

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

It's Lent.....Time For Your Annual Spiritual Checkup!



We are almost halfway through Lent. It's time to make your peace with God! Most people dread going to their annual checkup with the doctor or dentist. But these visits help catch and fix serious issues and prevent further issues. Confession does the same thing. As much as we might dread going to confession for our spiritual checkup, it puts us back on track to the kingdom and sets our conscience free from the guilt that we carry. Make no mistake about it, one day we will stand before God in judgement, and we will have to answer for our lives: the good and the bad. That can make some of us nervous because we don't always live the way we should. But we do not have to live in fear of the final judgement before God. Confession allows us to pre-empt final judgement and face Jesus right now and deal with all the sins, faults, vices, and flaws that afflict us. The beautiful thing is that if we face judgement now in the confessional, there is still time to change, to repent, to return to the life that we should be living. Don't be afraid of confession. The important thing to remember that you are not going to see the priest, you are going to meet Jesus. The priest gives voice to the powerful words of Jesus when he says "I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Now go in peace!"

At Queen of All Saints, we offer confessions every Tuesday morning after the 6:15 and 8:15 Masses, and Tuesday evenings from 6-7pm, on Saturday mornings 7:30-8am and Saturday afternoon from 4-4:45pm. Also, for Lent, Priests from South County area will be hearing confessions at St. Francis of Assisi Parish on Friday, March 22, 6-8pm and all day Saturday, March 23, 9am until 3pm.


BAPTISMAL PREPARATION

A NOTE FOR THE EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS

Dear Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, please remember to purify your Pyx. Especially if you have to fracture a host, there could be small particles left in your Pyx. Put water in your Pyx and consume it so no particles remain.

Also, when bringing the Eucharist to the homebound or sick, bring a small white purificator, which you can get in the sacristy, in case someone spits out part of the host. The residue will need to be put in a cup of water and brought to a Priest or Deacon, who will take it to the sacristy for proper disposition.



ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (February 14, 2024), and all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (March 29, 2024) are days of *abstinence* (refraining from meat) for all Catholics *from age 14 onwards*. On these two days, (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), *fast* as well as *abstinence*, is also obligatory for those *from the ages of 18-59*. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.
