FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Years ago an old lady had no money to buy food. Trusting completely in God, she got down on her knees and prayed aloud: “Dear Lord, please send me a side of beef and a sack of cornmeal.”

Over and over again the old lady repeated the same plea in a loud voice. Now, one of the town’s most detestable characters heard her prayers, which had reached the level of shouting. The evil man decided to play a cruel joke. Hurrying to the nearest butcher, he bought a side of beef. Next, he went to the general store and bought the sack of cornmeal. Sneaking at night to the woman’s home, he left the food on her front stoop. When she discovered it early the next morning, her shrieks of joy awakened the entire neighborhood. People came out of their homes and rushed toward her with great curiosity. “What could cause such excitement?”

“The Lord answered my prayer,” she exclaimed, and happily she told her friends about her frequent, and loud, prayer. All praised God.

This was too much for the scoundrel. He ridiculed the woman and her neighbors. He told the whole town of his cruel joke, how he had purchased the food and left it at her door. He was full of laughter - and himself - until the poor old woman said, “Well, the devil may have brought it, but it was the Lord who sent it.”

Our First Reading and Gospel makes reference to food, lot’s of food, specially prepared food, food ready to be enjoyed. This is food offered to a people living in fear of punishment, defeat, and exile. The prophet, though, offers hope. God will provide, and when God does it will be amazing. It won’t be a snack, it will be a feast. It won’t be leftovers, it will be rich, juicy food and pure, choice wine. “Hold on,” exhorts Isaiah, “Look for this God to save us.”

Jesus, too, uses food in today’s parable. Another feast has been prepared and excitement grows as the time for the meal approaches. Well, the king is excited, and one can presume that the bride and groom are excited to enjoy their wedding reception, but no one else seems to care. They don’t have appetites, but they do have excuses.

“The devil still tries to play the part of the scoundrel, still tries to convince the crowd that faith and prayer are a big joke, there’s nothing to it. Sadly, many in our world and our community believe him. Amazingly, they don’t rush down the street to see what’s going on, they don’t travel Christopher Drive to learn what brings such happiness. They are content with poor behavior.

Such behavior, though, doesn’t play well with a king who provides a beautiful bounty. The man in the Gospel with poor behavior learned that lesson. When one feels that poor behavior will be tolerated, one finds himself tossed out into the darkness. He wails and grinds his teeth with the devil, who probably thinks it’s all very funny.

Better, always, to cry out in prayer to our God who provides what is choice, what is rich, what is best. It may take a while and we may have to shout and we may be surprised at the manner in which these blessings come. But they will arrive and we will rejoice, glad that God has saved us.

Source and Summit

Today, many may find it interesting that Holy Communion is actually the final of the three Sacraments of Initiation. But, as the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, “Those who have been raised to the dignity of the royal priesthood by Baptism and configured more deeply to Christ by Confirmation participate with the whole community in the Lord’s own sacrifice by means of the Eucharist.” Endless pages could be written, and have been, on the purpose and effects of this most holy Sacrament, which not only enables us to participate more fully in the life of God, by grace, but gives us actual union with Jesus Christ Himself, who is fully present in the Sacrament — body, blood, souls, and Divinity — under the appearances of bread and wine. The Eucharist is not only the “efficacious sign and sublime cause” of our sharing in the divine life, and of the “unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being,” but it is also “the culmination both of God’s action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit.” It is impossible to over-emphasize the importance of this Sacrament.

If we return to the analogy with natural human needs, the individual necessity for the reception of Holy Communion is clear. Just as human bodies need nourishment in the form of food and drink, so too do our souls. Christ’s decision to transubstantiate bread and wine into his own body and blood was not arbitrary. As creatures who feel still the consequences of Original Sin, we hunger and thirst for union with God, who is both the cause and the goal of our ultimate fulfillment. As King David says in Psalm 63, “O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting. My body pines for you like a dry, weary land without water...” Or, as Augustine famously said, “You created us for thyself [O Lord], and our hearts are restless till they rest in Thee.” By receiving Holy Communion worthily and well, the Real Presence of Christ rests in us, and afterwards, his grace permeates us. In the Eucharist, Jesus sustains us, gives us life, refreshes us, and makes us new. I will conclude here, but expect more on the Eucharist in future bulletin submissions. Let’s ask Christ to make us more aware of the full glory of his Eucharist!

doctors, etc).**



How to Pray the Rosary

1. SAY THESE PRAYERS...

IN THE NAME of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. *(As you say this, with your right hand touch your forehead when you say Father, touch your breastbone when you say Son, touch your left shoulder when you say Holy, and touch your right shoulder when you say Spirit.)*

I BELIEVE IN GOD, the Father almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into Hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty. He shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

OUR FATHER, Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

HAIL MARY, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

GLORY BE to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

O MY JESUS, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of Hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of Thy mercy. Amen.

