### FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

One day, says an old legend, God gave a banquet for all his servants, and a really grand feast it was. All the virtues came and had a fine time. Humility was there, sitting in the lowest place at the table. Patience was there, and didn't mind being served last. Faith and Hope sat together. Everyone, it seemed, was having a wonderful time.

At the height of the banquet, Charity noticed that two of the virtues were strangers to each other. Charity was surprised because it thought they were always together and thus had been purposely set side by side. Charity came down to them and asked each one if they had ever met before. When they said they had not, Charity introduced them: "Kindness, I want you to meet Gratitude." Both the virtues were so surprised to find out who the other was. Kindness said to Gratitude: "We are supposed to be always together. Where one of us is, the other should be. Isn't it a pity we have never really met before?"

At least that pitiful legend is not true in the meeting between the blind man Bartimaeus and Jesus described in today's Gospel. Bartimaeus may have been blind but he certainly used his sense of hearing to learn about Jesus. Taking that knowledge, Bartimaeus used the gift of intelligence to deduce that Jesus was the Messiah, proving so as he addressed Jesus using a Messianic title, "Son of David." Jesus heard Bartimaeus, stopped walking, and called the blind man to himself. Another expression of faith was uttered, "Master, I want to see." Another reward for faith was bestowed in a miraculous way, "your faith has saved you." And Kindness and Gratitude meet.

Mere words of thanksgiving were not enough for Bartimaeus. Action was necessary, and Bartimaeus followed Jesus on his way toward Jerusalem. One can imagine what further blessings came to the once-blind beggar. There would be other miracles, along with profound teaching and beautiful prayer. Compassion would flow from Jesus; steadfastness and fortitude, too, rooted in obedience and strengthened in love. The now-sighted Bartimaeus would see it all because he allowed Kindness and Gratitude to meet.

So should we. God's blessings in our life are plentiful and we can be sure that Jesus is aware of our needs. We can cry out to Jesus, as did Bartimaeus, full of hope, confident that Jesus knows our needs even before we ask him. The love of Jesus makes that happen.

A little boy visiting the home of an elderly woman was intrigued by a wall motto bearing the words: "You, God, seest me." Noticing the child's interest, the gracious woman took the motto from the wall and began explaining it to the youngster.

"Some people will tell you," she said, "that God is always watching to see when you are doing wrong - so He can punish you. I don't want you to think of this motto in that way. Rather, every time you see the words, "You, God, seest me, I want you to remember that God loves you so much that he cannot take His off of you."

Certainly, that was the kind of love Bartimaeus discovered when Jesus looked at him. Truly, that's the kind of love we will experience when we cry out to Jesus from the midst of our sins, worries, and confusion. Jesus will stop. Jesus will call us to himself. Jesus will care for each one of us. And we will continue to follow Jesus on his way. That's what happens when Kindness and Gratitude meet.

May God bless all of you.

Congratulations to Holden Frost, grade 8, for being recognized as one of the Top 300 competitors in the 2021 Broadcom MASTERS® — the nation's premier STEM competition for middle school students. Each year middle school students across the nation are invited to apply for the Broadcom MASTERS competition by placing among the top 10% of participants at their Society-affiliated science fairs. This is Holden's second year being invited, having participated in the 2020 competition last year, and being invited again this year. Over 1800 students from 41 states plus Guam participated in the competition this year. Holden was one of six students from the state of Missouri to advance to the Top 300. Holden's project "Determining the Temperature Dependence and Order of Reaction of Kool Aid's Red Dye 40 Decomposition in the Presence of Metal" was originally presented as a 7<sup>th</sup> grade project at the Queen of All Saints Science Fair in spring 2021. # Dynamic Catholic, Alive! Amazing Grace

"Amazing Grace, how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me. I once was lost but now am found, was blind, but now I see." In today's Gospel, Jesus asks the blind man, "What do you want me to do for you?" He replies, "I want to see." And, he saw. This is truly amazing! Each of us is "blind" in our own way and Jesus is just waiting to be invited into our lives to pour His grace on us. The first step, like the blind man, is to humble ourselves before the Lord and recognize that we are broken and need His help (i.e. "have pity on me.") What do you want from the Lord? He is waiting. What are you waiting for?

#### JOHN 6:1-15

Let us focus on St. John's intense meditation on the meaning of the Eucharist. The tone is set with the familiar story of the feeding of the five thousand, the only miracle story mentioned in each of the four Gospels. This scene deeply affected the first Christians.

Jesus instructs his disciples to have the crowd recline on the grass. Taking the barley loaves and dried fish, Jesus makes a meal that satisfies the enormous crowd. They are hungry, tired, and worn out from their exertions, and Jesus gives them sustenance for the day.

For Thomas Aquinas, the great metaphor for the Eucharist is sustenance, food for the journey. Baptism defines us, making us sons and daughters of God; Confirmation confirms and deepens this identity; Marriage and Holy Orders seal us in our life's vocation. These are sacraments offered once at key moments in one's life.

Then there is the Eucharist, which is daily food, nourishment to get us through the day-to-day. How effective would we be if we never ate, or ate only on special occasions and in a festive environment? Not very. So, in the spiritual life, we must eat and drink or we will not have the strength.




