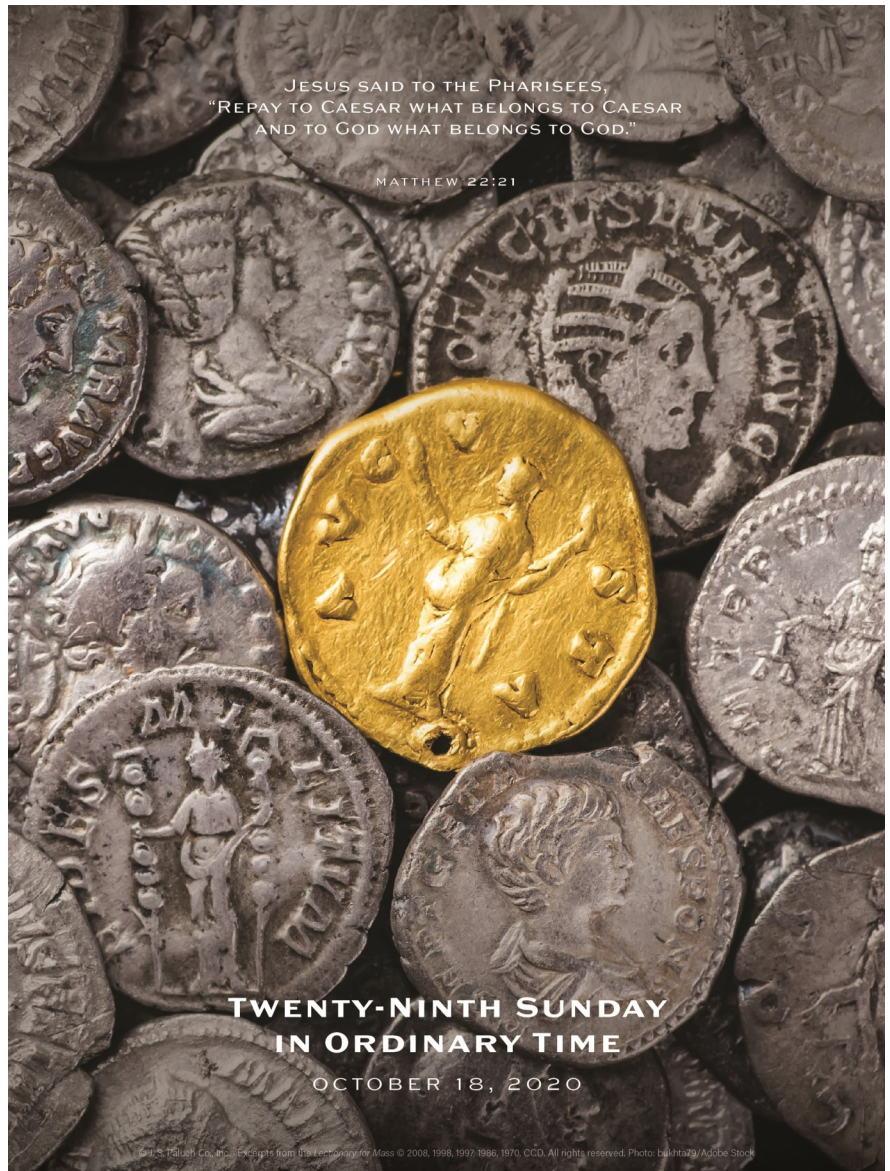

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We celebrate World Mission Sunday on October 18th this year. This annual, worldwide Eucharistic celebration emphasizes our shared baptismal call to mission.

Pope Francis, in his message for World Mission Sunday, implores us, “In this year marked by the suffering and challenges created by the COVID-19 pandemic, the missionary journey of the whole Church continues in light of the words found in the account of the calling of the prophet Isaiah: ‘Here I am, send me’ (6:8). This is the ever-new response to the Lord’s question: ‘Whom shall I send?’ This invitation from God’s merciful heart challenges both the Church and humanity, in the current world crisis.”

