STEWARDSHIP PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

"As they were marching out, they came upon a man of Cyrene, Simon by name; this man they pressed into service to carry his cross."

MATTHEW 27:32

The Lord calls us to love God and to love our neighbor. Every day we are presented with opportunities to love our neighbor and help him "carry his cross." These opportunities aren't usually big events, they are usually ordinary occurrences like helping someone carry their groceries or holding the door open for them. The key is putting the other person's needs before our own and not expecting anything in return.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I've always been impressed by this story about Karen Watson. "You're only reading this if I died." That's how the story begins in an article by religious writer King Duncan. "You're only reading this if I died" was the first sentence in a letter Karen wrote to her family before she began a missionary trip to Iraq. Karen became a Christian at age 29. As she grew in her faith, she felt the call to go to Iraq and serve as a relief worker with her church's Mission Board. In Iraq, Karen and her fellow workers built schools and worked on a water purification project. She also



led a literacy project for widows, teaching them to read and write and gain job skills to support themselves. And when the opportunity arose, she shared her faith in Jesus with those she helped.

Karen met many wonderful people, who despite being victims of poverty and war, extended to her both kindness and appreciation. Still, she knew she would be working in dangerous places. That's why she wrote and set aside a letter to her family that began "You're only reading this if I died."

On March 15, 2004, Karen and her fellow workers were killed by gunmen in the city of Mosul, Iraq. Karen had sold her home and all she owned before she left for Iraq. The only things she left behind this earth were one duffel bag of everyday items, and a letter for her family. One quote from the letter is particularly beautiful. Karen, facing a dangerous and uncertain mission in Iraq, wrote, "I wasn't called to a place, I was called to Him...To obey was my objective, to suffer was expected, His glory my reward."

To obey, to suffer, to receive glory - that's Jesus mission in a nutshell. It's certainly the experience we find as we travel through this greatest of all weeks - Holy Week. More than once, Jesus had told his disciples that suffering was waiting for him when they reached Jerusalem. Suffering? What was Jesus talking about? That surely would have been the discussion among the Apostles as they entered the city. No suffering here. Only celebration, exaltation, shouts of praise. Palms were placed before Jesus, Hosannas rang loud in his ears. What suffering?

The mood quickly changed, as we know well. Plots were hatched, Judas made an awful deal, Jesus was betrayed. Aware of these tragic circumstances, Jesus nevertheless gathered for a final meal with his apostles, even Judas Iscariot. Generous to the end, Jesus gives a final example of service by washing the feet of the apostles, and a final gift of strength by giving them - and us - his own Body and Blood. From Holy Thursday to this very day, disciples of Jesus have been privileged to share in a Sacred Meal, to feast at a Eucharistic Banquet.

Sadly, that supper ended badly. Judas left, Jesus was arrested, and the apostles fled; all but Peter, who stuck around long enough to deny ever knowing Jesus. Jesus, for his part, endured a night of torture and then a painful death - for us, for the forgiveness of our sins, for our salvation.

A woman named Alice Perry tells the story of the time she was driving up a steep road above the dam at Lake Junaluska in North Carolina. She saw a sign reading "Dangerous Intersection Ahead." Simultaneously she saw a lighted cross atop the hill. Suddenly it occurred to her that the words "Dangerous Intersection" referred not only to the road but also to the two intersecting beams of the cross. It was this "intersection" that started Alice thinking about how "dangerous" it is to follow Jesus. Listening to Jesus call "Follow me" and going wherever he leads is to put at risk your own personal dreams. It is to embark upon an adventure that surpasses all our dreams. The apostles, invigorated by the risen Christ, eventually understood that. So did Karen Watson.

Come this week, please, to the wonderful days of the Sacred Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday. Come to each Mass and Celebration and experience the depth of Christ's love, the steadfastness of his obedience, the glory of promises fulfilled. Come not only to this special place, come to Him. Come to Jesus, For, as has been said eloquently, "To obey was my objective, to suffer was expected, His glory my reward."

May God bless all of you in many special ways during this Holy Week.




