"For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be God's will, than for doing evil." 1 PETER 3:17

The old line says "if you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans." Many of us are diligent in our planning and making sure things are progressing smoothly. Then disaster strikes, we don't get the result we anticipated or an unforeseen problem arises. Many times we may respond negatively and ask, "Why me? I did everything right!" Here's the thing – adversity humbles us and reminds us of our dependence on God and not on our own self-reliance. Rest assured, God has a better plan in store for you.

Dear Parishioners,

Dante Gabriel Rossetti was a famous nineteenth century artist who was approached once by an elderly man. The old fellow had some sketches and drawings with him and he asked the artist to take a look at them. "Are they any good?" he inquired, "Do they show a potential talent that could be developed?"

Rossetti carefully examined them. After the first few he knew they were worthless, showing not the least sign of artistic talent. But Rossetti was a kind man, and he didn't want to hurt the old man's feelings with a harsh judgment, so he told him as gently as he could that the pictures did not have much value and they showed little talent. He was sorry, but he could not lie to the man.

The old timer was very disappointed, but seemed to accept Rossetti's judgment. He then apologized for taking up the artist's time. But wondered if he could take just a few more minutes to examine a few more drawings - these done by a young art student.

Rossetti looked over this second batch of sketches with a hurried glance, but quickly slowed down as the skill and beauty of the work became apparent, "These," he exclaimed, "these are really good. No, not good, these are great! This student has been blessed with amazing talent. He should be given every help and encouragement in his career as an artist. If he works hard and sticks with it he has a promising future."

Rossetti could see that the old man was deeply moved. "Who is this fine young artist?" he asked. "Could he be your son?" "No," replied the man sadly. "It's me - forty years ago. If only I had heard your praise then. For you see, I got discouraged and I gave up, way too soon."

St. Peter in today's Second Reading declares, "Sanctify Christ as Lord of your hearts. Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope..." Yes, there are too many in our world and in our community who are discouraged. They watch the maddening cycle of news, especially political news, and decry that this is the best we can do, that with over 330 million people in the United States, these are the ones we elect to various political offices? Many are upset about the furious effort of too many American who maniacally push for abortion rights and then lament that we have to endure another mass shooting. Sadness descends upon our nation for too often as innocent people are killed in a school or grocery store or mall. "What is wrong with us?" we question. Around the world there are revolutions and wars, violent gangs and drug cartels, oppression of rights and religious persecutions. Who will offer a reason to hope? Who will say that peace will prevail and faith will triumph? Who will give such an explanation? We will. We who trust in Jesus Christ. We who are sent by Him. We will speak. We will proclaim. Christ wants us to do it.

Is this an extremely difficult task? You bet. Will we have to rely on love and persevere through much? No doubt. Is there anyone around who can show us how to do that? Yes, our mothers.

An unknown person wrote: I finally found a Mother's Day card that expressed my feelings for my mother in real terms. It said, "Now that we have a mature adult relationship, there's something I'd like to tell you. You're still the first person I think of when I fall down and go boom-boom."

Happy Mother's Day to all the fantastic moms in our parish. Thank you for giving your children hope. Thank you for refusing to let them get discouraged. And, most of all, thank you for telling them of Jesus Christ, the one who uplifts all of us. Have a terrific day!

I want to express my appreciation to the Variety Guild for putting on another funny and entertaining show. What a talented and hard-working group of people you are! Thanks for making Queen of All Saints a destination for those who want to enjoy a good show and see the fruits of what happens when people work together.

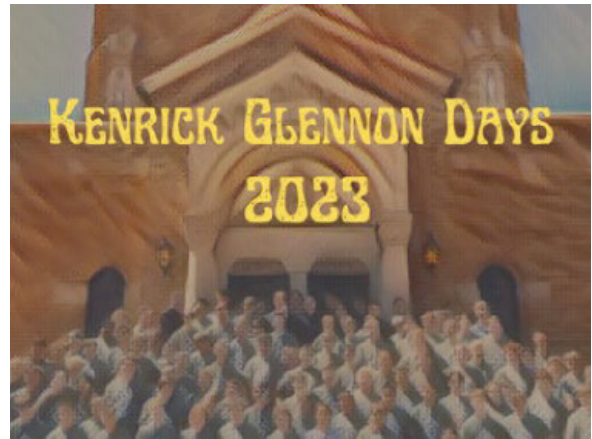
MOTHER'S DAY CARDS TO BENEFIT BIRTHRIGHT

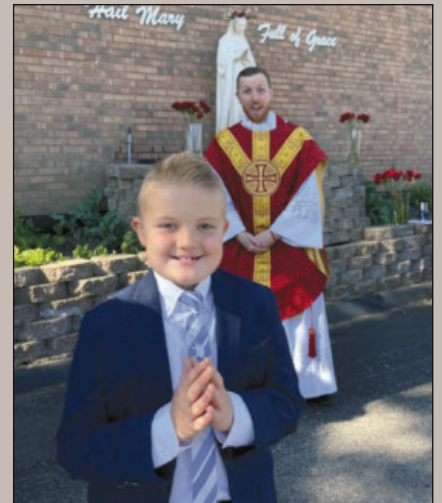

Barbara Klocke, a long time parishioner and Vice-President of our Society of St. Vincent de Paul Conference, traveled with her husband and The St. Louis Sluggers on their Mission 33.

Barbara used her talents as a teacher of many decades to assist Sister Lydia at St. Patrick's Catholic School in McEwen, TN. She worked as a teacher's assistant for Sister Lydia in the first grade teaching math and worked in small groups with individuals who needed extra help. Barbara even played kickball on the playground at lunch. Often she gave impromptu lessons whenever an occasion arose—miracle of the butterfly, the height of eagles complete with diagrams.

The school was founded in 1854 and remains a keystone of this thriving community. The school is funded in part by a huge annual picnic the last weekend of July. Although the town's population is just 1750, the event attracts nearly 20,000.

St. Patrick's did hold the Guinness record as world's largest barbecue, roasting 1,000 pork shoulders.
