

Dear Parishioners,

Once upon a time, there was a man who went on a journey in search of a beautiful and mystical river. When he located the river, he sat down next to it and found contentment as he gazed upon the river's beauty. He drank deeply of its nourishing water; he bathed in it; he fished from it; he played in it. Heck, he became so carefree he almost drowned in it. Joy and happiness bounced through his life while just being near the river.

The man stayed many days and nights at the river, absorbing the wisdom of its mystical teachings. As he prepared to leave, he grabbed his camera and from both shores, and while in the water, he took many pictures of this beautiful, sacred spot. Glad to have captured such memories, he headed for home.

Upon his return, family and friends and fellow citizens noticed the joy the man now radiated. They asked him what had happened to him at the river. They had all sorts of questions - was the river mystical? Magical? Stunning? Brilliant?

"You must go for yourselves and experience the river," the man implored. "You must see, listen, touch, taste and smell the river for yourselves. I could never fully describe or hope to explain the beauty and mystery I experienced from the river. Words can never say it all. I urge you: Go! Let the river change your lives the way it changed mine."

"Well, we could go as you suggest," replied one of the crowd. "But, didn't you take a bunch of photos? Couldn't we just look at them?"

"We could," said another, "and to show how magnificent the river is we could put each picture in a golden frame and hang them in the town hall. We can then go there on any day we like and be thrilled to look at the river."

And they did. And people streamed through the town hall and looked at the photos of the river - for a time. Then no one looked, and no one went to the river, and no one found boundless joy.

And seeing what had happened, the man was saddened. He wished he had never taken any pictures of that beautiful and mystical river.

The water in today's Gospel does not flow between opposite banks but sits in large jars. While in there the water is miraculously touched by the power of Jesus and becomes a delicious wine, far more flavorful than the wine already served. A pity, then, that no one drew any pictures of those six stone water jars. Then we could have hung them on a wall and paraded past them and so find inspiration. How easy that would be!

Or would it be better to go to the source, to seek Jesus Christ, even if such a quest is not always easy or as satisfying as we hope it could be. Jesus performs this first miracle in St. John's Gospel as the beginning of the signs he would display as a cause to put faith in him. The disciples there that day in Cana saw the glory of Jesus up close and they began to believe in him. Being close to Jesus opened the door not only to witnessing miracles, but also to enhancing faith, a faith that would take them right into Heaven. Faith will do so for us, too.


Thus, like the man at the river, we jump right into the goodness of Jesus. We bathe in his grace, look at him from every side, drink in every blessing. Pictures, statues, and holy cards of Jesus are great, but we are not content with that. No, we want the abundance. We want the Eucharist. We want the Real Presence of Jesus.



A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world. Through special initiatives and in daily prayer, may an impassioned plea arise to God, the Creator and love of life, from every Christian community, from every group and association, from every family and from the heart of every believer.

Evangelium Vitae

The over 60 million abortions since the 1973 decisions of *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton* reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture." However, we have great trust in God's providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children": "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion."

As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of <u>prayer</u>, fasting and/or giving alms. Another way to take part is through participating in special events to observe the anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*. Call your local diocese or parish to find out what events might be taking place in your area.

THE CROSS AND THE MASS
ARE THE SAME
SACRIFICE

When we go to Mass, we are brought into the presence of Christ's sacrifice on the cross which took place at Calvary two thousand years ago. His one sacrifice is again made present; what happened on the cross and what takes place on the altar at Mass is the *same sacrifice* - yet present in different modes. This understanding helps us to better participate in three ways:

First, in both modes (cross and altar) are we united to the sacrifice? Yes, Jesus' sacrifice on the cross is our death to sin: Jesus became sin for us. The Father "made Him to be sin who knew no sin" (2 Corinthians 5:21). At Mass the same thing happens: we are offered as sacrifice along with the body of the Lord (Catechism no. 901). We offer all of our joys, sorrows, intentions and weaknesses, the things we like about ourselves, and the things we dislike about ourselves. We offer everything: family problems, marriage issues, conflict at work, everything. We give our whole selves in every dimension. We offer our very lives to God the

Father, along with the Sacrifice of Christ, by uniting ourselves with Christ crucified, as we are brought into His crucified presence at the altar. So, in the one sacrifice of Christ - both on the cross and at the altar - we are offered. We come to Mass, then, with the disposition of giving our whole lives in this way.

Second, how are we united with the one Sacrifice? Through a priest. In the sacrifice on Calvary, Jesus Christ - the eternal high priest (Hebrews 4:14) - takes us up with himself and offers us as sacrifice to the Father. At Mass the priest, acting in the person of Christ (the head of the body), offers our sacrifice to the Father: "Pray, brethren, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father." Later, he says: "In humble prayer we ask you, almighty God: command that these gifts be borne by the hands of your holy Angel to your altar on high in the sight of your divine majesty..." So the sacrifice is always offered by The Priest (Jesus Christ, as at Calvary) and the one standing-in-thevery-person-of-The Priest (the ordained priest of Jesus Christ, as at Mass). So, not only do we come to Mass with the intention of offering our whole selves, but also that we are making this offering of ourselves through the hands of the priest.

Third, is the direction of the sacrifice the same in both modes (cross and altar)? Yes, Christ hanging upon the cross, said: "Father, into your hands, I commend my spirit" (Luke 23:46). The direction of Christ's sacrifice on the cross was toward the Father. He was offering himself to the Father. At the Mass the direction of the sacrifice - since it is the same sacrifice - is also to the Father. Though the priest often faces us, the people, it benefits us to frequently call to mind that the sacrifice being offered is being offered to the Father. Listen to the words of the Eucharistic prayer and notice how clearly and intentionally the prayers are spoken to the Father. The direction of the sacrifice is always toward the Father.

By uniting ourselves to the Sacrifice of Jesus Christ in the altar and in the cross, we put to death all the brokenness and sin in our life, so that we - who share in his death - might also, on the last day, share in his Resurrection.


MARTHAS FUNERAL LUNCH MINISTRY

Blood is amazing stuff. Did you know that adults have approximately 16 pints of blood in their body at any given time? One collection unit of blood is about 1 pint. It takes roughly 14 hours for your body to replace a donated pint of blood. In the U.S. alone, 41,000 units of blood are used each day. Only about 5% of healthy Americans donate blood. Multiple donations account for over 80% of the blood used for transfusions.

There is no substitute for blood.

You have the power to help people you may not even know. All is takes is for you to roll up your sleeve and donate a pint of blood. Remember, whole blood and blood products such as platelets can't be manufactured; they can only be given freely through the compassionate generosity of donors.
