#### STEWARDSHIP 5TH SUNDAY OF LENT

"Jesus said to her, 'Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?'" JOHN 11:40

Do we really put our trust in the Lord? When we live a life of gratitude, recognizing all that we have been given, we really do see that God is providing for our needs. Living a grateful and generous life allows us to see God's active presence in our daily lives and we become "partakers of the divine nature."

#### FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Once upon a time there was a proud man named Karl who loved to ride his horse through his vast estate, during which time he would congratulate himself on his enormous wealth. One day he came upon Hans, an old tenant farmer, who had sat down to eat his lunch in the shade of a great oak tree. Hans' head was bowed in prayer. When Hans looked up, he said, "Oh, excuse me, sir. I didn't see you. I was giving thanks for my food."



"Humph!" snorted the rich man while noticing the course dark bread and cheese that made up the old man's lunch. "If that were all I had to eat," he sneered, "I don't think I'd feel like giving thanks." "Oh I assure you," replied Hans, "it's quite sufficient. But it's remarkable that you should come here today because I feel that I have to tell you something. I had a strange dream just before awakening this morning," "Oh, yeah, what did you dream?" Karl asked with a condescending smile. The old farmer answered, "There was beauty and peace all around, and yet, I could hear a voice whispering, 'The richest man in the valley will die tonight." "Dumb dream," shouted Karl. "Nonsense!"

He mounted his horse and galloped away. Hans bowed his head and returned to his prayer. "Die tonight?" Karl mused. "It's ridiculous. I'm not going to panic." The best thing to do, he considered, was to forget all about the old fellow's dream.

And yet...and yet, he couldn't forget it. He had felt fine, at least until Hans described that crazy dream of his. Now he wasn't sure he felt all that well. So that evening he arranged for his doctor, who was also a good friend, to be brought to the estate. When the doctor arrived, Karl told him of his strange encounter with Hans and the strange dream Hans had had, how the richest man in the valley would die this very night.

"Oh come on," replied the doctor, "sounds silly to me, but for your peace of mind, let me give you a quick examination." He did so, and when the examination was complete, the doctor was all smiles and full of assurance. He said, Karl you're as strong and healthy as that horse you ride. There's no way you're going to die tonight."

The doctor was just closing his bag when a messenger arrived out of breath at the manor door. "Doctor, doctor," he cried, "come quick. It's old Hans. He just died in his sleep!"

There is no record of the size of the home of Lazarus but I doubt it would be considered a manor. We don't know if he owned a horse, but if he did, I doubt he had an estate on which to ride it. Still, we may consider Lazarus a rich man because he had a friend named Jesus.

Like Hans in the story above, Lazarus would not have counted his riches in terms of money, property, or possessions. He had two wonderful sisters, Martha and Mary. Together, they had many friends, for today's Gospel mentions that many people had come to console Martha and Mary after their brother's death. Lazarus, along with his sisters, must have been friendly and generous, for Jesus and his disciples went to their home for a meal. Who would go for a meal at the home of stingy and dour people? Surely, Lazarus was rich in many ways.

His friendship with Jesus would have been the best of them. Though Jesus delays once he learns of Lazarus' mortal illness, our Lord makes his way to Bethany possessing tender love and amazing power, and he has no intention of keeping either to himself. His love for his friend is shown by his tears, his power is shown by raising Lazarus from the dead. How wonderful for Lazarus that he has life again. How wonderful for us that Jesus wants to share his power with us, too. What else can we do but glorify God?

St. Ambrose wrote, "No one can make the ascent without you, O Lord, for you are our way, our truth, our life, our strength, our confidence, our reward. Be the way that receives us, Jesus, the truth that strengthens us, the life that invigorates us." We could add, "Keep us rich, O Jesus, like Hans, like Lazarus, that we may believe and follow you.





You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.


