


Salute To Our Veterans



Dan grew up in QAS parish and was involved in QAS sports, choir, as well as being a server. He was a 2001 graduate of St. John Vianney High School, earning Gold Circle and Marianist awards. After graduating from Southeast Missouri State University, Dan was commissioned into the U.S. Army. Sadly, he was killed in action on June 23, 2007 in Taji, Iraq. To honor his sacrifice, his family established a scholarship fund at Vianney High School. Dan is a hero and his ultimate sacrifice will never be forgotten.







**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
