Pray for friends and family, and especially for those that don't treat you very well. Pray to give praise, to thank, and to ask God for help. Pray to see what God wants you to do with the gifts He has given you. Teach others how to pray. It has been said that teaching someone how to pray is the best gift you can give someone.

Dear Parishioners,

American author Robert Fulghum writes about one of his college professors, a Dr. Papaderos, an instructor in Greek philosophy. On one occasion, as class was ending, Dr. Papaderos asked, "Are there any questions?" Robert Fulghum raised his hand and inquired, "Dr. Papaderos, what is the meaning of life?"

Fulghum relates, "The usual laughter followed, and people stirred to go. Dr. Papaderos held up his hand and stilled the room and looked at me for a long time, asking with his eyes if I was serious and seeing from my eyes that I was. 'I will

answer your question,' he said. Then taking his wallet out of his hip pocket, he fished into it and brought out a very small, round mirror, about the size of a quarter. Then he said, 'When I was a small child, during the war, we were very poor and we lived in a remote village. One day, on the road, I found several broken pieces of a mirror from a wrecked German motorcycle. I tried to find all the pieces and put them together, but it was not possible, so I kept only the largest piece. This one. And by scratching it on a stone I made it round. I began to play with it as a toy and became fascinated by the fact that I could reflect light into dark places where the sun would never shine - in deep holes and crevices and dark closets. It became a game for me to get light into the most inaccessible places I could find. I kept the little mirror, and as I went about my growing up, I would take it out in idle moments and continue the challenge of the game. As I became a man, I grew to understand that this was not just a child's game but a metaphor for what I might do with my life. I came to understand that I am not the light or even the source of light. But light - truth, understanding, knowledge - is there, and it will shine in many dark places if I reflect it.

'I am a fragment of a mirror whose whole design and shape I do not know. Nevertheless, with what I have, I can reflect light into the dark places of this world and change some things in some people. Perhaps others may see and do likewise. This is what I am about. This is the meaning of my life.'

'And then he took his small mirror and, holding it carefully, caught the bright rays of the daylight streaming through the window and reflected them onto my face and onto my hands folded on the desk.'"

We are reminded on this Ascension Day that we, too, have a purpose in life to reflect not just light, but <u>the</u> Light, Jesus Christ. Just before his ascent to Heaven, Jesus instructs those gathered, "...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, through Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." If the Light that is Christ is going to shine, we have to be the ones who reflect it. The world has too many dark places. Pray that each of us may be up for the challenge of positioning ourselves in such a way as to let Jesus Christ's goodness and love reach every spot and enlighten every person. Dr. Papaderos discovered it wasn't a game, but a purpose. We know it's not a game, but a calling, a mission given to us by our Savior.

One way we reflect the Light of Christ is through our grade school. Pray for them this week as they finish the 2022-2023 academic year. God has been praised throughout the year - as God should be - and God has responded to this praise by blessing each student and teacher many times over. God always does that. We can be sure that the Lord will be watching over everybody as they depart this week. We pray, then, for our graduates as they move on to high school, carrying with them the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit they received just a month ago at their Confirmation. We pray for the rest of the students. May they be protected from all harm and really have a fun summer vacation. We pray for the faculty and staff. May they be refreshed and renewed over the next few months. And we thank you, the parishioners who support our school. Thank you for being Christ's little mirrors who allow his Light to glow in the lives of our students.





You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening</u>, register for a ****Protecting God's Children work**shop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete <u>ALL</u> steps to complete the process.

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
