FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Friday the 22nd marked the 48th anniversary of the terrible Roe v. Wade Decision which legalized abortion in all fifty states. Since that day in 1973 the decision to legalize abortion has brought many to their feet with enthusiastic applause, glad to live in a country where a woman can choose when to give birth, regardless of the fact that a child is developing within her. A woman's "right to choose" has become for millions the very essence of American liberty and they maniacally will fight for abortions to continue.

Yet, a Pro-Life feminist named Marilyn Dickstein-Kopp once put an interesting spin on the usual pro-abortion feminist position. She said:

"Many feminists insist that abortion is necessary for women to participate freely and equally in society. Anyone who disagrees, they argue, has merely adopted patriarchal standards and accepted women's 'place' in society. Yet this argument demonstrates how deeply the roots of sexism run in our culture. Its premise is a sexist one - that women are inferior to men and that in order to be equal, we have to change our biology to become like men - wombless and unpregnant at will. What other oppressed group in history has had to undergo surgery in order to be equal?"

Ms. Dickstein-Kopp makes a good point, as have thousands of other pro-life people since 1973. Those of us in the pro-life movement see every life as valuable, a gift from God sharing the dignity of humanity once enjoyed by the Savior Himself. Jesus, born of a poor unwed mother engaged to a confused man, certainly would expect his brothers and sisters in the human race to accept the will of God and participate with God in the very act of creating a new human being. The Pro-Life movement has been upholding the value of life steadfastly all these years, trying mightily to persuade people across this nation to protect, uplift, and love all people, born and unborn. The pro-life movement has had some wonderful accomplishments in these 47 years and has saved thousands of lives that were going to be destroyed. The offer of prayers and assistance to upset or confused women has allowed many to enjoy the blessings of God's good Earth.

Sadly, though, the pro-life cause has taken many beatings, too. Rabid pro-abortionists, wrongheaded politicians and judges, and apathetic citizens have done their best to maintain the legality of abortion. The new presidential administration has promised to keep abortion legal and, to the horror of decent people, has promised to expand abortion's availability and make all Americans pay for it. President Biden needs our prayers.

It was Mother Teresa who said, "Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love but to use violence to get what it wants." Tired of the violence and vitriol that pervades our nation? Don't expect it to stop as long as this country allows a few thousand unborn babies to be violently torn from their mother's wombs.

Thus, we pray for an end of this scourge, and for the apathy ignorance, and selfishness that drives it. We pray for a better United States, a place where everyone conceived will enjoy the world God has made.

Though more appreciation is sure to come, I want to express thanks to our school principal, Mrs. Gayle Millburg, who announced last week that she is retiring at the end of this school year. As she said, she's ready to devote more time to being a grandmother. Queen of all Saints is blessed to have her. Pray for her. And pray for whomever will replace Mrs. Millburg, the finding of such will begin this week.

Curtailed by Covid-19, this is Catholic Schools Week. While a lot of the celebration of our great Catholic schools is less this year, we can all be proud of the good things that happen at Queen of All Saints and all Catholic schools. Thanks for the support and prayers you offer to make that happen.



Gnosticism

To continue this series on the Christological heresies, I was to say a bit about Gnosticism. Gnosticism, from the Greek work gnosis, meaning "knowledge," is not so much a concrete set of errant beliefs as it is a catch-all term for a loose collection of heretical ideas. Indeed, early Gnostic heretics like Marcion and Valentius simply invented much of what they taught, eschewing all parts of Scripture and Tradition that opposed their novel beliefs. Thus, while there were many heretics in the early Church who could rightly be called Gnostics, there was also much disagreement between individual Gnostics regarding what ought to be believed about God, the Scriptures, the Church, and the world. This week, I will just begin the discussion on Gnosticism.

Despite the discord that pervades Gnostic thought, there are common threads that stitch together the various strains of Gnosticism. These commonalities include, "a rejection of the goodness of the physical creation, a rejection of the goodness of human procreation in marriage, and a complex pantheon of lower divinities produced by successive emanations from the highest God." In other words, Gnostics rejected the basic Christian truth that the universe we live in, which we ourselves are a part of, is created by God and is, as Genesis says, "very good." Instead, they believed that demigods, something like the gods of pagan mythology, created the physical universe accidentally, as the consequence of some great cosmic sin. Thus, the universe and everything that inhabits it is considered to be evil, including and especially the human body.

Consequently, the Gnostics viewed the body as a fleshly prison, from which the soul needed to be freed. For Gnostics, armed with so negative a view of the human body, marriage was frowned upon, procreation itself was detested, and homosexual activity often emerged as the Gnostic's preferred alternative to authentic Christian love between one man and one woman. These are only some of the problems that early Christians faced when confronted with the heresy of Gnosticism.

In this context, it is easy to see how the evil of Gnosticism might warps one's understanding of Jesus Christ. If the human body is itself evil, as any Gnostic would claim, then it is not the kind of thing that could be associated with God in any substantial way. So, many Gnostics fell into Docetism, which denies that Jesus Christ was truly human (as mentioned in my previous column). On the other hand, those Gnostics who did not deny Jesus' true humanity made an equally nefarious claim: Jesus was truly a man, but he was not the True God. They believed instead that Jesus was a man who received a special indwelling of the Divinity at his Baptism in the Jordan and only retained this Divine Indwelling up to the time of the Passion. Whatever camp an individual Gnostic might fall into, it is clear that this heresy forces its adherents to choose between two false claims about Jesus Christ: either he is not God, or he is not man. Both of those positions are incompatible with the fundamental Christian Reality of the Word made flesh. In the coming weeks, I will dive further into these heresies, for the sake of greater clarity.
