#### FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

How heavy are you guys?

There's a story about a huge fortress on a hill overlooking the town of Weinsberg, Germany. One day, back in feudal times, the fortress was surrounded by an enemy. The commander of the enemy troops was determined to punish those hiding behind the fortress, especially the men who had rebelled against him. "Death to them all!" Despite these bloodthirsty intentions, though, he did proclaim that women and children would be spared. He declared a certain day for their exit from the fortress and went so far as to allow each woman to bring one valuable possession with her.



Imagine his amazement and frustration when he saw each woman leave the fortress with her husband on her back.

So, like I asked, how heavy are you guys? I'd sure like to take all of you with me as I go from the southernmost part of St. Louis County to the westernmost.

As I mentioned to a few of you a last week, the first phone call hinting that I might be transferred came the day before Palm Sunday. I knew that our Personnel Board (a group of priests that we elect to advise the Archbishop on assignments) had taken a few days away from St. Louis to begin the process of priest's assignments, which figured to be many in light of what was happening with All Things New. I was surprised that I was called so quickly after their meetings and further surprised when Chesterfield was mentioned, especially since I had indicated on our surveys that, if I were to be moved, I wanted to stay in South City or South County. I may have grown up north, in Normandy, but I've spent 25 years south. I like it here.

That April 1st phone call asked what I thought of taking Ascension Parish. After a few seconds of thought I said if that's where the archbishop wants me to go, I'll go. The priest on the line said, "You hesitated. Why did you hesitate?" "Because," I answered, "I like where I am, both the parish and the locale. I would prefer to stay." "Well," said he, "this is just a preliminary call, a sounding out." Immediately I began praying they would change their mind. They didn't.

Last weekend I concelebrated the Mass of Priestly Ordination for our five new priests. It's impossible for any priest attending an ordination to not reflect back on his ordination day, to remember the prayers, readings, and people; to remember the thoughts one had when it was you laying prostrate on the floor during the Litany of the Saints; when it was you having your hands anointed with Sacred Chrism; you receiving a chalice, you being vested with priestly vestments. So many emotions, memories, and prayers flood your heart, mind, and soul - when it was you. Or when it was you taking that vow of obedience. I never thought on my ordination day, as I placed my hands into the hands of Archbishop May and promised obedience to him and his successors, that one day, when my archbishop and archdiocese needed me to say yes, that I would say no. For reasons perhaps known only to God and him, the archbishop believes that for now the best way for me to help this archdiocese is to be at Ascension Parish. I don't claim to understand it or like it, but I'll go.

I go with hope and confidence. If there's one thing I've learned in the priesthood it's that the people of God are wonderful everywhere. Each one of my assignments has allowed me a front row seat as I see Jesus Christ work among his Disciples. It's inspiring and amazing and I thank God for the privilege. You have been that amazing people. I know I'll find more of the same at Ascension.

You're getting three nice guys here. Your new pastor, Fr. Murphy, and one of the associates, Fr. D'Amico, were one year behind me in the seminary. They were ordained in January, 1987. Fr. Hopmeir was ordained in January, 1991. Fr. Murphy has called me already and is excited to be coming to Queen of All Saints. He'll be a good pastor to you.

At least I'll be here for the picnic. I'm looking forward to two great days of good fun and good food, a very special gathering for our parish and community. Pray that God blesses us with terrific weather.

# Annual Mission Cooperative Mission Appeal Diocese of Mandeville, Jamaica

When we think of Jamaica, we think of Ocho Rios, beautiful beaches, vacations and wonderful scenery. But, just beyond all of that, Jamaica is among the poorest countries in our hemisphere and the Diocese of Mandeville is the poorest of the three dioceses in Jamaica. Many of the people have no running water. Many youth are "functionally illiterate," there is an alarming number of destitute elderly and abandoned children, and the average Sunday collection is 10% of the operating cost at half of our parishes. The Diocese of Mandeville is VERY POOR!

Each year, a missionary is assigned to our parish by our diocesan Mission Office for an appeal asking our assistance for ministries to assist the very poor. On the weekend of June 10th/11th we will welcome Fr. Gary Wiesmann for our annual mission appeal on behalf of the DIOCESE OF MANDEVILLE, Jamaica. In our second collection, please consider supporting the evangelization programs and outreach to the extremely poor people of this diocese.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Having received, studied, and prayed over all the input and feedback that has been submitted by your pastor, by your key parish leaders, by you yourselves, and by our archdiocesan Presbyteral Council, I have discerned the following decisions regarding the future footprint of the Archdiocese of St. Louis:

- Moving forward, the Archdiocese of St. Louis will be reshaped from 178 individual parishes into 134 parishes. These parishes will be overseen by close to 90 diocesan pastors and 17 religious order pastors. These modifications include the merging of 35 parishes that will be subsumed into neighboring parishes and 15 parishes being merged to create 5 new parishes. There will also be a new personal parish for the Spanish-speaking community in St. Charles County.
- Even in parishes where there is no change to the pastor or parish structure, all of our
  communities are asked to re-evaluate their current pastoral care, social outreach and
  evangelization efforts to see if they can be streamlined, refined or re-invented. Our new
  Vicariate structure will support this.
- Over the next several months our priests will be discerning with their people what the best use of our facilities should be to provide the Sacraments and necessary pastoral care to all who live in their boundaries and begin to reimagine what a vibrant, evangelizing parish ought to look like.
- Implementation of these plans will begin in summer/fall of 2023 and may continue through 2026.
   The newly formed Office of Parish Mission and Vitality will also begin developing new plans for evangelization and social outreach to build upon the strength of our new archdiocesan footprint.

Details can be found at <u>allthingsnew.archstl.org</u>. Anyone who is a parishioner and who considers themselves to be aggrieved by my decision has the right to appeal my decision to me in writing concerning the way that their parish is being altered. Per Canon law, the request must be made in writing, postmarked no later than June 12, 2023, and addressed to the Archbishop at 20 Archbishop May Dr, St. Louis, MO 63119. We cannot accept emails or phone calls as a request for appeal.

I look forward to sharing with you soon how we, as the Curia, will be restructured to support this new footprint.

May the Holy Spirit embolden each of us to follow the example of the early Church and do our very best to go, make disciples of all nations and to reach out in loving service to those around us in need. May the Spirit make our efforts bear much fruit!





You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
