

STEWARDSHIP The Epiphany of the Lord

"...They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh." (Matthew 3:11)

What gifts do you give to the Lord? Pope St. Gregory said that these three gifts represent what we should give God every day. Gold - we should reflect Christ's wisdom in all our relationships. Frankincense - represents our daily prayer and adoration to God. Myrrh - is a symbol of our daily sacrifices that we unite with Jesus for the sake of others.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Perhaps you've heard the story of the time when Communists came to power in China. Many Christians were arrested by the leaders who adhered to atheistic principles. Christians were thrown into prisons or, worse, were executed for their faith in Jesus Christ.

One Christian was given the opportunity to reveal why he chose Christianity over the religion of his ancestors. "Well," he said, "I was in a deep pit, sinking in the mire, and helpless to free myself. Looking up I saw a shadow at the top. And soon a venerable face looked over the brink and said, 'My son, I am Confucius, the father of your country. If you had obeyed my teachings you would never have been down there.' And then Confucius passed on with a significant wag of his finger and a cheerless farewell, adding, 'If you ever get out of this, remember to obey my teachings.' But, alas, that did not save me.

"Then Buddha came along, and looking over the edge of the pit he cried, 'My son, just count it all as nothing. Enter into rest. Fold your arms and retire within yourself, and you will find Nirvana, the peace to which we all are tending.' I cried aloud, 'Father Buddha, if only you will help me to get out, I will be glad to do so. I could follow your instructions easily if I were where you are, but how can I rest in this awful place?' Buddha, however, passed on, leaving me to my despair.

"Then another face appeared. It was the face of a man beaming with kindness, while simultaneously bearing marks of sorrow. He didn't speak from the top of the pit, he didn't linger from the edge. He leaped down to my side, threw his arms around me, lifted me from the muck, and hoisted me to the solid ground above. Climbing up himself, he stood next to me. He did not bid me farewell nor scold me for my mistake. Rather, he took my filthy garments and put new clothes on me, then he asked me to follow him, saying, 'I will never leave you or forsake you.' That, sir, is why I became a Christian.'"

Today's Feast of the Epiphany proclaims to the whole world that Jesus has jumped into the pit planet Earth has become and with concern and love will uplift us from the quicksand of sin and death, inviting us always to come and follow him. Christ was born in Bethlehem not just to save the people then, but also the people now. Not just to bring salvation to the Jews of Israel, but to all people everywhere. The Wise Men, Gentiles and foreigners, represent all of us as they acknowledge Jesus Christ as a King. So do we. Our acknowledgement, our faith, assures us that this newborn King will always be with us, even if we find ourselves stuck in the mire. We will not be abandoned. We will not be alone. The Son of God has come to the Earth. Jesus has come to save us.

It's been said, "Youth is when you're allowed to stay up late on New Year's Eve. Old age is when you're forced to." I don't know how you welcomed the Year of Our Lord 2022, but here it is. Albert Einstein remarked, "Learn from yesterday, live for today, hope for tomorrow." Following that piece of advice, I urge to learn from yesterday, not only New Year's Day, but also the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. There is much we can learn from our Blessed Mother as we journey through 2022. Mary's obedience to God's will sets an example for us all. Her commitment to her Son, Jesus, from Bethlehem to Calvary to Heaven, inspires us to make a similar commitment. Her Queenship, over the Saints and you and me, assures us of her great concern for what happens in our lives. Her first century faith motivates our faith in the twenty-first century, in this new year of 2022.

May the Christ who jumps into the pit, and the Mother who bore him in Bethlehem, guide us to holiness all through the year.





For you ever now how much time is left that can still be rearranged.


If we could just slow down enough to consider what's true and real, and always try to understand the way other people feel.
