From our Pastor

The 8th Commandment

OK, I know that I said I wasn't going to write about anything until I had something to write about, but I found something to write about....the 8th commandment!

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor!

When I was younger, I thought that this commandment referred simply to testifying in court. It does, but it applies to so much more. It applies to unkind gossip, spreading rumors that are untrue or half true (or even fully true) with the intent to hurt someone's image. It applies to cutting other people down in order to build up our own low self-esteem. We break the 8th commandment when we send hateful anonymous letters or emails (**the height of cowardice**) or use the various apps available in social media to ruin people's good names.


It is truly impressive how quickly we will accept as truth anything we read on Facebook or Twitter or hear in social gatherings without questioning the morality of damaging the reputation of another human being. I guess we are all guilty of breaking the 8th commandment from time to time. But don't forget we will stand in judgement before Jesus Christ and answer for the times we hurt Him in our brothers and sisters.

In the life of a parish, communication is necessary and incredibly important. Modern technology can offer great benefits to facilitate communication. But it can also easily become the means of spreading poison and evil. We need to stand up to the darkness of gossip and rumors. There are moments when we legitimately need to talk to a friend about other people and difficult situations and that is a good thing. We are looking for help, or advice or simply venting. In those moments we are not trying to hurt

someone. But there are other moments when we know better. If we claim to be Christian, then we better act like it. Let's become conscious of hateful communication and put an end to evil moments. Walk away from the gossip, do not spread the rumors, and remember that nothing is hidden from God!



2023 Respect Life Conference Pro-Life Awards


QAS parishioner, Jeannine Sinak, received the Cardinal Carberry Award at the 50th anniversary Respect Life Conference held on October 15th at the Cardinal Rigali Center in Shrewsbury. The award is presented annually to an individual(s) who has made a significant contribution to the pro-life movement. The honor is named after the late Cardinal Carberry, who started the archdiocesan Pro-Life Committee in St. Louis — the first in the nation — after the Roe vs. Wade decision in 1973.

Jeannine has served as a longtime pro-life coordinator. She also has served on the executive board of the Respect Life Apostolate, assists with organizing various pro-life events around the archdiocese and has been instrumental in bringing youths to Washington, D.C., for the March for Life. 


