FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Did you know that last week was the anniversary of the first hot air balloon flight in the United States? It was on January 9, 1793, that a French adventurer and inventor named Jean Pierre Blanchard took a 45 minute flight from Philadelphia to New Jersey. Blanchard had previously distinguished himself in Europe, especially when he crossed the English Channel in a hydrogen balloon in 1785. Before and after that flight, he toured the European continent performing balloon exhibition flights. In doing so, he helped set off a kind of balloon-mania, in which balloons and balloon-shaped decorations became the hot fashion item of the day.

While Blanchard wasn't the first to fly balloons, he was among the most famous, because he had a knack for drawing a crowd. He had a flair for the dramatic. He was, for example, among the first people to incorporate the use of the newly-invented parachute into his shows. He would push a parachute-wearing dog out of the balloon (I'm sure the dog was thrilled). On one occasion, though, Blanchard noticed a tear in his balloon, so he was forced to parachute himself. He landed safely, while the crowd roared its approval. What a show!

Inevitably, the daredevil Blanchard made his way to America. And on January 9, 1793, he gathered a huge crowd at the Walnut Street Jail in Philadelphia, which at that time was still the capital city of the United States. Amongst those in the crowd was President George Washington, along with four men who also would serve as President: John Adams, Thomas Jefferson, James Madison, and James Monroe.

Jean Pierre didn't speak much English, and he really couldn't control exactly where his balloon would land. Nevertheless, he took off, carrying with him a note from President Washington, which asked any American who found Blanchard on the ground to receive him and aid him with the humanity and goodwill which would render honor to their new nation.

Blanchard rose from the streets of Philadelphia and let the wind take him where it would - New Jersey. The first person who found him was quite frightened, until Blanchard offered a glass of wine (the man travelled prepared). As the two enjoyed their wine, a third person approached, who had been tracking the balloon across the sky. This fellow was also afraid of this eighteenth century version of a UFO, and he drew near with his musket raised and ready to fire.

Accounts say that when the man saw Blanchard and the balloon he was overwhelmed, dropped his firearm, and raised his hands in surrender. Blanchard offered him a glass of wine, too. Eventually, the daredevil made his way back to Philadelphia where he presented the President the first U.S. flag to fly airborne over the country.

Jean Pierre stayed in the U.S. for a few more years, drawing large and appreciative audiences. He then returned to France and married his wife, Sophie, who likewise became a balloon adventurer.

Sadly, both Blanchards died in the skies. Jean Pierre had a heart attack while flying a balloon in 1808 and fell out of the basket to the earth. Sophie died in 1819 when a firework, part of her own pyrotechnic daredevil show, collided with her hydrogen balloon. The balloon crashed onto a housetop. Sophie survived the crash, but the fire burned through the balloon rigging, spilling her basket, and she died when she fell to the streets two stories below.

Jean Pierre Blanchard, though, represents so many who came to this country and/or stayed in this country with a spirit of adventure, with a willingness to take risks, to go beyond, to surpass expectations. The Lord wants us to do the same with our faith. In today's First Reading from the prophet Isaiah, the Lord spoke to the people, "It is too little for you to be my servants,... I will make you a light to the nations." Our faith cannot be stuck on the ground. It should rise, it should soar beyond expectation. Littleness does not describe us, brilliantly shining in Christ's light does. A hot air balloon might help accomplish that, but prayer and service will work much better.

Now that the Season of Christmas has ended I want to thank all those who helped make our celebration of Christ's Birth beautiful. A big word of gratitude to those who set up the gym for Mass, to those who ushered, proclaimed the Word of the Lord, helped with Communion, played instruments and sang at Mass. Thanks, too, to those who wonderfully decorated the Church. The work of all of you is a splendid example of services to God and others. Thank you.

May God bless all of you.

WORLDWIDE MARRIAGE ENCOUNTER**World Marriage Day**

On Sunday, February 12, 2023, at 2:30 pm., Auxiliary Bishop Mark S. Rivituso will celebrate a Mass for World Marriage Day at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis, 4431 Lindell Blvd. St. Louis, MO. A reception will follow in Boland Hall. All married couples are invited to attend and celebrate the gift of marriage. World Marriage Day honors husband and wife as the foundation of the family – the basic unit of society. It emphasizes the faithfulness, sacrifice and joy of daily married life. World Marriage Day started in Baton Rouge, LA in 1981 and was later adopted by Worldwide Marriage Encounter who now is sponsoring this event on February 12th.

**EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS**

One of the things that got discombobulated because of the pandemic was the use of extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist during Mass. Before COVID we would have as many as twelve extraordinary ministers at a given Mass. Now, at some Masses, nobody comes up to help. True, on many Sundays the priests, deacons, and seminarians supply all the help needed to distribute Holy Communion. But the seminarians are gone until the end of January and Fr. Detwiler was gone for a few weeks, so on a couple of occasions we were caught short of help.

So if you are an extraordinary minister of the Eucharist, and would like to remain so, please contact the parish office by phone or email and let them know. One of the aftereffects of COVID is we don't even know who wants to help anymore. We would like an accurate list.

Second, when you arrive at Mass check the doorway of the sacristy near the vestibule. If we need help with Holy Communion, medals will be hung there. Take one and wear it if you intend to help. If you forget to check, then note how many ciboria are placed upon the altar during the Lamb of God. Generally, there are four at the 5 p.m. and noon Masses and five at the 7:30, 9:00, and 10:30 a.m. Masses. If you see five ciboria but only three clergy, then you know help is needed. If you don't see anyone approaching the sanctuary, come on up.

If you are not an extraordinary minister but would like to be so, please contact Fr. Hambrough.

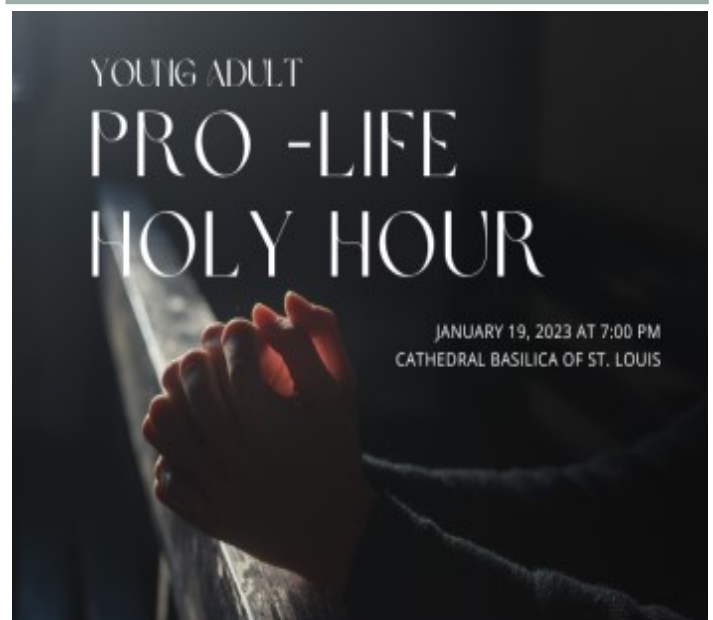
