

The Big Move

Next weekend, we will celebrate Sunday Masses for the first time in the school cafeteria and will continue to do so until our pew renovation project is completed, hopefully in mid-August. Perpetual Help devotions will be prayed immediately following the 8:15 Mass on Tuesday.

A transition like the one we are about to undertake is complicated and filled with hundreds of details that need to be considered. We have tried our best to think things through but there will always be details that are overlooked and issues that arise that will need to be addressed "on the fly". PLEASE BE PATIENT WITH THIS PROCESS!! If the summer passes as quickly as it seems to every year, we will be back home in no time.

IMPORTANT



To all extraordinary ministers and those wishing to become an extraordinary minister, please note a very important meeting/training session is scheduled for Saturday August 17 at 9:00 am in the Church Hall.

It has been several years since we have had a general meeting and there have been a number of things that have and will change. We are planning to re-introduce Holy Communion under both species. This is an extremely important meeting so if you wish to remain an extraordinary minister, please mark your calendars for this important date.

NOTE TO EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS

Please remember to purify your Pyx. Especially if you have to fracture a host, there could be small particles left in your Pyx. Put water in your Pyx and consume it so no particles remain. Also, when bringing the Eucharist to the homebound or sick, bring a small white purificator, which you can get in the sacristy, in case someone spits out part of the host. The residue will need to be put in a cup of water and brought to a Priest or Deacon, who will take it to the sacristy for proper disposition.



MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP - A HOUSE DIVIDED

In your parish community, do your ministries collaborate with each other or do they compete with each other? Unfortunately, in many cases there is more competition than collaboration. Ultimately, the fruits that a parish ministry bears depends on the spirituality of the disciples in the ministry. If disciples are good examples of spending time in prayer, utilizing their charisms in charitable works and are generous in their giving, and are doing what they do for the glory of God, chances are they will bear good fruit. If that is not the case, many times it is because the disciples in the ministry are looking for their own glory to bolster their own pride and ego. Jesus warns us that a "house divided against itself will not be able to stand." Take a good look at all of your parish ministries, are they all in alignment with your parish mission statement? If parish ministry is not bringing people closer to God, it is not worth doing.

MISSION APPEAL

On the weekend of June 15 & 16 we will have the Annual Mission Appeal in our parish. Fr. Jomon **Palatty** from the missionaries of St. Francis de Sales will be the speaker of this appeal. In the homily he will speak about their mission work mainly in India and several African countries. The congregation of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales was founded in Annecy, France in 1837 as missionaries. They are now globally present in 29 counties with membership of more than 1500 priests. The missionaries work among the poor, disadvantaged, marginalized, and illiterate through conducting children's homes, orphanages and schools. More than 3500 economically poor, semi orphan or orphan children are cared for and educated in their 93 children's homes both in India and Africa. Also, we have to take care of retired priests, who retire only when they are not able to work anymore. There is absolutely no income from social security or any kind of welfare system. The elderly priests depend 100 percent on the congregation for support in their old age. So, please support the missionaries with you generous donations to continue the good work they are doing. Let us welcome our missionary Fr. Jomon Palatty msfs from India.





You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening</u>, register for a ****Protecting God's Children work**shop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete <u>ALL</u> steps to complete the process.

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