During the Mission Month of October, Pope Francis reminds us that, as baptized Christians, we are called personally to mission – especially at this time – to bring Christ’s love to those most forgotten around the world. Jesus is God the Father’s own Missionary; He asks us to respond to this call to mission, this invitation to “step out of ourselves for love of God and neighbor.” What will your answer be? “Here I Am, Send Me” is the response we will all endeavor to live out this World Mission Sunday, through prayer, participation in the Eucharist, and generosity to the collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

Through the Pope’s own missionary society, you too can be sent out to all the ends of the earth – sent through your support of missionaries and those they serve. Your gifts sustain priests, religious and lay pastoral leaders in more than 1,100 mission dioceses in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe as they proclaim the Gospel, build the Church, and serve the poor. With them, you answer, “Here I Am, Send Me.”

This year, in response to the challenges to the Mission Church from the pandemic, I invite all of us in this archdiocese to respond in the most generous way you are able. As you do, I offer my sincere personal gratitude for your kind missionary heart, reaching out in love throughout Mission Month.

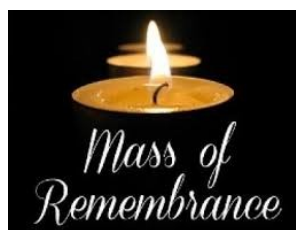

During this season the church invites us to remember those who have gone before us.

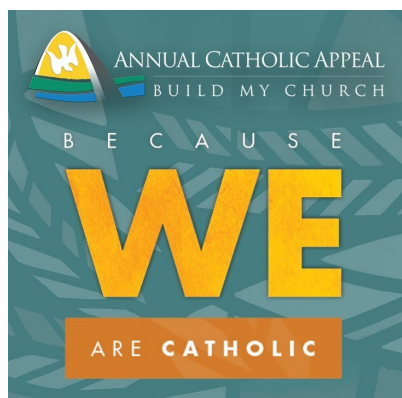
Queen of All Saints will be

Reconciliation

Christians need only look at the world around them to understand the necessity of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. While the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist) are the means of spiritual rebirth, growth to maturity, and nourishment, reception of these Sacraments does not prevent man from freely sinning later on. The consequence of especially egregious sins, known as mortal sins, is spiritual death, the expunging of God's sanctifying grace from the soul. In addition to being cut off from God's grace, a soul bereft of sanctifying grace becomes a wound on the mystical body of Christ, incapable of truly acting in supernatural Charity. Thankfully, Christ understood the frailty of humanity, that war between spirit and flesh that plagues fallen human beings, and he provided for our weakness by instituting the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The spiritual effects of this sacrament are numerous. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1496), these effects are:

reconciliation with God by which the penitent recovers grace; reconciliation with the Church; remission of the eternal punishment incurred by mortal sins; remission, at least in part, of temporal punishments resulting from sin; peace and serenity of conscience, and spiritual consolation; and an increase of spiritual strength for the Christian battle.

Chief among these many effects are those for which the sacrament receives its name: reconciliation with God, first, and then reconciliation with the Church. The reality of sin, as shown by the effects of Adam and Eve's first sin, is that it affects more than the sinner who completed the individual immoral act. In addition to siphoning out of individual souls one's own share in the life of God, sin reverberates through human relationships, preventing them from reaching the kind of charitable bond that God desires for man. By sincerely repenting of one's sins, confessing them to the priest, and resolving to make reparation for the damage caused by selfish action, the penitent then receives the absolution of Jesus Himself, which re-infuses the soul with all of the graces lost by the offenses committed.

If Pope Francis is remembered for anything, I hope it is for his emphasis on the Mercy of God. Because, while it can be easy to look at the evil that constantly occurs in our world and conclude that we need more wrath and judgement, the fact remains that Jesus died on the Cross because of our sins, not simply in spite of them. By doing so, Christ enables us to avail ourselves of a mercy that is truly infinite, and which He never tires of giving. This mercy is a reminder to our fallen humanity, which has lost its sense of self worth, that we are created in goodness and called to perfection. Redemption is the real antidote to fallenness, and an indispensable part of redemption is the continued ability to concretely experience the unlimited, merciful love of God through the sacrament of Reconciliation.

HISTORY OF THE HOLY ROSARY

In 1214, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to St. Dominic, accompanied by three angels, and she said, "Dear Dominic, do you know which weapon the Blessed Trinity wants to use to reform the world?...I want you to know that, in this kind of warfare, the principal weapon has always been the Angelic Psalter, which is the foundation-stone of the New Testament. Therefore, if you want to reach these hardened souls and win them over to God, preach my Psalter." The Angelic Psalter (Rosary) was also known as the Psalter of Jesus and Mary, because the Rosary of 15 mysteries each contained as many Angelic Salutations as the 150 Psalms in the Book of David.

