

I LOVE beef jerky, and Wally's has a ton of beef jerky. Since I usually can't afford their prices, (maybe "justify" is a better word) I just fill up on the free samples.

Now, this isn't an advertisement for Wally's; there is a point to this article. I was in Wally's a while back and I was standing near a family with young children.

They were on their way to Six Flags and had stopped for gas and of course the kids had to check the place out. When it was time for them to leave, the parents called to the kids, telling them to get into the car. The kids started protesting, stating that they didn't want to leave, they wanted to stay longer. The youngest even threw a temper tantrum. I was thinking to myself, how crazy! They were on their way to Six Flags, which is a million times more fun than Wally's and the kids didn't understand that they were clinging to something that was far less.


It struck me that this is exactly how many of us Catholics are behaving. We were created by God to live with God forever in His Kingdom which is a life that is infinitely more exciting and joy-filled than anything that this world has to offer, and it lasts forever. And yet, like the children at Wally's, we forget where we are headed, we get sidetracked by the cheap thrills in this world. Many become lazy or indifferent about practicing their faith or they stop practicing their faith completely and in doing so teach their children that Church is not all that important.

We need to be reminded that we are on a journey to the Kingdom and religion is the vehicle that gets us there. As much as we enjoy the beautiful things in this world, they are temporary, we will eventually leave all of them behind. We need to keep moving. I'm not sure why so many Catholics fail to show up to Church on Sundays, fail to give time to God and fail to teach their children the importance of the journey to the kingdom. Had the parents at Wally's remained at Wally's in order to appease their children, they might have eventually arrived at Six Flags only to find that the gates were shut, and the park closed. Wouldn't it be horrifying to arrive at the gates of the Kingdom, only to find them closed to us because we settled for less. It doesn't have to be that way. Let's enjoy the beauty and temporary benefits of this world but not forget that this world is only a "pitstop" on the way to our dream home!



In today's second reading, St. Paul says, "a thorn in the flesh was given to me." Some think of this as a physical alignment that Paul was experiencing while others think this may be referring to a person who has been giving Paul a hard time. In either case, Paul is "suffering." Suffering, the archenemy of today's god of comfort. People today avoid suffering at all cost, even the slightest bit of discomfort. This is the result of living a "self-centered" life, everything revolves around me. As Christians, we are called to live "God-centered" lives. Using our God-given gifts for the glory of God and the benefit of others. From this viewpoint, suffering takes on a different meaning. Finally, through suffering we open our hearts and are filled with God's love and mercy. We become instruments of His love and mercy for others.



Caregiving for persons with dementia can be both rewarding and depleting - an act of love cushioned in feelings of burnout, despair, and loneliness. The question becomes: who cares for the caregiver?

DETAILS

This workshop will focus on exploring support for the caregiver, support that will come both from the caregiver him- or herself and from the community.

- Dr. Kaori Sakurai, a gerontologist with expertise in dementia care, will share thoughts about healthy approaches to caregiving that take into account the needs of the caregiver as well as the person being cared for.
- Cheryl Kinney, LCSW, a licensed social worker with expertise in dementia care, will share a person-centered approach to communicating with and providing support to individuals with dementia.
- Coke Hennessy, a Mindfulness Teacher certified through U C Berkeley and certified in dementia care through the Alzheimer's Association, will share ideas of self-care available to refresh and replenish the caregiver physically, emotionally, and mentally.
- Maria Miskovic, MSW, LCSW, from Care Choice Care Management, an organization which works with families of persons with dementia to find optimal care for everyone involved, will discuss resources available in our community to support caregivers.

Select the specific location by name. (ex. Queen of All Saints)

Agree to the Terms of Use and click SUBMIT.

You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening</u>, register for a ****Protecting God's Children work**shop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete <u>ALL</u> steps to <u>complete the process</u>.

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
