FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

In her book <u>Love and Duty</u>, author Anne Purcell writes about seeing U.S. Army Major Jim Statler standing next to her pastor after a Sunday service in 1968. She knew instantly that the Major was there with news about her husband, Colonel Ben Purcell, who was stationed in Vietnam. Shaking as the officer approached her and bracing

herself for dreadful news, she heard Major Statler say, "Ben was on a helicopter that was shot down. No body has been found, so he's being declared, "missing in action - MIA."

Ann recalled, "Somewhere in the back of my mind a little candle of flame flickered. This tiny flame was the vestige of my faith." Days passed without word. To Anne, being an MIA wife was like being in limbo. She found herself only able to pray one thing: 'Help me, dear Heavenly Father.' She says, 'I hung on to this important truth - that God would help me - and the flickering flame of faith began to grow.' Then one day Anne noticed a white dove sitting in her yard. It was particularly beautiful, very still and quiet, and a highly uncommon sight in her neighborhood. She took it as a sign from God that God, indeed, was always near.

Colonel Ben Purcell was the highest ranking Army officer captured by the Viet Cong during the Vietnam War. He had been a passenger on a helicopter shot down on February 6, 1968. Easily captured after the crash, Purcell and the others were made to march through the night with their arms tightly bound behind their backs. One soldier was more seriously wounded than the others, so much so that the Viet Cong decided this soldier should rest while the others marched on. Purcell was surprised at their kindness - until they heard a gun shot. The killing of their comrade provided a clue to the brutality the Americans would receive from their captors. Ben Purcell would spend five years in various prisons; all but the last few months in solitary confinement. In 1973, along with other prisoners-of-war, he returned to the United States, to his beloved wife, Anne.

For her part, Anne had kept up a steady string of prayers to God for her husband. For five years, she had clung to the fact that God was near. Little did she know that during those years before she was reunited with her husband, Ben was whispering to her from prison, "Anne, find solace and strength in the Lord."

Ben retired from the Army in 1980 and returned to his home in Georgia. He and Anne owned a Christmas tree farm in Clarkesville, which they operated until Ben's death in 2013.

Like the persistent widow in today's Gospel, Anne hung on to that "flickering flame of faith." Day after day, year after year, she beseeched Almighty God, convinced that God would hear her prayers. Like Moses in the First Reading, she lifted her hands in prayer, sure that God would help. God did.

Sometimes that's all we have - a flickering flame of faith. Sometimes all we can say is "Help me, dear Heavenly Father." That's all we need to say, that provides all the hope necessary. After all, as Jesus instructs, if a dishonest judge knows what to do, surely our loving Father will supply all our needs and calm all our fears. We just need to pray, to persist, and to know what wonders God can do with just a "flickering flame of faith."

Last week at our Convocation in the Ozarks I enjoyed a special time with my brother priests. This week I'll be enjoying a special time with family. I'm leaving Tuesday for the Trappist Monastery in Iowa where my uncle is a monk and priest. After a few days of retreat with the monks, my siblings will join me, along with my aunt, uncle, and cousins who also live in Iowa. It's the first time in seven years that we'll all be together. Please pray for our safe journey. I will be praying for you.

May God bless all of you.




