




A NOTE FOR THE EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS

Dear Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, please remember to purify your Pyx. Especially if you have to fracture a host, there could be small particles left in your Pyx. Put water in your Pyx and consume it so no particles remain.

Also, when bringing the Eucharist to the homebound or sick, bring a small white purificator, which you can get in the sacristy, in case someone spits out part of the host. The residue will need to be put in a cup of water and brought to a Priest or Deacon, who will take it to the sacristy for proper disposition.

CHURCH RENOVATION UPDATE

We have some exciting news to share with you! The pews have been ordered and we are on track for our summer renovation schedule. In an effort to maximize the beauty, comfort and longevity of our investment, the Church Renovation Committee has chosen to upgrade our pews to solid hardwood in lieu of wood veneer. We feel this will maximize the elegance of our long-term investment. In addition, we have chosen to upgrade the look of the pew frontals (the section in front of the first pew) with raised panel hardware to enhance the look of our worship space. We have also upgraded the pew seat back to a contoured seat to improve comfort. With these upgrades, the cost of the pews has increased by \$29,500. While we continue to execute our renovation with a focus on good stewardship of your donations, we believe this is a valued investment that will be enjoyed for generations. As such, we ask that you prayerfully consider a donation to offset the cost of these upgrades as we would greatly appreciate your generosity. Please recognize that any donation would be restricted to the church renovation project and not used for general parish expenses. 


