
From our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Author Phyllis Theroux writes about her father: "If there was any one thing that my father did for me when I was growing up it was to give me the promise that ahead of me was dry land - a bright, marshless territory, without chuckholes or traps, where one day I would walk easily and as befitting my talents.

"Thus it was, when my dad came upon me one afternoon sobbing out my unsuccesses into a wet pillow, that he sat down on the bed and assured me that my grief was only a temporary setback. Oh, very temporary! Why he couldn't think of

any other little girl who was so talented, so predestined to succeed in every department as I was. 'And don't forget,' he added with a smile, 'that we can trace our ancestry right back to Pepin the Stupid!'



Many of us likewise had fathers who encouraged us and placed within us a "can-do" attitude. Some, like my father, may not have set us down for a heart-to-heart conversation during which sagacious advice poured forth. Rather, it was the example set and the love given, working hard to provide for his family and attentive to our needs. How proud my father was (and, of course, mother, too) as he watched his children achieve many wonderful things. He was God's gift to us.

Jesus is the same way. In today's Gospel he sees a need for laborers to work the harvest. Whom will he select? Who can do this sort of work? No one has ever been asked to do this before. And then the gaze of Jesus lands on twelve men. They are chosen. They are called. They are sent.

So are we. Like Phyllis Theroux above, we have discovered that the territory around DOES sometimes have marshes, chuckholes and traps. Walking in such territory is not always easy. But Jesus believes in us. Jesus trusts us. He would not have summoned us if that were not so. Jesus passes on to us a "can-do" attitude.

The work of harvesting is not easy and we know we need divine help. There's a story about Charlie, who sat by the hospital bed of his young son, just out from major surgery. Dreadful thoughts kept creeping into his mind. Why had he not called the doctor sooner? Why had he not suspected that his son's troubles were more than a stomach ache? Why? Why?

The youngster stirred now, opened his eyes and saw his father sitting there. The boy stretched out his small, fevered hand to his dad and said, "Hold my hand, Daddy, I hurt so bad."

Charlie took his son's hand; his son smiled weakly and drifted back to sleep. Then Charlie, taking a cue from his son, bowed his head, closed his eyes and whispered, "Hold my hand, Father, I hurt."

God our Father will indeed protect us as we go forth, sent by Jesus to labor for the Kingdom of Heaven. We do so with confidence, with a "can-do" attitude.

Certainly we saw that attitude last weekend at our Parish Picnic. Jeff and Kate Barcom, the picnic chairs, and a whole lot of people did a superb job in presenting to all our visitors a venue full of good food, good music, and friendly people, among other things. Our visiting missionary, Fr. Gary Weismann, was only here for about 27 hours, yet he couldn't stop talking about the wonderful spirit he witnessed at Queen of All Saints. You know he's right, too, last week's picnic proved it. Thanks, then, to all who worked and to all who supported, and to all who attended. Great job!





Presenter: Mark Etling, PhD Saturdays: July 1st, August 5th and September 2nd





Click the roles associated with your employment/service at that location.

With more than one location, please click the "This is my main/primary location" circle to indicate where you are employed or, if you are a volunteer, where most of your ministry or service is performed.

You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening</u>, <u>register for a **Protecting God's Children workshop</u>, <u>view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES</u> and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. <u>You have to complete ALL</u> steps to <u>complete the process</u>.

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
