"Picking up your cross and following Jesus" puts God and others first. Why settle for comfort when you can achieve greatness! Pick up your cross, ask Jesus for guidance on using your gifts and live the life God intended for you!

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

A stonecutter once delivered a slab of stone to a merchant. Seeing all his wonderful goods, he said, 'I wish I was a merchant and had such things.' In the twinkling of an eye, his wish was granted. Then one day he saw a parade pass by in marvelous splendor, thousands lining the streets to hail the nation's prince, and the man said, 'I wish I was a prince.' And immediately he became a prince...until one day the hot sun beat down upon him and he said, 'I wish I was the sun, greater than any man.' And he became the sun and was happy...until a cloud came between him



and earth. He said, 'That cloud overshadows me. I wish I was the cloud.' Again his wish was granted. He rained down on earth to his heart's content until he came to a mountain, which would not let him pass. He said, 'The mountain is greater than I, so I wish I was a mountain.' Instantly, he became a mountain and thought, 'Now I am the greatest of all.'

But one day a little man climbed up the mountain and with a hammer and chisel began to tap away at it. The mountain, unable to stop him, said, 'That little man is greater than I, I wish I was a man who cut stone.' Once again his wish was granted and he became a stonecutter. He lived a long and useful life and everyone marveled at how happy he was.

How about that? Greatness in a little man with a hammer and chisel. Similar to the greatness of one who gives to a disciple of Jesus only a cup of cold water to drink. Surely, the Lord tells us, the giver will not lose his reward. That's reassuring. A disciple of Jesus doesn't have to be the wisest, richest, oldest, or best-looking to find favor with God. One just has to be welcoming, caring, and kind. If one doesn't have the chance to bring forth gifts from a vault full of treasures, one only needs to bring a cup of water. The recipient of the water is happy and God is delighted. God notices, and rewards are stored safely to be handed out by God at the proper time.

Our readings make note today of the importance of hospitality. In the First Reading from the second Book of Kings the prophet Elisha arrives in the town of Shunem where he is welcomed by an influential yet childless woman. She and her husband proceed to offer a place for the prophet to find safety, rest, and food, not just once, but many times. Elisha assures them that God will bless them with a child.

In the Gospel, Jesus guarantees rewards for those who welcome the prophet or the righteous man. Such kindness allows those who are sent by Jesus to proclaim the Kingdom to do their work. How comforting to know that a warm welcome awaits those sent by Christ.

This week we celebrate Independence Day and many of us will recall the welcome that greeted our ancestors when they arrived on these shores, many of them "yearning to breathe free." Even today, thousands line up on our border hoping for the chance to live in this country. Many more await the opportunity to fly across continents and oceans to participate in the American dream. I know there is much dispute about our immigration policies, but as the son of an immigrant I can't fault people who want the same chance my father had, a chance to enjoy the nation and freedom we celebrate this week.

The Reverend Peter Marshall, who in the 1940's served as Chaplain to the United States Senate, once said, "May we do as we please but as the opportunity to do what is right." It saddens me that too many of our fellow citizens view our freedom in the former way - do whatever I want. And what they want is hedonistic, immoral, and sinful. It is an incorrect use of freedom and it's harming our country. On this 4th of July, let us pray that more Americans use their freedom to do what is right, ourselves included. And, for us, doing what is right is doing what the Lord requires, even if we're just the little guy with a hammer and chisel or the disciple with only a cup of cold water. Let's do what is right and receive a righteous reward.

MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP -THE WONDERFUL CROSS

When Jesus says these blunt words today, how do we receive them? Do we understand the conditions of being a missionary disciple of Christ? Throughout the centuries, many saints and theologians have written on the importance of honoring the Creator more than creatures. In our personal lives, this means loving God more than any other human being, whether that person is our father, mother, sister, brother, son, daughter, etc. When we love God above all else, He will properly order our relationships so that we can serve Him most effectively. The Christian life always passes through the cross. There is no way around it, as Jesus tells us today. We must pick up our cross each day and follow Him, knowing that He will present us with struggles and suffering but never in vain. As Saint John Paul II wrote in Salvifici Doloris n.23: "To suffer means to become particularly susceptible, particularly open to the working of the salvific powers of God, offered to humanity in Christ. In him God has confirmed his desire to act especially through suffering, which is man's weakness and emptying of self, and he wishes to make his power known precisely in this weakness and emptying of self.





You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening</u>, <u>register for a **Protecting God's Children workshop</u>, <u>view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES</u> and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. <u>You have to complete ALL</u> steps to <u>complete the process</u>.

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
