FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Spiritual writer Angela Akers relates a story she read in an essay titled "Too Broken to Be Fixed," by Victor Fried. Victor tells of how he grew up as an angry child who lashed out at others. His family had taught him that if something went wrong, it was always someone else's fault." He learned to distrust people. And this distrust resulted in anger and alienation and lashing out at the world.



The situation only worsened as Victor became an adult. He says of his mindset at that time, "Finally, you ask yourself the question: Why are so many people out to get me? And the only logical answer is that even God hates you. So, if you were like me, you return the favor and hate God right back. My belief that God hated me grew as the years passed, and I perceived each setback as further evidence that my belief was correct.

One thing that gave Victor's life meaning was his job building custom furniture in a wood shop. One day, he spotted a man walking down the street carrying an elegant Queen Anne chair. He recognized it instantly as a valuable antique, and he asked the man if he could have it. The chair had a broken leg and Victor knew he could fix it.

The man said, "No." Then he threw the chair into a dumpster, permanently breaking the frame and ruining it. This moment reinforced Victor's belief that people are no good and God didn't care about him.

A year later, Victor's anger and sadness finally drove him to burn out. He drove down to the Missouri River one icy-cold day with the intent to throw himself into the water and either drown or freeze to death. But as he stood on the riverbank, he suddenly recalled the angry man who had thrown the Queen Anne chair into the garbage. And he heard a voice say to him, "If you're going to throw that away, may I have it?" Victor says he knew it was the voice of God. His lifetime of anger and fighting and broken relationships came to mind. And yet now he could see how God loved him in spite of these things. He suddenly understood that God is unconditional love and had loved him throughout his life. Now God was asking Victor to turn his life over to Him. So instead of falling into an icy river, Victor fell to his knees on that riverbank and gave his life to the Lord. This moment was the start of healing a lifetime of anger and loneliness. It's a moment that started with a question, "If you're going to throw that away, may I have it?"

"Come to me," Jesus says in today's Gospel, "All who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me...and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." What a beautiful invitation! What a comforting expression! Jesus understands. During his lifetime he met many bitter people, many angry people, many sinful people. And he's met each one of us. Jesus knows about our sins, he's been hurt by them. He knows of our anger, he got angry, too. He understands rejection, they not only rejected him, they crucified him. But Jesus made a promise to us: He would be with us always. He would be our Good Shepherd. He will not retract that promise.

So, think of people like Victor Fried when you're down. Think of an angry man throwing away a chair and a bitter man standing on the banks of a river. Then think of a voice, a voice of sympathy and compassion, a voice of hope, "If you're going to throw that away, may I have it?" Turn it all over to Jesus - He makes it easy, he gives us rest.







Select the specific location by name. (ex. Queen of All Saints)

Click the roles associated with your employment/service at that location.

You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening</u>, register for a ****Protecting God's Children work**shop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete <u>ALL</u> steps to complete the process.

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
