Do you really recognize that everything you have and that everything you are is a gift from God? The good news - it's not too late to put God first in all things in your life.

## FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners.

It once was said, "Christians love one another. They never fail to help widows; they save orphans from those who would hurt them. If a man has something, he gives freely to the man who has nothing. If they see a stranger, Christians take him home and are happy about it, as though the stranger was a real brother. They don't consider themselves brothers in the usual sense, these Christians, but brothers instead through the Spirit, in God. And if they hear that one of them is in jail or persecuted for professing the name of their Redeemer, they give him all he needs. This is really a new kind of person. There is something divine in them."

These words were recorded in the court of Emperor Hadrian of Rome in the second century AD, spoken by a non-Christian, Aristides, who had come to the court to offer a defense for Christians. We pray Aristdes would offer similar words in a court today.

While we may not be surrounded by dozens of widows and orphans as they were in days of old, and while we may not meet a lonely stranger and give that person a bedroom in our house, we remain nonetheless a new kind of person. There is something divine in us. We are not like those who care only for themselves nor like those who believe themselves better than others. No, Christianity does not make us apathetic or haughty. What it does make us is obedient.

Jesus in today's Gospel gives us the Great Commandment - Love God with all you have and love your neighbor as yourself. Two thousand years later, this commandment still rings in the ears of those whom Christ has called, people like you and me. Heeding this call, and being happy about it, has allowed Jesus to plant deep within us an amazing love. It's a steadfast love, a determined love. It's a love, as St. Paul says, that endures all things and never fails. It elevates us to generous acts of charity. It is the Divine within us.

Mother Teresa said, "Welfare is for a purpose. Christian love is for a person." That's you, that's me, possessing Christ's love, obeying Christ's command, giving evidence of Christ alive within. In a humble way, a quiet way, yet always in a way that impresses others, including one who may say in a court, "Christians love one another."

This week marks the end of the first quarter for Queen of All Saints School - and what a quarter it has been! I can't say enough about Mrs. Millburg and the faculty and staff of our school. Despite the travails associated with this pandemic, they have been able to teach the students well, keeping them as safe as possible from the virus and as close as possible to Jesus Christ, who loves them all.

I am grateful to them and to the many parents and parishioners who support them. One quarter down, three to go!

# FROM OUR SEMINARIAN JAKE BRAUN

Perhaps one of the least understood sacraments is the Anointing of the Sick. So, for this article, I just want to lay down some of the basic facts about

what is one of the last Sacraments received by Catholics before death.

First, it is important to understand who is the proper minister and who is the proper recipient of the Sacrament. Priests (or bishops) are the only ministers of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, and only those who are "seriously ill" may receive the sacrament. But further nuance is given to us by the Catechism of the Catholic Church which says, regarding reception of the sacrament, that Anointing of the Sick "is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death," but that "as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived." Furthermore, the Catechism states the following: "If a sick person who received this anointing recovers his health, he can in the case of another grave illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated. It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation. The same holds for the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced." The Church is generous with the Sacraments because she desires that we fully avail ourselves of God's infinite grace and mercy and love.

The purpose of Anointing of the Sick is also frequently misunderstood. While the Sacrament is certainly aimed at the healing of the person who is sick, the kind of healing that it aims for is spiritual in nature. So, insofar as it is helpful for the soul of the individual, it sometimes happens that physical healing, even miraculous ones, occur after the sacrament is administered. However, these are rare, as the spiritual healing and strengthening of the soul, which becomes fortified by grace to unite one's suffering with Christ, is the more important purpose of the Anointing. Next week, I will write about the effects of the sacrament in greater detail.






## MASS OF REMEMBRANCE


