FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Fr. Patrick Tonry, S.M., relates this story:

“A group of alumni got together at a reunion and decided to go visit their old university professor, now retired. During their visit, conversation soon turned into complaints about stress in their work and lives. Offering his guests coffee, the professor went into the kitchen and returned with a large pot of coffee and an assortment of cups: porcelain, styrofoam, glass, crystal, some plain looking, some expensive, some exquisite bone china. The professor told them to help themselves to the coffee.



“When everyone had a cup of coffee in hand, the professor said, “Notice that all the nice looking, expensive cups were taken up, leaving behind the plain and cheap ones. While it is normal for you to want only the best for yourselves, that is the source of your problems and stress. Be assured that the cut itself adds no quality to the coffee. In most cases, it is just more expensive, and in some cases, even hides what we drink. What all of you really wanted was coffee, not the cup, but you consciously went for the best cups...and then you began eyeing each other’s cups.

“Now consider this: life is the coffee. Your job, money and position in society are the cups. They are just tools to hold and contain life. The type of cup one has does not define, nor change, the quality of life a person lives. Sometimes, by concentrating only on the cup, we fail to enjoy the coffee God provides to us. God brews the coffee, not the cups. Enjoy your beverage and spend time with God while you drink your coffee.”

Every morning I am thankful to God that he created coffee beans and I am able to enjoy the liquid produced by running hot water through those ground coffee beans. Delicious, and a real pick-me-up, especially in my historic Queen of All Saints 50th Anniversary mug! Today, though, our thoughts are on the Holy Spirit as we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost and as Archbishop Rozanski announces the changes that will come through the All Things New initiative.

For many, this will not be an easy day. Our archdiocese has been blessed in extraordinary ways by and through our nearly 200 parishes. All of us know what beautiful things occur when people of faith, united in worship at a common church, and enhancing the presence of Christ through a myriad of ministries, steadfastly join together to make the parish grounds a place of praise, comfort, education, and social activities. We build memories that will last the rest of our lives. It’s really, really hard to alter that or give it up completely. Asking people to embrace that difficulty is what the Archbishop is doing today.

We must be mindful, though, that the parish is the cup, the faith is the coffee. While we have a favorite when it comes to a mug, our greatest joy is living our Catholic faith, cherishing the Incarnation of Christ, rejoicing in his Resurrection, savoring the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and sharing with others the Good News of the Gospel whenever we can. Embracing our faith and being a Catholic - that’s what gets us excited. Parishes are wonderful - especially this one - but they’re the cups. Being prompted by the Spirit to follow and proclaim Christ - that’s the coffee. I hope the people of our Archdiocese remember that.

St. Basil the Great wrote:

“Through the Holy Spirit hearts are raised up, the weak are led by the hand, and those who are making progress are perfected.” It will take some time for the All Things New decisions to be perfected. Until then, let’s make sure it’s the Holy Spirit who takes our hand and leads us sheep to the green pastures Christ has prepared for us.”

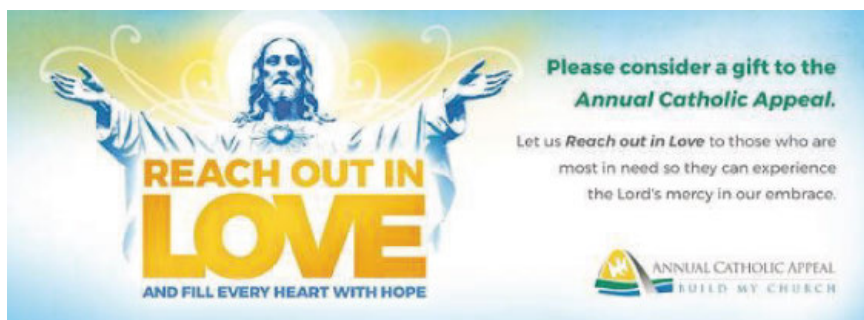
MEMORIAL DAY MASS SCHEDULE

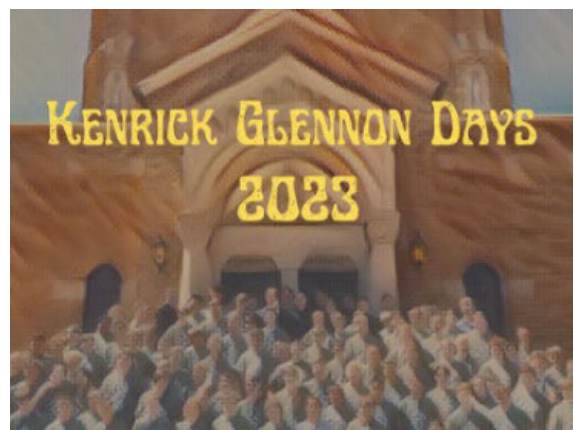
OFFICE CLOSED MONDAY, MAY 29TH

June 22-25 at White House Retreat

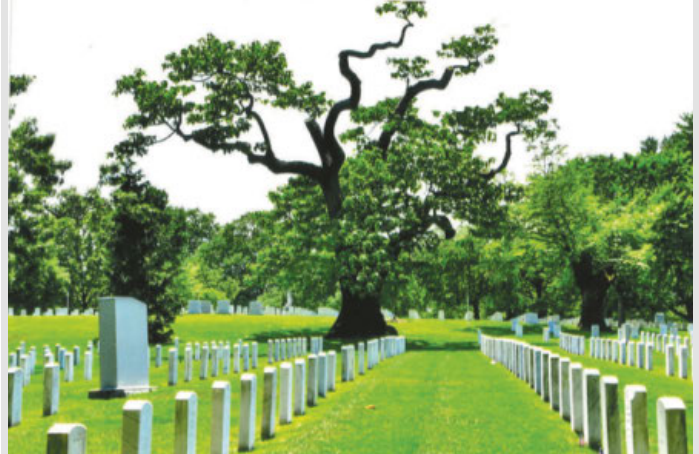
