FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Scripture scholar and author William Barclay used to tell a story about an old school teacher. On the first day of school the teacher would enter the classroom, place his books on the desk, and have the students take their seats. Once they had quieted down, the teacher would walk to the center of the room, face the students, and bow to them - a profound bow done with great humility and reverence. He did this with every class every year.

As expected, someone asked him why he did this. He replied that he did it because he just didn't know how any of the children might turn out. He saw each child as a bundle of possibilities, and he bowed in the belief that many of them would become unique, special, and worthy of deep respect in later life.

Barclay concludes his story with the thought that God endows us with the potential to become great, in the best sense of the word.

Humility and reverence were two qualities not on the minds of James and John, though they surely would have liked that - people - bowing-to-us part. Greatness for them would not be found by fulfilling their "bundle of possibilities," but by Jesus granting their request, "in your glory we may sit at your right and the other at your left." The glory was appealing to them, the work? Not so much. The sacrifice? Not at all.

It should have been clear to James and John - and the other Apostles - by now that Jesus was molding them to be more like the teacher, bowing in reverence, than the students, recipients of that bow. How many times does Jesus have to emphasize this? Greatness is found in service, exaltation is achieved through humility, and not by jumping the line or being the first to ask Jesus for spots covered in glory.

The great humanitarian Mohandas Gandhi said, "The things that destroy us are: politics without principle; pleasure without conscience; wealth without work; knowledge without character; business without morality; science without humanity; and worship without sacrifice." I'm sure Jesus would agree with Gandhi, especially with part of joining worship to sacrifice, and vice-versa. "Can you drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" Jesus asks his Apostles. The importance of sacrifice before glory oozes from every word Jesus speaks. James and John are slow to understand this. Sometimes, so are we.

Yes, sometimes we'd like to ask Jesus the question James and John posed. Sometimes, we'd like to have all sorts of good stuff without, as Gandhi says, work, character, morality, sacrifice, etc. ... but we know that's not how it works, especially in matters of faith. Learning from Jesus, we know greatness will be found in service; we become first by being last.

Jesus was often addressed as Rabbi, which means Teacher. And as a teacher, I believe that Jesus would bow before us and see in us a "bundle of possibilities." Let us pray that those possibilities come to fruition as we join Christ in glory, not because we asked, but because we served.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION



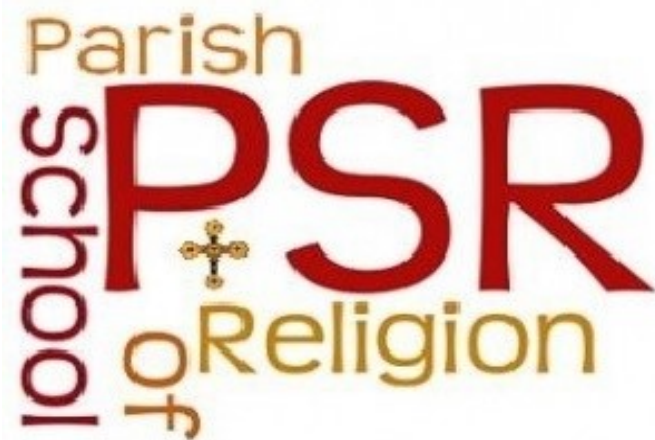
