FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

What a good year we just completed here at Queen of All Saints parish. Throughout the Year of the Lord 2022 we celebrated the fifty years this parish has been in existence. With gratitude to God, we recalled the tenacious efforts of Fr. Thomas Davisson, the founding pastor, to organize the Catholics in this area. Working out of a subdivision house and relying upon the hospitality of the Poor Clare Sisters, the people of the new Queen of All Saints parish began to form a community of believers, Catholics who not only worshipped together but also played together, and most essentially, served together. Sadly and unexpectedly, Fr. Davisson died just eighteen months after the parish began, but subsequent priests continued what he had begun, and, working with many dedicated and generous people, built a church and a school and a rectory. Then they added on to the church and added on to the school. They also carved out ball fields, built a concession stand, and installed lights to enable nighttime events. We, who are part of this parish, owe much to those who began this good work in 1972.

In 2022 we celebrated these glorious fifty years. We invited priests once stationed here to return and celebrate Mass. We invited four of those priests - Fr. Fonseca, Fr. Vien, Fr. Fallon, and Fr. Stanger - to lead a parish mission during Lent. Each of them answered the question once posed by Jesus, "who do you say that I am?" In listening to the answers of these four priests each one of us was able to discover a bit more of our own relationship with Jesus Christ.

At the end of July we welcomed Archbishop Rozanski to our church to celebrate Mass. The Archbishop thanked us for being the good parish that we are and led us in the worship of God, joining with us as we thanked God for fifty years worth of blessings. Mass was followed by a delicious dinner at Royale Orleans, where parishioners packed the place. We saw a wonderful video put together by a QAS school alumnus, Phillip Willet, and we heard an inspirational talk by a former pastor, Msgr. Henry Breier. Finally, at the end of August we had a family night celebration of our fifty years (and yes, Fr. Detwiler's 30th birthday), with live music, free food, and amazing fireworks.

Again, I have to thank our Fiftieth Anniversary Committee for the great job they did in organizing all these events. Along with enabling us to purchase some really cool 50th Anniversary clothing. Yes, 2022 was a special year for Queen of All Saints.

What will happen in the Year of the Lord 2023? That's a good question, especially in light of whatever is announced by Archbishop Rozanski on Pentecost Sunday in May. While it appears right now that our parish will operate in the future as it currently does, we know that this will not be the case throughout our archdiocese. Many of our family and friends will be affected. Schools and churches we attended in our youth, and which had a huge impact in our lives, will be merged with other parishes and/or closed outright. Difficult decisions will have to be made (and in the case of St. Mary's and Rosati-Kain high schools, already have been). Much will be asked of all the people in this archdiocese in the year that begins today.

At the end of November I attended a deanery meeting at St. Matthias Church. As is my habit, I grabbed a bulletin and found in there this quote from St. Francis de Sales. I believe it is appropriate for all of us in the archdiocese as All Things New takes shape; indeed this is a great quote for everybody as we begin a new year.

Do not look forward to the changes as chances of this life in fear; rather look forward with full hope that, as they arise, God will deliver you out of them. He has kept you up to now, do you but hold fast to His dear hand, and He will lead you safely through all things...the same everlasting Father that cares for you today will take care of you tomorrow and every day. Either He will shield you from suffering, or He will give you unfailing strength to bear it. Be at peace then, and put aside all anxious thoughts and imaginations.

Another helpful thought as we venture into the unknown of 2023, and appropriate as we celebrate today's Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God: As said first by Mother Theresa of Calcutta, "If you ever feel distressed during your day, call upon our Lady, just say this simple prayers, 'Mary, Mother of Jesus, please be a mother to me now.' I must admit, this prayer has never failed me."

May God bless all of us bountifully in 2023.

Your QAS Knights of Columbus council conducts a "Roses for Life" campaign each year in January to promote the truth that all human life is sacred from conception until natural death.

Roses will be available during all the Masses on the weekend of 1/7 & 1/8. They should be filled in with your name and address, and returned at the end of Mass to a Knight, who will also gratefully accept whatever donation you are able to give.

The annual March for Life will take place in Washington DC on 1/20/23, and this year will mark the end of a U.S. Constitution-based right to abortion on demand. The Dobbs decision last summer corrected a mistake made by the Court's predecessors that any "right" to abortion cannot be and is not found in the Constitution. This does not mean that the struggle is over. In fact, now that each state's elected representatives can legislate their own specific regulations and laws concerning abortion makes it clear that we must continue to pray, witness, educate, and legislate our way forward to a time when all people can clearly see the truth that our Faith teaches us about the dignity of every human life from conception to natural death.

The Roses will be delivered in person to our elected officials in Washington D.C. by a Knight from our QAS Council. Please be generous toward this most worthy cause, continue to pray for God's mercy upon our nation, help us to support women, men, and families to choose Life, and thank you in advance!

About MOScholars

MOScholars is Missouri's ESA- Empowerment Scholarship Account program. It provides state tax credits in exchange for contributions to non-profit Educational Assistance Organizations (EAOs). EAOs then use the contributions to award scholarships to Missouri students living in low-income households or those on Individualized Education Programs. TTEF is Your Local EAO!

Who is Eligible To Donate?

- An individual subject to Missouri state income tax.
- An individual, firm, partner in a firm, corporation or shareholder in an S-Corp doing business in the state and subject to state income tax.
- An express company that pays an annual tax on its gross receipts in Missouri under chapter 153.

100% Tax Credits!

MOScholars tax credits are equal to 100% of an eligible donation, up to 50% of the donor's Missouri tax liability for the tax year the credit is claimed.

What is TTEF's Role?

The Today and Tomorrow Educational Foundation, your local EAO, is responsible for accepting eligible donor contributions and submitting supporting documentation. In turn, TTEF provides funding to eligible students for the scholarship account. TTEF processes documents for tax credit donors who contribute to the program each year.

You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
