

IMPORTANT



To all extraordinary ministers and those wishing to become an extraordinary minister, please note a very important meeting/training session is scheduled for Saturday August 17 at 9:00 am in the Church Hall.

It has been several years since we have had a general meeting and there have been a number of things that have and will change. We are planning to re-introduce Holy Communion under both species. This is an extremely important meeting so if you wish to remain an extraordinary minister, please mark your calendars for this important date.

NOTE TO EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS

Please remember to purify your Pyx. Especially if you have to fracture a host, there could be small particles left in your Pyx. Put water in your Pyx and consume it so no particles remain. Also, when bringing the Eucharist to the homebound or sick, bring a small white purificator, which you can get in the sacristy, in case someone spits out part of the host. The residue will need to be put in a cup of water and brought to a Priest or Deacon, who will take it to the sacristy for proper disposition.

MISSION APPEAL

This weekend, June 15 & 16, we will have the Annual Mission Appeal in our parish. Fr. Jomon Palatty from the missionaries of St. Francis de Sales will be the speaker of this appeal. In the homily he will speak about their mission work mainly in India and several African countries. The congregation of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales was founded in Annecy, France in 1837 as missionaries. They are now globally present in 29 counties with membership of more than 1500 priests. The missionaries work among the poor, disadvantaged, marginalized, and illiterate through conducting children's homes, orphanages and schools. More than 3500 economically poor, semi orphan or orphan children are cared for and educated in their 93 children's homes both in India and Africa. Also, we have to take care of retired priests, who retire only when they are not able to work anymore. There is absolutely no income from social security or any kind of welfare system. The elderly priests depend 100 percent on the congregation for support in their old age. So, please support the missionaries with you generous donations to continue the good work they are doing. Let us welcome our missionary Fr. Jomon Palatty msfs from India.

ANNUAL BABY BOTTLE DRIVE







With more than one location, please click the "This is my main/primary location" circle to indicate where you are employed or, if you are a volunteer, where most of your ministry or service is performed.

Complete your personal information. Please enter your legal first name (no nicknames) for the purpose of the background screening.

Create a username, password and password clue. ****(BE SURE TO SAVE THIS INFORMATION TO AVOID RE-REGISTERING. DOUBLE BACKGROUND CHECKS ARE COSTLY TO OUR PARISH!!!)

Agree to the Terms of Use and click SUBMIT.

You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening</u>, register for a ****Protecting God's Children work**shop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete <u>ALL</u> steps to <u>complete the process</u>.

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
