

### FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I received this past week a letter from Fr. James Mason, President-Rector of Kenrick-Glennon Seminary. It read in part:

"Thank you for your parish community's generous gift of \$5,713 to Kenrick-Glennon Seminary's Christmas Collection. I offer my sincere gratitude to them for supporting the formation of seminarians as they prepare for a lifetime of priestly ministry.

Please continue to pray for the 139 young men discerning God's call to the priesthood at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary this year. May they excel in every virtue, in love that is sincere, and in concern for the sick and the poor. Your support sustains these men as they respond generously to God's invitation to grow in faith and to serve their brothers and sisters in Christ.

Please know that your parish is in my prayers."

It is important for all of us to pray for seminarians, and to ask God to direct those considering the priesthood to enter the seminary. It would be nice if the Lord spoke to young men and women discerning a priestly or religious vocation as easily as he did to the boy Samuel so long ago. Our First Reading today informs us that Samuel was awakened just three times by the Lord, and that he had the priest Eli to help him understand that God was speaking to him. How nice,—three wake-ups, one priest, and Samuel was ready for a lifetime of service to God. Now it takes several years, lots of priests, and thousands of words spoken in prayer for young people to commit to a lifetime of service. We can be thankful that our Archdiocese has a wonderful place like Kenrick-Glennon to help them respond to God.

Of course, it takes all of us a lifetime of listening to God - through prayer, the Scripture, the sacraments, and the Mass - to obey the call the Lord makes to us. Sometimes figuring what God wants comes easily and readily, as it did for Samuel or as it did for Andrew and his unnamed companion in today's Gospel. Other times, it takes years of praying, searching, and sacrificing to understand God's call and will. Many wish that God would make it easier or that God would hurry up with his answers, but God doesn't. Instead, the Lord expects patience, wants us to pass the test he presents and stay on the path he wants us to walk. We do our best to stay true to our calling, always confident that when Jesus says, "Come, and you will see," he leads us to a place of beauty, peace, and love.

One source of information that can help us on our way is the St. Louis Review, the official newspaper of the Archdiocese. It's that time of year to subscribe to the paper and I hope you will. The more we know about our faith the more we can share this information with others. The more others know about faith the more Christ is present among us. Reading the Review goes beyond knowing facts about our religion. It opens the door so that Jesus may enter.

We get a new President this week. Joseph Biden will become this nation's second Catholic president. I find the President-elect to be wrong on many issues. I would tell him so if he ever invites me to the White House. But I would tell him also that I'm praying for him, as I have for those who've been in the Oval Office before him. Being President of the United States is a magnificent task; prayerful help is necessary. I'm going to ask God to guide and inspire President Biden. I hope you do, too.

In today's Gospel, Jesus heals many of the townspeople of Capernaum. His healing of physical ailments points to his spiritual healing - to his being the doctor of the soul.

The Gospels are filled with accounts of Jesus' healing, encounters with those whose spiritual energies are unable to flow. Much of Jesus' ministry consisted in teaching people how to see (the kingdom of God), how to hear (the voice of the Spirit), how to walk (overcoming the paralysis of the heart), and how to be free of themselves (so as to discover God).

Jesus was referred to in the early Church as the Savior (*salvator* in Latin). The term speaks of the one who brings healing - indeed, our English word *salve* is closely related to *salvus*, meaning health. When the soul is healthy, it is in a living relationship with God. When the soul is sick, the entire person becomes ill, because all flows from and depends upon the dynamic encounter with the source of being and life who is God.

We heal the soul by bringing to bear the *salvator*, the healer, the one who in his person reconciled us with God and opened the soul to the divine poser.

With the arrival of seminarian Jacob Braun to Queen of All Saints, and with another seminarian assigned here part-time, our parish has two people available to