Dominic made it easier to say by arranging the repeated prayers into three parts of five mysteries each. The JOYFUL Mysteries recall the events in the early life of Jesus, the SORROWFUL Mysteries tell of the suffering and death of Jesus, while the GLORIOUS Mysteries describe God's glory, power and love.

In 2002, St. John Paul II introduced the LUMINOUS mysteries which focus on public life of Jesus, when he proclaims the Gospel of the Kingdom.

AN ELECTION PRAYER TO MARY

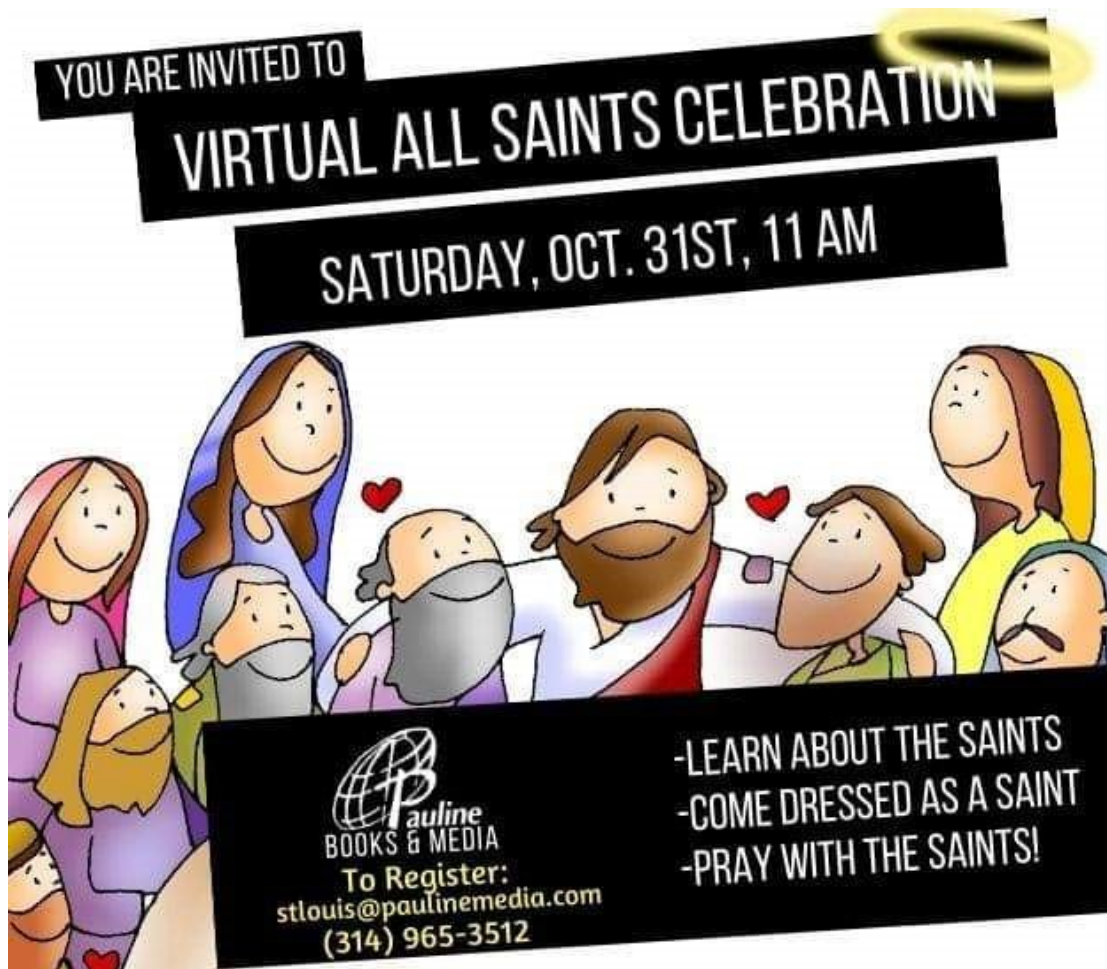
O Most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Mercy, at this most critical time, we entrust the United States of America to your loving care.
