

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Mike Cohen of San Diego was only eighteen years old when he was diagnosed with Leukemia. Intense chemotherapy and radiation treatments eliminated the leukemia and Mike returned to the active lifestyle of a healthy young man. He became an avid hiker and biker, taking cross-country trips on his bicycle to honor the oncologists and their medical staffs who saved his life.

What Mike didn't realize was that the aggressive treatments for leukemia had

damaged his heart muscle. By the age of 33 Mike's heart was failing. In February of 2018 he lay in a San Diego hospital bed with a life-threatening blood clot strangling his already weakened heart.

At the same time, another young man named James Mazzuchelli boarded a Navy helicopter. James was a flight surgeon for the Navy and he and his colleagues were participating in a training mission. Tragically, the helicopter crashed and Dr. Mazzuchelli was among those killed. His family, aware of James' love for life and willing generosity, directed that his organs be donated. Thus, on the night of that unexpected death, his heart was transplanted into Mike Cohen, saving his life.

James' mother, Christine Cheers, was overwhelmed with grief after her son's death. The tiny sliver of hope that kept her going was the knowledge that James was still helping people, that he was still living inside each of the donor recipients. She wrote letters to each of the four recipients of her son's organs.

One of those who responded was Mike Cohen. He expressed his profound gratitude for James' heart and the generosity of his family. He and Christine stayed in touch. They exchanged letters and sent pictures through social media. Just one year after the transplant operation Mike planned a cross-country bike trip from San Diego to Jacksonville, Florida to visit the grave site of the man whose heart gave him new life. Christine and her husband followed Mike's journey via computer.

On November 20, 2019 Mike and his friends arrived at the cemetery where James Mazzuchelli was buried. He and Christine hugged each other and wept. And then Mike knelt at the grave of James, thanking God and James for the gift of life. A friend traveling with Mike brought out a stethoscope so Christine could hear her son's heart beating in Mike's chest. As Mike Cohen said, "As cliché as it sounds, I wanted Christine to know that James' heart was in a safe place, that I was going to do everything I could to protect it."

Quite a story! Generosity, compassion, appreciation, life. Beautiful qualities, beautiful gifts. Jesus in today's Gospel offers us all of that and so much more. In the parable, the riches of God are compared to seeds - seeds that are sown, seeds that can grow. Sadly, some seeds fall on the ground that won't accept them and the seeds produce nothing good. But some seeds, like the ones, we pray, that take root in our hearts, bring forth a bountiful harvest for the Lord.


When the seeds of Jesus land in us, it is as if we are accepting the heart of Jesus. His heart, his values, his priorities now live in us. Our journey through life provides us the opportunity to assure our Lord that the goodness of Jesus is in a safe place. We will do everything we can to protect it.

M.L. Carr was a former star basketball player for the Boston Celtics. He once was a asked to give his opinion of college players who had been drafted by NBA teams. "Well," he said, "you can take a man and measure him, examine him, analyze him and dissect his statistics, but they cannot look into his heart. That's where the sizzle is - the hunger. That's where the desire begins a fire."

The seeds of God, the Word that is Jesus Christ, have been cast into our hearts. May that fire burn, that sizzle hiss, that message be proclaimed. May God know that, in us, Jesus is in a safe place.







You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening</u>, register for a ****Protecting God's Children work**shop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete <u>ALL</u> steps to complete the process.

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
