### FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Like so many of you, I was excited always when my father would take me to a major league baseball game. I'm old enough to have been taken to Busch Stadium I, or Sportsman's Park, before it was closed in 1966. I remember attending a game there, probably in 1965, when the Cardinals were playing the Los Angeles Dodgers. Not far from our seats in the upper deck along the third base line were about twenty Black people, all rooting for the Dodgers. I was impressed that this group of people had come halfway across the country to root for their Dodgers and I shared my admiration with my father. "Oh," he said, "they're probably not from Los Angeles, they're probably from here." "Why," I wondered aloud, "would they cheer for the Dodgers instead of the Cardinals?" My dad answered, "Because of Jackie Robinson." He then explained to me that Jackie had been the first Black player in the Majors, that the Dodgers were the first team to promote a Black player to the big leagues, and that many Black people across America became Dodger fans because of it, including those sitting near us that night. Made sense to me, I thought, why wouldn't they pull for the Dodgers.

That was then. Now, I have a reason to root <u>against</u> the Dodgers. Vehemently root against them, hope they *lose every game* type of root against them. For as you probably know, it was the Dodgers who recently gave an award to the Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence, complimenting this abhorrent group of men for their charitable acts in the Los Angeles community. On the Dodgers part, it was a very anti-Catholic thing to do.

The Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence is a group of men, mostly gay, who perform at various activities while dressed as Catholic nuns, during which they mock our Savior, our Blessed Mother, our Church, and our faith. They give themselves disgusting names, like Sister Guard N. O'Pansies, Sister Gaia Love, Sister Hellena Handbasket, and other names too awful to print here. They think they're clever, cute, funny, progressive. Yet they insult the genuine and caring work done by real Religious Sisters. They think that just because they raise money for a charitable cause that it's okay to slander the beautiful history of dedicated nuns, women who didn't mock or insult, but who prayed, loved, and served. The Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence don't care about that, nor, apparently, do the Los Angeles Dodgers. You can pity both groups, and pray for both groups. But don't root for them. Hope they lose every game.

Sadly, this kind of behavior can be expected nowadays, especially in June, Pride Month. Heck, even within our Catholic Church there are those who cross a line, at least in my opinion, by having a Pride Mass. Now, our Church is very clear on its teachings about homosexuality, as enunciated in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 2357-59). Here the Church acknowledges that throughout history in a variety of ways people have been attracted to others of the same sex. Based on Sacred Scripture, however, and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, the Church has always declared "that homosexual acts are intrinsically disordered. They are contrary to the natural law. They close the sexual act to the gift of life. They do not proceed from a genuine affective and sexual complimentary." (2357) These acts can never be approved.

It must be noted, though, that gay people "must be accepted with respect, compassion, and sensitivity. Every sign of unjust discrimination in their regard should be avoided. These persons are called to fulfill God's call in their lives and, if they are Christian, to unite to the sacrifice of the Lord's Cross the difficulties they may encounter..."(2358)

Anna-Katherine Howell has an inspiring take on this issue. She is a 31 year old gay woman who, she admits, "From my teen years up to my conversion, lived a horribly sinful life, including a great deal of promiscuity, an addiction to pornography, and same-sex marriage at age 26. Now, I celebrate my repentance, conversion, and sincere amendment of life through the grace of Our Lord - which never fails - for by that grace I am living a chaste and holy life as the Church clearly identifies in the Catechism." Howell continues and says that LGBTQ does not define her identity. "Our attraction is a thing we experience, not an identity we are defined by. It is the Father of Lies, the Accuser, who insists on calling us by our sins. Our loving Father in Heaven calls us by our names. We do not want to be identified by our disordered impulses or celebrate our past sins. This is what Pride Month does."

There is a group called Courage International (www.couragerc.org) that supports those with same-sex attraction to lives of chastity and grace. Our obligation always is to pray for those in the LGBTQ community, their families, and even for those who would mock and insult us over this issue. Also, to root only for the Cardinals! May God bless all of you.





#### BALDACHINO AND MOSAICS CLEANING

The Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis is having the Baldachino and the mosaics that surround the sanctuary cleaned. Colors that have not been seen for years are emerging from the layers of dust, and the cross that adorns the very top is free of cobwebs. Monsignor Henry Breier was featured on Channel 2 news this past week with the story of cleaning the stone and mosaics and the challenges associated with the project. One of the challenges was to find a piece of equipment that would elevate the workers to reach the 60 foot areas around the sanctuary without damaging the floors. The mosaics were installed in the cathedral from 1907 to 1988 and they are the main draw for visitors from across the world.
