

FROM OUR PASTOR

Every time I come to a new parish; people have lots of questions about their new pastor. A lot of the following information is based on questions that people always ask me in every parish that I am assigned to. This is certainly not a comprehensive autobiography but more of an outline of my life.

I was born on October 31st, 1958, in St Mary's hospital in Richmond Heights. I grew up in St Luke's Parish also in Richmond Heights where I attended grade school. After graduating 8th grade, I entered St. Louis U. High. Not much happened in high school; I ran track and cross country, played trumpet, baritone, and tuba in the band, had average grades and thanks to the encouragement of the associate pastor at St Lukes Parish, (Fr Joseph Pins), I decided to enter Cardinal Glennon College Seminary in the fall after graduating from SLUH in 1977.



It was in the seminary that I met some very interesting characters such as Frank D'Amico, a classmate, and Ron Hopmeir, who was one or two years behind us. There was one other notable character who joined our class sophomore year, Patrick Hambrough. I still have pictures of us from those days. We were a LOT slimmer and looked so young!

After graduating from Cardinal Glennon College, I still wasn't sure about being a priest and so I decided to leave. I got a job working during the day at St Peters Cemetery next to Normandy High School and I also worked as a bartender in a restaurant in the evenings. During this time, God did not give up on me. He kept haunting me, calling me to return to the seminary. I kept trying to run away like Jonah, but in the end, I gave in. I returned to the seminary and was ordained on January 3, 1987.

As far as assignments go, I did my acolyte internship at St Josephs parish in Manchester, I was deacon at the Cathedral Basilica. My first assignment as a newly ordained priest was at St Josephs Parish in Cottleville. I was later invited to work in the St Louis Missions in Bolivia in South America. I accepted the invitation and after language school I worked for several years in the city of La Paz and in the villages of the Alti Plano around Lake Titicaca. (There are some pretty funny jokes having to do with the name of that lake, but I'm not going to repeat them in a church bulletin). I later moved to northern Bolivia to work in the villages in the Amazon jungle. On returning to St Louis, I was assigned to St Ferdinand Parish as associate pastor, and then was made administrator of St Francis DeSales parish in St Louis City. I would go on to be pastor of St. John the Beloved Disciple parish in Jefferson County, Holy Redeemer parish in Webster Groves, Our Lady Queen of Peace parish in House Springs, once again to St Ferdinand Parish in Florissant and finally here to Queen of All Saints with all of you. And I am <u>VERY HAPPY</u> to be here.



I am the oldest of five children. I have a brother and three sisters. My mom and dad are both deceased as well as my youngest sister who sadly died of pancreatic cancer in 2016.

I suffered a heart attack in 2009, both of my hips have been replaced and I have arthritis all over my body, especially my knees and shoulders. But I still get around and I still have a few good years left in me, which by the way, I hope to spend with all of you.

FROM OUR PASTOR

People often want to know what kinds of food I like. I like most foods, with the exception of peas and Jello. I <u>do not</u> have a sweet tooth. I prefer appetizers over dessert. I love salty things; cheeses (especially Bleu cheese), nuts, <u>anything</u> deep fried and bacon!! (I wonder if there is any connection here with my heart attack?)

Finally, I know that it can be hard when your priests have to leave, especially ones that you love. I am physically replacing Fr Hambrough as pastor, but I also know that I can never "replace" Fr Hambrough. We have two very different personalities. I'll do my best to keep things going but please understand that I won't always be doing things the way that Fr Hambrough did or doing the same things that he did. We priests have our different talents, gifts and visions of leadership. (We also have our different flaws and weaknesses).

I want to thank Msgr. Hambrough and Fr Detwiler for all their hard work proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ and for leaving Queen of All Saints in such great shape, making it the wonderful faith filled parish that it is. I am looking forward to getting to know all of you and carrying on the work of proclaiming the Gospel along with Frs. D'Amico and Hopmeir.

FROM FR. D'AMICO

Hello.

I am Fr. Frank D'Amico. I go by either Fr. D'Amico or Fr. D.

With that last name, in answer to the question of am I from the Hill, yes I am. I am 4th generation on my mother's side. I have been to the far points of the diocese in my assignments. I was in Ste. Genevieve during the great flood of 1993; north Lincoln county and Wentzville for three of my assignments. I have been involved with the Knights of Columbus and ACTS retreats.



FROM FR. HOPMEIR

I am Fr. Ronald Hopmeir, one of your new priests. I am happy to be with you and look forward to my ministry in your parish. A little history about me would begin in Arnold, where I grew up on the family farm. The area at that time was known as Maxville -- it was all farm country -- and that is not really that long ago. My family for four generations has been members of Immaculate Conception Parish, and that is where I attended grade school. My next stop was Saint Pius X High School in Festus. I then graduated from The University of Missouri in Columbia with a degree in landscape design. With that background I started a landscape and wholesale greenhouse business and operated that for 15 years. My next adventure was to enter Kenrick Seminary, with ordination in 1991.

My parish assignments are as follows: Saint Peter Parish in Saint Charles for 5 1/2 years, Saint Rose of Lima for 12 years as pastor, and my last assignment has been at Saint Stephen Protomartyr as pastor for the last 15 years. That is my biography in a nutshell.



Once again, I am very happy to now be at Queen of all Saints and looking forward to my time with you. One of my common responses to questions is that spiritual questions are welcome, but there could be a slight charge for questions on plant advice.



The very first Safe Haven Baby Box installed in the state of Missouri is located at the Mehlville Fire Station at 5434 Telegraph Road Dedication of this lifesaving tool will be held on

What is a Baby Box?

A Baby Box is a safety device provided for under a state's Safe Haven Law and legally permits a mother in crisis to safely, securely, and anonymously surrender if they are unable to care for their newborn. A Baby Box is installed in an exterior wall of a designated fire station or hospital. It has an exterior door that automatically locks upon placement of a newborn inside the Baby Box, and an interior door which allows a medical staff member to secure the surrendered newborn from inside the designated building.



SENIOR SEND-OFF TONIGHT

Select the specific location by name. (ex. Queen of All Saints)

Click the roles associated with your employment/service at that location.

If you are active at only one location, this will be your "primary" location.

If you are active at more than one location, click the ADD PARISH/LOCATION button and repeat the steps above. With more than one location, please click the "This is my main/primary location" circle to indicate where you are employed or, if you are a volunteer, where most of your ministry or service is performed.

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
