FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Once there was a Native American chief who was nearing the end of his life. Even though he had tried many times, he was not able to decide which of his sons should succeed him as chief.

One day he gathered his sons together and told them, "Do you see that mountain in the distance? I want you to journey to that mountain, climb to its summit and bring back the thing you think will be most helpful in leading our people."

After several days the first son returned with a load of flint stones, used to make arrow tips and spear points. He told his father, "Our people will never live in fear of their enemies. I know where there is a mount of flint."

The second son climbed to the top of the mountain. On the way he discovered forests rich with wood for making fires. When he returned he said to his father, "Our people will never be cold in winter. I know where wood can be found in abundance to keep them warm and cook their food."

The third son returned late and empty-handed. He stated, "When I got to the summit I found nothing worth bringing back. I searched everywhere, but the top of the mountain was useless, covered with barren rock. Then I looked out toward the horizon, far into the distance. I was astonished to see new land filled with forests and meadows, hills and valleys, fish and animals - a land of great beauty and peace. I brought nothing back, for the land was far off and I didn't have time to go there. But I would love to go there someday; I delayed coming back because I found it very difficult to return after seeing the beauty of that land."

The old chief's eyes blazed. He grasped this third son in his arms proclaiming that he would succeed him as the new chief. He thought to himself, "The other sons brought back worthy things, necessary things. But my third son knows the way to a better land. It is important that the new chief has a vision and has seen the promised land and burns with the desire to go there."

I'll bet the Magi found it difficult to leave Baby Jesus, though a warning in a dream prompted them to go. A star had produced a vision in them. They had not seen acres of beauty from a mountain top nor pondered the riches they could have from bountiful natural resources. No, it was just a star, a solitary star, yet it led them to One who was most beautiful of all. Surely, they recognized this beauty. Certainly, they appreciated the Father's gift of his Son. Reverently, they joined Mary and Joseph in paying homage to the Savior of the world. And, like the third son above, they returned empty-handed, having left their valuable gifts back in Bethlehem.

These Magi headed back east with a vision. Their trip surely was long and arduous. Many difficulties had to be overcome, particularly that conniving King Herod. But with God's help - and that shining star - they arrived in Bethlehem. Hope was there, waiting for them. Love was there - glad they arrived. God was there, small, like a baby, yet more powerful than any king could ever hope to be. It has been said that these three kings knew when to step aside, when to give up their reins of power. They knew when to take off their own crowns and relinquish their kingdoms, all for the sake of glimpsing, just once in their lifetime, the face of a holy child. Yes, they came back home empty - handed, but what a vision they had had, what promise they had seen.

St. Basil the Great wrote in the fourth century: "Stars across the sky, wise men journey from pagan lands. Earth receives its savior in a cave. Let there be no one without a gift to offer, no one without gratitude as we celebrate the salvation of the world, the birthday of our destiny."

Today's Feast of the Epiphany provides that soaring hope for us, just as it did for the Magi. Surely, the appearance of Christ impacted the rest of their lives. May it impact our lives, too, especially as we journey through this still new year of 2023. We have been given the star. We have been given the vision. We have been given the Child.

In April 18, 2005, Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger was elected the 264th successor of Saint Peter and chose the name Benedict XVI. His papacy testifies to both a scholarly churchman, having extensively studied theology and philosophy, and pastoral sensitivity. When elected pope at age 78, he didn't anticipate traveling the globe given his age and health, but quickly realized that the best way to reach the people of God was to go to them. He attended the first World Youth Day in Germany just months after his election.

On February 28, 2013, Pope Benedict announced his resignation, becoming the first pope in almost 600 years to resign from the papacy.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI passed away on December 31, 2022 at the age of 95.

Archbishop Rozanski celebrated a Memorial Mass at the Cathedral Basilica on Thursday, January 5, 2023.

8TH GRADE MINISTRY


Ablaze Confirmation Prep - Wednesday, January 11th
