADD PARISH/LOCATION button and repeat the steps above. With more than one location, please click the "This is my main/primary location" circle to indicate where you are employed or, if you are a volunteer, where most of your ministry or service is performed.

Complete your personal information. Please enter your legal first name (no nicknames) for the purpose of the background screening.

Create a username, password and password clue. ****(BE SURE TO SAVE THIS INFORMATION TO AVOID RE-REGISTERING. DOUBLE BACKGROUND CHECKS ARE COSTLY TO OUR PARISH!!!)

Agree to the Terms of Use and click SUBMIT.

You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening</u>, <u>register for a **Protecting God's Children workshop</u>, <u>view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES</u> and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete <u>ALL</u> steps to complete the process.

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and yulnerable adults.
