STEWARDSHIP

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control.”

2 TIMOTHY 1:7

Many of us compartmentalize our Faith, we bring it out only when we attend Mass or when we attend a parish event. Being a good steward requires discipline and striving to put God first in everything - all the time. The next time you are at a neighborhood party or at work or out shopping, would your words and actions signal to others that you are a good and faithful servant of our Lord?

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

As legend has it, a just and good man went to Sodom, the evil city of ancient times, hoping to save the city from God's judgment. He tried talking first to one individual, and then to another, but nobody would engage him in conversation.

Next, he tried carrying a picket sign that had "REPENT" written on it in large letters. People stretched their necks to get a good look at the sign, saw what word was written on it, shrugged, and walked away.

Finally he began going from street to street and from marketplace to marketplace, shouting loudly, "Men and women of Sodom, repent! What you are doing is wrong. It will kill you! It will destroy you!"

The people laughed at him, but still he went about shouting. One day, a person stopped him and asked, "Stranger, can't you see that your shouting is useless?" The man replied, "Sure I can see that." The questioner persisted, "Then why do you shout? Why do you bother us?"

The visitor said, "When I arrived in this wicked city, I was convinced that I could change you citizens. Now I continue shouting because I don't want the citizens to change me."

Prophets like Habakkuk in today's First Reading strain their vocal chords imploring God's Chosen People to be faithful to the Covenant the Lord established with them. Habakkuk lived about 600 years before Christ at a time when the Babylonians (located near modern-day Baghdad, Iraq) were expanding their empire and Israel was next on the list of nations they wanted to conquer. Habakkuk was not the only one of God's messengers beseeching the people to repent and to obey, not the only one shouting at a selfish people who wanted to give scant attention to God.

In today's reading Habakkuk stops yelling at the people and begins to yell at God. "How long, O Lord? I cry for help but you do not listen!" It's one thing for humans to ignore the prophet; that happens all the time. But God?

The Lord, of course, assures the prophet that He, as God, has things in hand. Habakkuk is told to be patient. The vision in which God takes control will come true, God's time will have its fulfillment. Habakkuk, and all those believing in God, will not be disappointed.

Disappointment after prayer, though, is too often what we feel. We trust in God, we hope in God, and, as Jesus told us, we call out "Our Father." But then the opposite of what we're asking occurs, or, worse, nothing seems to happen at all.

A little boy once said to God, "I've been thinking, and I know what I want when I become a man." He proceeded to give God his list: to live in a big house with two Great Danes and a big yard...to marry a tall, blue-eyed, beautiful woman who would have three sons - one who would be a senator, one a scientist, and one an Olympic Gold Medalist. He wanted to drive a Corvette and travel all over the world.

As it turned out, the boy hurt his knee playing sports in high school, which made it difficult for him to walk, much less travel the globe. He married a beautiful woman - who was short, with brown eyes. He lived in a big city, in an apartment, with two cats. He took buses and subways to work and he never owned a car. He and his wife had three daughters - one became a nurse, one a teacher, and one an artist.

One morning the man awoke and remembered his boyhood dream. He became extremely depressed, so much that he became very ill. Close to death from a broken heart, he called out to God, "Remember when I was a boy and told you all the things I wanted? Why didn't you give me those things?"

"I could have," said God, "but I wanted to make you happy."

"Increase our faith," the Apostles implore Jesus in the Gospel. It seems like a nice question to ask. But Jesus informs them they already have enough faith; it's so fantastic they could uproot trees with it. Having faith is incredible, using that faith even more so. Jesus wants us to use the faith planted deep within us and trust that the Lord will respond to our faith in ways that are good and gracious. As the story says, "I wanted to make you happy."

What a great turnout for the St. Vincent de Paul Society's Walk for the Poor. My thanks to all who organized the walk, sponsored the walk, and participated in the walk. Your efforts will help many people. Thank you!

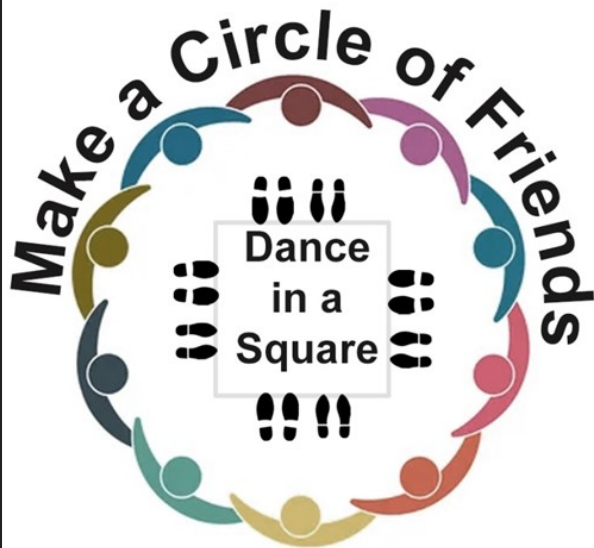
