FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Every Wednesday the St. Louis Post-Dispatch includes a section called, “Let’s Eat.” Since the section deals with cooking, recipes, and the right type of wine to serve with a meal, and since my cooking skills begin and end with turning on a microwave, I have little interest in the “Let’s Eat” section and barely give it a glance.

This past Wednesday, though, was different. As I dismantled the March 8th edition of the Post I couldn’t help but notice the headline in the “Let’s Eat” section - “Irish Nachos.” I smiled, shook my head, and imagined my Irish-born father turning over in his grave. My dad was strictly a meat-and-potatoes man, lots of potatoes. That was the main food of his childhood and his love of potatoes was lifelong. We’re talking about a man who took a brief tour of Italy with my mother and was so tired of eating pasta that finally at one restaurant he asked if they served potatoes. He was pleased and excited when they said yes, until the potatoes came - in a bowl of pasta! I received insight into his love of potatoes once when I sat in his boyhood home in County Mayo and watched his mother eat five potatoes in one meal. Irish nachos? Please.

Of course, the same section of the paper included an article entitled, “Ten Ways to Serve Corned Beef.” Among these were the definitely Irish ways of putting corned beef in a casserole, stuffing it into quesadillas, and adding it to tacos. Never mind that I’ve been to Ireland about 15 times and I’ve never even heard the words, “corned beef,” much less been served it. Oh, my poor father!

All of these articles lead up to this week’s celebration of St. Patrick’s Day. Many people will take off work Friday, though not to pray, but to party. Many will dress in green, go to parades, eat corned beef, and drink way more alcohol than they should. Such activities may accomplish any number of things, one being that everybody has a fun time, another being that a person is really embarrassed by their boorish behavior. But I doubt that any of it actually honors St. Patrick.

You’re familiar with the story of St. Patrick. He was born around 385 in Britain, was captured while still a youth and sold into slavery in Ireland. After escaping to France, he studied for the priesthood and later, as a bishop, he returned to Ireland to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ. He overcame many difficulties and the fierce opposition of some kings and clans while converting thousands and establishing the Catholic Church in Ireland. He once wrote, “God answered my prayers in such a way that in these last days, ignorant though I am, I might be bold enough to take up so holy and so wonderful a task, and imitate in some degree those who the Lord had so long ago foretold as heralds of his Gospel, bearing witness to all nations.”

To me, as one given the name of this holy man, that is how you honor St. Patrick, to see our obligation to share the Good News of Jesus Christ as a holy and wonderful task. Ireland has a rich history of people who have done that, including St. Oliver Plunkett, whose head is pictured here.

Four years ago I was in Ireland and the city of Drogheda, about 30 miles north of Dublin. I saw a big church in the center of the city and decided to go in and make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament. After a few prayers I walked around the church and saw, off to one side, a small shrine. Going closer to see what it was, I gazed upon the head of St. Oliver Plunkett. No doubt, I had never seen this in any church before, or since!

Oliver Plunkett was born in 1625 and was ordained a priest in Rome in 1654. Unable to return to Ireland because of oppression of the Catholic faith by the English, he became a theology professor. He could not return to Ireland until 1670, doing so as a bishop. He worked tirelessly to improve and expand the Catholic faith, at times having to do so in disguise, fearful of capture by the English. Eventually, he was caught and convicted of high treason “for promoting the Roman faith,” the judge telling Plunkett, “your treason was setting up your false religion, than which there is not anything more displeasing to God or more pernicious (destructive) to mankind in the world.” After his execution, Plunkett’s head was brought to Drogheda, where it remains to this day in St. Peter Church there.

People like Oliver Plunkett, that’s the legacy of St. Patrick. People who value their calling as holy and wonderful tasks, that’s honoring St. Patrick. People like you and me, ready to proclaim Jesus Christ, even, and especially, in difficult times, that makes St. Patrick smile. Irish Nachos? Corned beef in a casserole? I don’t think so.

Enjoy St. Patrick’s Day. Make it a day of prayer above all else. Go to Mass before you go anywhere else. Honor God by honoring this holy man.

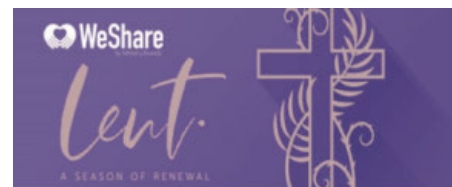

MONTHLY PRO-LIFE MASS AND ROSARY

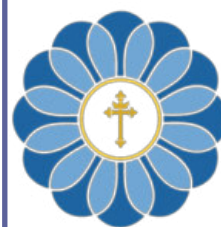

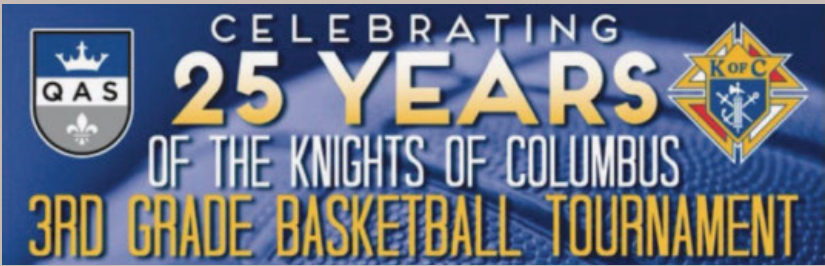
Help a Teen Encounter Christ on Retreat This Summer!
