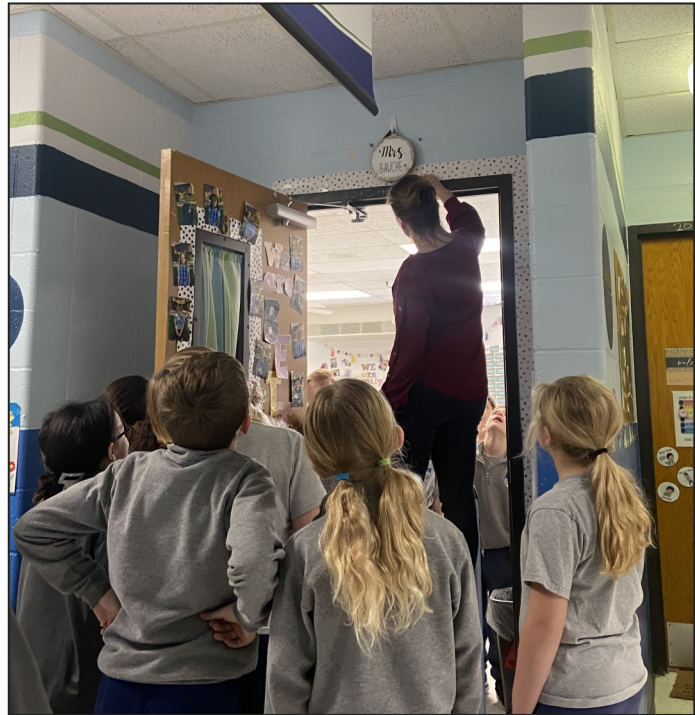

EPIPHANY BLESSING AND CHALKING OF THE DOORS

Students at QAS School participated in the Epiphany Blessing and Chalking of the Doors. In this picture, third grade teacher, Mrs. Bauche, wrote above the entrance of the classroom door: $20 + C + M + B + 23$. The Christian custom of chalking the door has a Biblical precedent as the Israelites in the Old Testament marked their doors in order to be saved from death; likewise, the Epiphanytide practice serves to protect Christian homes/schools from evil spirits until the next Epiphany Day, at which time the custom is repeated.

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

On this day in 1973 I was a junior at Normandy High School. January 22nd was a Monday that year. I would have gone to school that day, rode in my friend's car, and completed any homework I had. If there was time before dinner I may have gone for a five mile run. I had run cross-country in the fall and I knew I had to keep running throughout the winter if I expected to run varsity in track during the spring. If I hadn't run five miles then I may have run 1 1/2 miles to the gym at UMSL, where I would meet friends and play basketball.

Dinner was probably a big deal that night since that January 22nd was my father's 45th birthday. My mother would have cooked a nice dinner and there would have been birthday cake. Having dessert was a rarity in our home so birthday cake after dinner was a big deal. I'm not sure what I would have done after dinner; perhaps I watched television in the family room, maybe studied some more, or, if Normandy was playing that night, I would have met my friends at the basketball game, not only to watch the game but also to see the Pom-Pom girls perform a dance at halftime, particularly because one of the girls was my older sister.

I have absolutely no recollection of any decision handed down that same day by the United States Supreme Court. I could not have told you anything about Roe v. Wade. "Who was Roe? Who was Wade?" I don't think I knew what abortion was. I was still 16 on this day 50 years ago and I doubt I had ever heard the word "abortion." Roe v. Wade had no impact on me 50 years ago. My dad's birthday was the central point of the day.

I'm pretty sure, though, that I would have learned about abortion within the next month. I read both the Globe-Democrat and the Post-Dispatch every day. My parents may have talked about it. My older sister could have commented. The priest at Mass may have inserted it in his homily. I can't pinpoint the exact day I learned what an abortion was but I well remember my exact reaction, "That's disgusting! That's barbaric! How can someone do that to an unborn child?" My reaction hasn't changed in fifty years.

The Roe v. Wade decision in 1973 shook the moral and political foundations of this nation. Up until then the U.S.A. could be considered a great country, having forged a new nation upon this continent, finally eliminated slavery, and rushed to the aid of many other countries facing peril. But we haven't been great since 1973. No country is great that allows its unborn children to be slaughtered ruthlessly while in the womb of his/her mother.

The Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision of last summer provided a ray of hope for this nation. For a minute. That's about the length of time it took for the rapidly pro-abortion side to gear up in protest - in town squares, outside courthouses, in neighborhoods of certain Supreme Court justices. Various television and news networks trotted out one person after another who moaned and groaned that all unborn children would have a chance at life. "My gosh, we can't have that! We have to have the permission of the law to make sure those tiny beating hearts are stopped!"

Those kind of people remind me of a scene in the movie, Gladiator Maximus, the hero of the movie, is fighting another gladiator before the Emperor in the Roman Colosseum. Maximus has won the fight and now he waits for the thumbs-up or thumbs-down decision. Should he stab his opponent or let him live? In the movie, the Colosseum spectators are shouting, "Kill! Kill! Kill!" Maximus disobeys the Emperor and let's the man live. To me, all those on the pro-choice side are saying the same thing, "Kill! Kill!" Oh, they disguise their true feelings by making it sound heroic, "We're defending women's rights," or noble, "We're protecting women's health," or compassionate, "She's too young/sick/immature/victimized to have a child." It's all nonsense. They don't care that an unborn child never gets to see the beautiful world God created for them. Mother Teresa was so right when she said, "Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love, but to use any violence to get what they want."

Fifty years ago today I didn't know what was happening around me. I do now, and so do you. Let us commit ourselves to always defend the unborn, help those who face difficult decisions, and pray for the conversion of those who support abortion. God and the unborn, are depending on us.

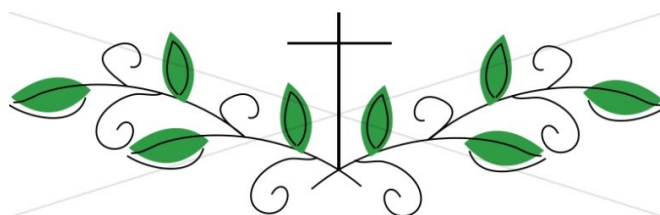

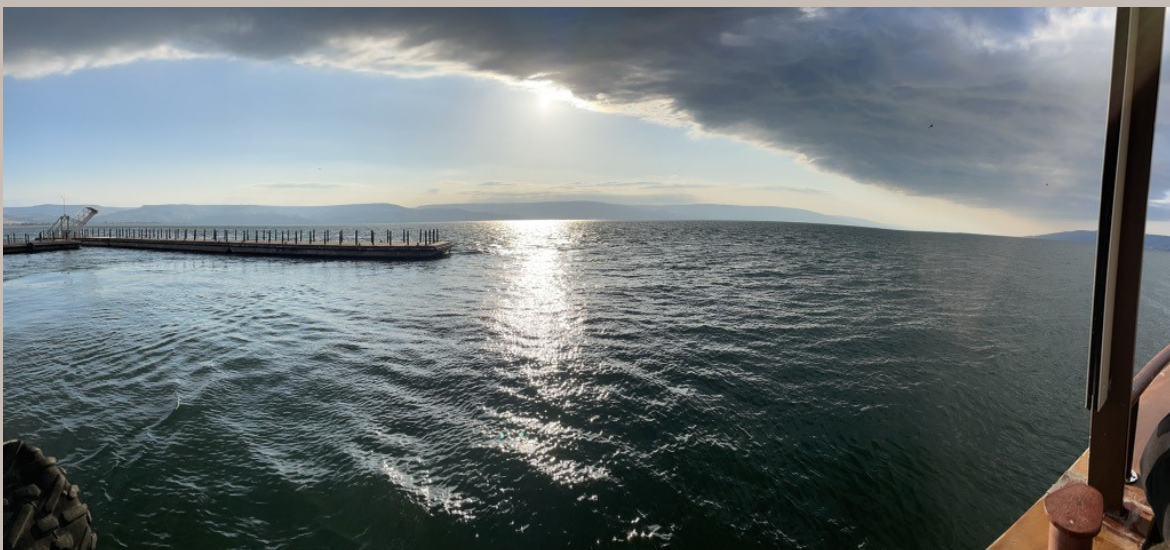


We went to the town of Magdala and got to see the ruins and the beautiful church there; and there was a beautiful chapel beneath the church.
