STEWARDSHIP DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

"Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.'" John 20:19

Are you good at making people feel welcome? When you meet someone new, like a new neighbor, a new work colleague or a new parishioner, do you make them feel at home? When we make people feel welcome, we make them feel like they are included instead of being excluded. We are made for relationships – with God and each other. When you see yourself as a beloved son or daughter of God, you tend to see others the same way, too – just as God, Our Father, sees us.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Once upon a time a young Chinese lad went to the Master because he wanted to learn how to make jade into beautiful objects. He went to the Master's house, knocked on the door, and said he'd come to sit at his feet and learn. The Master took a piece of jade, put it into the boy's hands, and sat there. He began to chatter about his wife, his children, his work, and all sorts of other things. All the while the boy was sitting there, minute after minute, hour after hour, holding the jade.



The next day the boy came back and the same thing happened. The Master put a piece of jade in the boy's hand, and then began to talk about all kinds of things, none of which had anything to do with jade. The boy was getting angry, "What a waste of time this is!" he thought. But he was too embarrassed or hesitant to say anything; after all, this was the Master. This went on week after week after week, until one day the boy came, and the Master put into his hand a stone. And the boy cried out and said, "Hey, this is a stone!" He had learned the feel of jade.

Or, the story can be turned on its head. Once upon a time a young lad went to the Master to learn how to make jade, and when he went there the Master put a stone in his hand. Every day this happened. The boy would arrive, express an interest in jade, and be given a stone, week after week after week. One day, though, the boy came and the Master put a piece of jade into his hands. The lad exclaimed, "What is this?" and he dropped it. The jade broke all over the floor.

The moral of the story is that if you keep holding something valuable and beautiful, you'll get a feel for it, and you'll know the counterfeit when you see it. By the same token, if you keep holding a stone in your hand, when something beautiful comes, you won't recognize it, and you will destroy it.

In today's second reading from the First Letter of St. Peter we hear the Apostle tell us that our faith is "more precious than gold that is perishable even though tested by fire..." That's quite a remarkable statement when you consider how difficult it must have been in the ancient world to mine gold, and, once extracted, how difficult it must have been to purify the gold, to burn off any refuse in an extremely hot fire. Do you realize how much time and effort it took to make such a fire? No gas hook-ups in those days, no flipping of a switch to start a fire, yet, our faith is more precious and valuable than gold. We have been given "a new birth to a living hope," writes St. Peter, "through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading..."

This valuable faith was placed into our hands at our Baptism and fortified at our Confirmation. We should be used to it. We should know how it feels, what it does, and how it strengthens. We should recognize quickly what is fake and untrue. We should make sure we never lose hold of this faith or drop it. We cannot let this faith be destroyed. The Master has given it to us.

Our Gospel today reminds us that our faith is nurtured best in community, that is, the Church. When Thomas was away from the community of believers he was stubborn and doubted. When with the others, he believed and proclaimed Jesus as "My Lord and my God."

Our parish here at QAS is a wonderful community in which we can stay close to Jesus. For example, the Knights of Columbus banded together to put on terrific Fish Fries that allowed so many to enjoy good food and companionship. Many of our parishioners joined together to decorate our church splendidly for Easter while others practiced songs for many hours so we could lift our voices in praise of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Such a community allows us to hold tightly to the valuable and brilliant gift of our faith. Let's pray we don't drop it.

HOLY THURSDAY PERFORMANCE






QAS School sixth grade students performed a play for the younger grades, reenacting the events of Holy Thursday.



The Divine Mercy Chaplet



1. Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

2. Optional Opening Prayers

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty yourself out upon us.

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the heart of Jesus as a fountain of mercy for us, I trust in you! Repeat three times

3. Our Father

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

4. Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

5. Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

6. Eternal Father

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your Dearly Beloved Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

7. On the Ten Small Beads of Each Decade

For the sake of his sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. Repeat for the Remaining Decades

Say the "Eternal Father" on the "Our Father" bead and then ten "For the sake of his sorrowful Passion" on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

Holy God

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Repeat three times

10. Optional Closing Prayer

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to your holy will, which is love and mercy itself.