HAIL HOLY QUEEN, mother of mercy; our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn, then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us. And after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Amen.

O GOD, WHOSE only-begotten Son by His life, death and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life; grant, we beseech Thee, that by meditating upon these mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

ANNOUNCE each mystery by saying something like, "The third Joyful Mystery is the Birth of Our Lord." This is required only when saying the Rosary in a group.

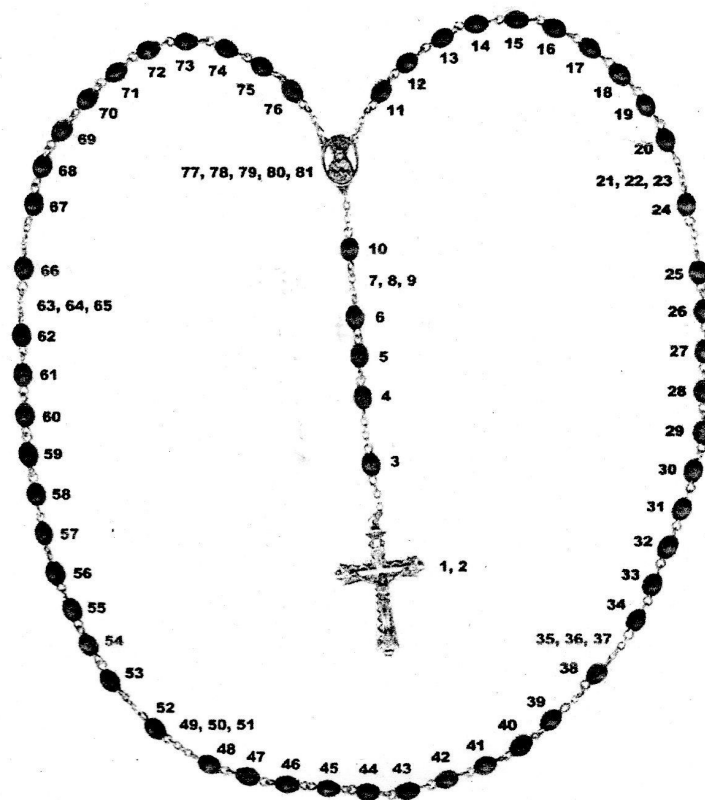

For each person, it is the journey through phases of maturation in Faith whereby one readies to commit oneself to Jesus Christ and His Church through seeking the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist/First Holy Communion).

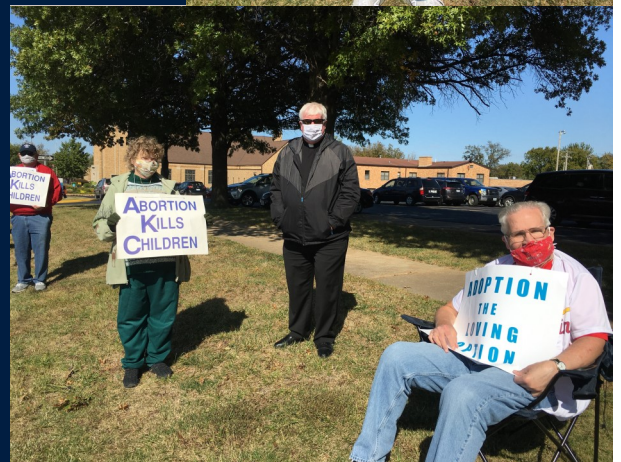


Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel for the Conversion of Abortionists

If we want to feast on the riches of God, it is essential for us to repent and turn away from our sins. How do you need to repent in order to be prepared for the wedding banquet?
