STEWARDSHIP

4TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.”

MATTHEW 5:3

The phrase “poor in spirit” can be confusing. Think of it in this sense – poor in spirit means depending on God’s providence and not depending on our own self-reliance. Being detached from earthly things (power, money, and comfort) and being attached to heavenly things (charity, sacrifice, and mercy). Denying ourselves from satisfying our desires and helping others obtain their basic needs.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I was very sad when I learned of the impending closure of St. Mark School in Affton, a parish I helped start in 2003 after the Archdiocese merged the parishes of St. Timothy, Mary Queen of the Universe, and Precious Blood into one parish. This closure will be “strike two” for schools named after St. Mark.

The original St. Mark church and school was located in the northwest section of the City of St. Louis at the corner of Page and Academy Avenues. It was a huge parish in its day with a full co-ed grade school and a girls high school. Many of its alumni went into the priesthood and religious life, with many alumnae entering the Dominican Sisters of Sparkhill, New York, motherhouse for the Sisters who staffed the school. One of the alumna of St. Mark’s did not accept the encouragement of the associate pastor to consider the Dominicans, but she promised that one of her sons would become a priest. That son is now the pastor of Queen of All Saints.

Yet changing demographics brought a close to St. Mark High School in 1973 and the grade school closed about 25 years later. When the merger of three South County parishes occurred in 2003 parishioners were allowed to select a name for the parish and recommend that name to the Archbishop Rigali for his approval, which he gave. St. Mark was the name chosen and when this new St. Mark School opened in August, 2003, its enrollment stood at 340 students, so many that four modular classrooms had to be built on the property for the school building didn’t have enough rooms. The decline in enrollment started the very next year. While the upper grade classes had between 45-55 students, the lower grades had just 25-35, then after a few more years, just 16-24. After a while, the parish sold the modular classrooms because they weren’t needed. Enrollment declined, families moved further into South County or Jefferson County, and teachers had to be laid off. St. Mark’s got a boost of 80 new students when Immaculate Heart of Mary School closed in 2014. Then enrollment started to decline the very next year.

Changing demographics, smaller families, and declining enrollment have been problems for Catholic schools since Catholic schools were first established in our archdiocese two hundred years ago. In our local history, dozens and dozens of grade and high schools have closed and it wasn’t easy for any of them. The sadness that veils the people of St. Mark is, unfortunately, not new or unique. Still, it hurts.

This is a long way of saying how grateful we should be for Queen of All Saints School as we begin today Catholic Schools Week. Our enrollment has been steady the past several years, averaging around 350 students in kindergarten - 8th grade. Our pre-school enrollment has increased in the past three years to about ninety students. Still, many of you remember when the school had 700 students. Many of you remember when the school was so crowded another wing had to be constructed. Changing demographics have occurred in Oakville, too, along with changing attitudes on the practice of our faith, namely, that too many Catholics no longer practice their faith.

Still, we can be proud of our school, our staff, and our students. There are wonderful people teaching and learning every day in that building. Our families appreciate the atmosphere. As part of the All Things New initiative, school families were asked to take a survey. Here are some of things posted by our parents in the comments section about our school: *“Strong community, great facility, welcoming students and faculty,”... “small class sizes, feeling of community,”... “The community at QAS is amazing. I do love how they have helped shape my child’s love and understanding of God,”... “I like the church community school that allows for my children to have a ‘village’ to help raise them, not only in life, but also our faith.”* Truly, we are blessed to have Queen of All Saints School.

We are wasting our time and money, though, if our graduates leave the school without knowing how to boast; boasting is important. Sure teachers can teach about all sorts of things. Yes, religion, math, social studies, and literature are crucial to a child’s understanding of the world God has created. But boasting is most important. And not boasting about making Honor Roll, joining the National Honor Society, or getting straight-A tickets to a Cardinal’s game. No, I’m talking about boasting in the Lord. St. Paul writes in today’s Second Reading that the foolish think they’ve accomplished great things on their own. The truly wise, the really smart, recognize that our calling and our gifts come from God, that wisdom, righteousness, and redemption are due to Christ Jesus, who blesses us in many ways. Pray that our students leave our school ready to boast about that, ready to boast in the Lord.

You are invited today to tour our school. There’s an Open House from 11:30-2:30pm. Go meet our principal, Mrs. Bender, and some of our great faculty and students. And thank you for all you do to support our school by way of prayer and donations. Demographics may change, enrollment may vary, and students will come and go, and through it all, our school will press on and Jesus Christ will be praised.
