“And Peter said to them, ‘Repent, and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ...’” *ACTS 2:38*

The word “repent” means to turn from sin - to change our thoughts, words and actions. Change that is permanent comes from within – a transformation or conversion of heart. This requires prayer, discipline and perseverance. Change is hard. The first step is recognizing that we are broken and that we need God’s help. The good news - we are not alone in our journey. Ask Jesus daily for guidance and patiently listen for his response.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

One day a pastor was walking along a country road with an old friend. As they strolled through the farmland, the pastor noticed a barn with a weather vane perched on its roof. At the top of the vane were the words: "God Is Love."

The pastor remarked to his friend that he thought this was a rather inappropriate place for such a message. "Weather vanes change with the wind," the priest declared, "but God's love is constant."

The old friend walked a bit farther before replying, "I don't agree, Father, with your thoughts on the weather vane. You misunderstand the meaning. The weather vane is indicating a truth: regardless of which way the wind blows, God is love, and such love is constant."

For nearly seven decades, the people of the St. Louis Archdiocese have been a constant source of love for hundreds of thousands of our fellow citizens. Through the years, from the 20th century to the 21st, in times of prosperity or recession, for people rich and poor, black or white, native-born or immigrant, young or old, Catholic or non-Catholic, the Annual Catholic Appeal has been a source of love, a fountain of charity. Whether the wind blew the vane of this love toward goodness or through a global pandemic, our diocesan Church has been constant. We have looked around, saw a need, and did something about it.

The 2023 Annual Catholic Appeal takes as its motto "Reach Out in Love." The Archdiocese has given Queen of All Saints a goal of \$186,000 toward an overall goal of \$15,500,000. Already your fellow parishioners have contributed \$61,900. Today you have an opportunity to join with them, to be constant in love, to "Reach Out in Love."

You're probably aware of the many endeavors supported by this Appeal. Priests like Fr. Detwiler and me received support during our seminary days, as do our current seminarians, Alex Cammarata and Nick Samsel, now. Money from the Appeal helps our retired priests, maintains the beauty of the Old and New Cathedrals, and is there when any parish is hit suddenly with a huge maintenance problem. Annual Catholic Appeal funds are given for such wide-ranging ministries as the Respect Life Apostolate, the Office of Racial Harmony, Hispanic Ministry, the Catholic Deaf Ministry, and the Rural Parish Health Clinic. Many, many people are touched by God's love through our donations.

Archbishop Rozanski put it this way: "Every year, the Annual Catholic Appeal provides us an opportunity to realize the difference we can make when we act together in God's love. I am grateful for each of you who support the mission of the appeal. By serving the Lord with gladness, we can see the impact it has on so many lives, including our own... We must trust God to show us His will and give of ourselves wherever He guides us. Please join me in supporting our Appeal. When we Reach Out in Love there is no limit to how many lives we can touch."

An old man was dying, and was thought to be wondering and rambling as he talked to himself. His son listened, and eventually began to make sense out of what his father was saying. It seems he was back in time, back to when he was a boy, and was very worried about something. The son questioned him, and eventually the source of his anxiety was revealed. When he was a boy he turned the signposts at a local crossroads in an opposite direction, and now he's really worried about how many people he may have sent in the wrong direction, how many people he may have caused to go astray.

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday, a day when we hear about the One who wisely, bravely, and lovingly will not lead us astray. Following our Shepherd, we sheep are led to green pastures, led to all that is good. Thankful for that, we respond always with generosity, and at this time of the year to the Annual Catholic Appeal. For this sign has not been turned, this sign remains constant no matter which way the wind blows: God is Love.

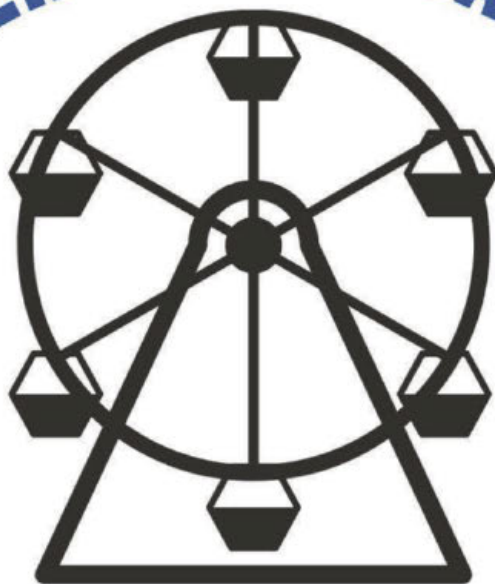

SLUGGER 33 MISSION

Our St. Louis Sluggers, a Ministry of our Society of St. Vincent de Paul, just returned from Mission 33 to Waverly, TN. On August 18, 2021 the area was inundated with over 17 inches of rain overnight. The downpour turned into a torrent of water taking the lives of 20, including twins age 7 months. Many were rescued by boat, jet ski or helicopter. 272 homes were destroyed while 199 were damaged. The crew of 23 made major renovations to two homes and made countless repairs to over 10 others. St. Vincent de Paul from St. Patrick's Church in McEwen served as hosts as well as working with the crews.
