#### Dear Parishioners,

It is an exciting week here at Queen of All Saints. Not only do we continue to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ and all the blessings and hope that come with Jesus' triumph over sin and death, but also we celebrate two wonderful sacraments for our younger parishioners. Tomorrow, the 24th, our 8th grade parishioners will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. We will welcome Fr. Michael Boehm, a Vicar General in our Archdiocese, to confer the sacrament. It is comforting to know that as these 8th graders prepare to transition to high school they will do so empowered by the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit.



On Saturday, the 29th we will have two Masses during which our 2nd grade parishioners will receive their First Holy Communion. What a fantastic day for them, as it was for each one of us. Surely, everybody remembers something about our First Communion Day. Maybe it was clothing, your new dress or tie or shoes. Maybe it was one of your presents, perhaps a new prayer book (I still have mine from May 11, 1963) or a rosary. Hopefully you remember something about the Mass, the priest, the crowd. Certainly you remember how special you felt, how close to Jesus, how grateful to our Lord. I hope you still feel that way for sacraments are beautiful occasions and splendid gifts. Thinking about them leads me to ask you a few questions.

Do you savor baseball? Or a good steak? Or a production of a popular musical? Do you savor any of these or anything at all? Savor is a good word to use when contemplating the sacraments.

Take baseball, for example. Lots of people know about baseball and many of them go to baseball games. They know the rules of the game (and sometimes try to help the umpire interpret these rules!) and they know how to tally the score. But do they savor the game? Ponder it? Take it all in? Notice every detail? If so, they savor baseball. They're not just there as a spectator, casually watching the game while chatting with fellow fans. No, those who savor are intense, on the edge of their seats. They notice where the outfielders are positioned and how the infielders change positions if the batter has two strikes. They notice who's warming up in the bullpen and they know who's available to pinch-hit or pinch-run, for both teams. They take it in, ponder, discuss, plot, strategize as if they were the manager. They just don't acknowledge baseball, they savor baseball.

Other people may savor other things, take it all in, appreciate it, let it soak in deep. Maybe it's a good musical at the Muny or a great BBQ in the backyard. Whatever it may be, it's something grand, special, and important, too important to let fly by with barely a notice. No, it's so special one must savor it.

Why all this talk about savoring? Because one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit that our parishioners will receive tomorrow is the gift of Wisdom. The Latin word for wisdom is "sapientia" and the noun "sapientia" comes from the verb "sapere," which means "to savor." That's right, the gift of Wisdom is the gift that allows, or better, compels, us to savor our faith, to take it all in, to appreciate everything, to notice and to consider how Jesus Christ is present in our Church and in our lives.

So, do you savor the Holy Spirit? We should, we have that gift. How does the spirit work within you? Motivate you? Inspire you? Do you notice? Are you thinking about this every day?

What about the Eucharist? Many people as they gather for a great meal take in all sorts of things - the aroma, the place settings, the people, the taste. This meal isn't fast food and it's not eaten in the car. No, people savor this meal. So, at Mass, do you take it all in? Notice everything? Pay attention to the Scripture, the music, your fellow parishioners? Do you wish it were over quicker or do you delight in every nuance? Do you savor the Mass and Holy Communion?

It's a constant challenge for all of us, as it will be for those who receive sacraments this week. But we don't accept this challenge on our own. We are fed with the Bread of Life and empowered by the Holy Spirit who comes with seven gifts, including the gift of Wisdom. With it, let us always savor what the Lord has done for us.

May God bless all of you. **Fr. Hambrough**





With more than one location, please click the "This is my main/primary location" circle to indicate where you are employed or, if you are a volunteer, where most of your ministry or service is performed.

\*\*If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
