God won't necessarily give you everything you want, but He will provide everything you need. Try this - use the word "pray" instead of the word "worry" in the future. Then pray for things instead of worrying about them.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The old man was making his way home through a forest where robbers loved to hide and pounce upon their terrified victims. Spotting their elderly prey, they accosted him and demanded all his valuables. He turned over all he had - books, money, a coat, his horse. The robbers grabbed him and twisted his arm. "Is this it? Are you hiding anything?" They screamed in to the old timer's ear, "Are you sure? You better be sure."

"That's all I have," the victim said. The robbers let him go, sending him off on foot, and threatened to find him and kill him if he told anyone about their wicked deed.

Shaken, and still terrified, the man hurriedly walked away. After putting over 100 yards distance between himself and the bad guys, he felt something hard strike his shin, over and over again. Suddenly he remembered that he had sown a gold piece into the hem of a robe several years before. At once he rushed back to the robbers - still examining their ill-gotten spoils - and said to them, "What I told you wasn't true; but it was unintentional. I was so frightened, I was terrified and I was too afraid to think I forgot I had this gold piece. Here, take the gold I had put into my robe."

To the victim's astonishment, none of the robbers made a move to cut open the hem of the garment. Rather, one went to his saddlebag and handed the old man the stolen wallet. Another returned the books and the coat. A third helped the elderly man get back on his horse. In the end the robbers asked the man to pray for them before he rode away.

At their core, in the depth of their soul, even robbers can recognize God's goodness when they see it; for that goodness inspires people. It moves them.

"What is this?" onlookers ask in today's Gospel, "A new teaching with authority." The people of Capernaum know. They are inspired, Christ moves them. They spread the fame of Jesus everywhere.

Whether it be a victim in the woods or the Son of God in a synagogue, we are blessed to have insight into the authority rooted in holiness. It is that type of authority Christ shares with us. It doesn't lead to selfishness, it isn't exercised by terror, it doesn't seek to rob or oppress. No, the authority we find through Christ uplifts those around us. It comforts, it assures, and sometimes it even surprises, and not just the recipient. The giver, too, - you and me - is surprised. "How was I able to do that? Where did that generosity come from? What is this?"

"This" is what Christ displayed in that synagogue. "This" is what Jesus inspires us to share today. Christ wants people to recognize God's goodness in us when they see it. Christ wants them to be moved by what we have done.

I was wrong last week when I asked you to pray for Catholic School's Week. It wasn't last week, it's this week. So, keep up those prayers. All Catholic schools, and ours in particular, add so much to the life of the Church. May God bless our staff and students at Queen of All Saints School as they continue the long tradition of prayer, education, and service that enable so many to do so much in the name of Jesus Christ.




50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDING OF QUEEN OF ALL SAINTS



Marcionism

One of the more prevalent forms of heresy that fits under the umbrella of Gnosticism, and which endures informally to this day, is known as Marcionism.

Aptly named after a man named Marcion, who lived during the second century, this heresy stems at least in part from an anti-Jewish sentiment held by Marcion himself. Because Marcion saw the strong influence of Judaism in early Christianity, often to the point of error, he began developing a view of God that is simply contrary to reality, and especially to Divine Revelation.

While Marcion himself made few philosophical, systematic assertions about God, he did make some concrete theological claims about God and Revealed Truth that put Marcionism into the category of Gnostic heresy. One such claim is that there is some distinction between the "god of the Old Testament" and the "God of the New Testament." In Marcion's view, the Jewish god was some sort of lower divinity, or demigod, which was just, but also merciless and prone to anger and violence. The Old Testament Jews' use of herem warfare was one example of such ruthlessness of this lesser deity, according to Marcion and his heretical disciples. The true God, Marcion would claim, is the Father mentioned by Jesus in the New Testament. This supreme God of the New Testament, the Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ, was considered to be the God of Love. Because he believed the True God is only accurately revealed in the New Testament, Marcion even made his own version of the Bible, which consisted of a highly

edited version of Luke's Gospel and just ten of St. Paul's Epistles. But to introduce such a distinction in God, divorcing the Old Testament from the New, eschewing thousands of years of Divine Revelation, is clearly problematic.

The error of Marcion continues to pop up even today. It is quite common that people, in an attempt to reconcile the apparent differences between God's actions in the New and Old Testaments, will tacitly adhere to the notion of a "god of the Old" and "God of the New" sort of theology. While they may never have heard of Marcion, it is a problem that can easily be arrived at by accident. So, we must always keep in mind the fact that, as the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Christians venerate the Old Testament as true Word of God. The Church has always vigorously opposed the idea of rejecting the Old Testament under the pretext that the New has rendered it void (Marcionism)." And, in fact, the New Testament and the Old Testament are mutually enriching in a way that is truly beautiful and inspired. It would be a real shame for us to lose our appreciation for one or the other, as we would lose some aspect of God's self-revelation to man.

FIRST FRIDAY DEVOTION



The First Friday Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is based on a promise made by our Lord Jesus Christ during an Apparition to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. This promise was implicitly approved by the Church in the 1920 canonization of St. Margaret Mary.

The 12 Promises are contained in a letter written in May, 1688, by St. Margaret Mary to Mother Saumaise: "On a Friday during Holy Communion, [Our Lord] said these words [...], if I mistake not: I promise you in the excessive mercy of My Heart that Its all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on nine first Fridays of the month consecutively, the grace of final repentance; they will not die under My displeasure or without receiving their Sacraments, My Divine Heart making Itself their assured refuge at the last moment."

The Promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque:

- 1. "I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life."
- 2. "I will establish peace in their homes."
- 3. "I will comfort them in their afflictions."
- 4. "I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all in death."
- 5. "I will pour abundant blessings upon all their undertakings."
- 6. "Sinners shall find in My Heart the source and the infinite ocean of mercy."
- 7. "Tepid souls shall grow fervent."
- 8. "Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection."
- 9. "I will bless every place where a picture of My Heart shall be set up and honored."
- 10. "I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts."
- 11. "Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart, never to be effaced."
- 12. "The all-powerful love of my heart will grant to all those who shall receive communion on the first Friday of nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die under my displeasure nor without receiving the sacraments; my heart shall be their assured refuge in their last hour."


