

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

An anonymous woman writes:

They huddled inside the storm door, two children in ragged outgrown coats, "Any old papers, Lady?" I was busy. I wanted to say no - until I looked down at their feet. Thin little sandals, sopped with sleet. "Come in, and I'll make you a cup of hot cocoa." There was no conversation. Their soggy sandals left marks upon the hearthstone.



I served them cocoa and toast with jam to fortify them against the chill outside. Then I went back to the kitchen and started again on my household budget. The silence in the front room struck me. I looked in.

The girl held the empty cup in her hands, looking at it. The boy asked in a flat voice, "Lady, are you rich?" "Am I rich? Heavens, no." I looked at my shabby slipcovers, worn carpets, walls that screamed for fresh paint. My thoughts were interrupted as the girl put her cup back on its saucer carefully, declaring, "Your cups and your saucers match." Her voice was old, with a hunger that was not of her stomach. They left then, holding their bundles against the wind. They hadn't said thank you. They didn't need to. They had done more than that. Plain blue pottery cups and saucers. But they matched. I tested the potatoes and stirred the gravy. Potatoes and gravy, a good match there, too. I thought of more - a car and a garage, a washer and a dryer, heat and air conditioning. Pretty good matches. Then more, then better. My husband and me - wonderful. We as parents with our children - what wealth we have!

I moved the chairs back from the fire and tidied the living room. The muddy prints of small sandals were still wet upon my hearth. I let them be. I want them there in case I ever forget again how very rich I am.

Today's Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) is for us the muddy footprints on the hearth, the great reminder of how rich we are. What a treasure, the Eucharist; Bread come down from Heaven, the Bread of Life, food that nourishes us as we journey from this world to the Kingdom. At the Last Supper, Jesus took, blessed, broke and gave His own flesh and blood, real food and real drink. The Apostles were enriched by this gift, and so are we.

After all, look at all the things that match during the Mass. We praise God in word and song. We hear from the Old Testament, and the New. We have the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Great matches all!

There's still more. We have a pulpit and an altar. We have a paten and a chalice. We have a priest and a congregation. We have bread and wine which becomes Body and Blood. They all match so well!

It goes further than the church building to the entire parish. We have a church and a school. We have buildings and fields. We have time for work and play. We are mindful of the living and the dead, the rich and the poor, the young and the old. This week, we have good matches, like Parish and Picnic, and the people of this Archdiocese and the people of the Diocese of Mandeville, Jamaica. They're good matches and we are rich because of them.

I thank Fr. Gary Weismann for coming to St. Louis and Queen of All Saints today. Please be generous in response to his appeal. These people in Jamaica need our help.

I'm writing this on a Wednesday and it's raining outdoors. The forecast, though, is promising for the weekend. I trust that God will have heard our prayers and blessed us with a great picnic.

When we think of Jamaica, we think of Ocho Rios, beautiful beaches, vacations and wonderful scenery. But, just beyond all of that, Jamaica is among the poorest countries in our hemisphere and the Diocese of Mandeville is the poorest of the three dioceses in Jamaica. Many of the people have no running water. Many youth are "functionally illiterate," there is an alarming number of destitute elderly and abandoned children, and the average Sunday collection is 10% of the operating cost at half of our parishes. The Diocese of Mandeville is VERY POOR!

Each year, a missionary is assigned to our parish by our diocesan Mission Office for an appeal asking our assistance for ministries to assist the very poor. On the weekend of June 10th/11th we will welcome Fr. Gary Wiesmann for our annual mission appeal on behalf of the DIOCESE OF MANDEVILLE, Jamaica. In our second collection, please consider supporting the evangelization programs and outreach to the extremely poor people of this diocese.


