FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Tom Coughlin is not on the sideline of a football field this year. In his career as a coach Coughlin worked at Boston College, the Jacksonville Jaguars, and the New York Giants, a team he coached to victory in two Super Bowls. But not this year. This fall he's at the bedside of his beloved wife, Judy. A year ago, she was diagnosed with a progressive brain disorder that has left her unable to walk, speak, think or control her body. Judy's condition

is incurable; it has taken her memory and her ability to express her emotions.

A periodical call *Connections* reported recently on an essay Tom Coughlin had written for the New York Times. Therein Coughlin penned:

"The first year I was home was frustrating. Judy had always taken care of everything at the house, and I had thrived always on the structure of football. That was gone, and I was lousy at my new job. I would constantly tell myself, 'I shouldn't be here.' But now, even though I am still lousy at being home, I know there is no other place I could ever be ...

"When Judy is having a good day, then my day is good. But then there are dark days - those days are so full of frustration and anger, they have me feeling like a failure and pondering the unfairness of this disease. I've spent my entire life preparing for some of the biggest games a person could play, but nothing can prepare you to be a caregiver who has to watch a loved one slip away.

"I am not seeking sympathy. It's the last thing I want. It's the last thing most caregivers want. Taking care of Judy is a promise I made 54 years ago when she was crazy enough to say, 'I do.' I do want the players I coached in college and in the NFL who thought all my crazy ideas about discipline, commitment and accountability ended when they left the field to know that's not the case. The truth is that this is when those qualities matter most. A friend said we don't get to choose our sunset, and that's true, but I am so blessed to get to hold Judy's hand through hers."

Tom and Judy's story adds to the amazing stories I have heard or experienced about married couples. I've been blessed by my own parents and relatives, sure - by so many couples who allow me to peer into their lives and contemplate the goodness that comes through "what God has joined together." There's strength in that joining, along with fidelity and love, a beautiful and enriching love which has many times touched my heart, and I'm sure yours, too. No wonder Jesus commands that this love is not to be separated by any human being. Thank you, married couples, for allowing us to experience the depth of God's love.

Thanks, too, to the members of the St. Vincent de Paul Society who organized and worked at last Sunday's Walk for the Poor. What a marvelous turnout and day. The funds raised will help so many people. Surely, God had His hand in this endeavor, and because God did, we were wonderfully blessed.

I will be leaving this afternoon to attend a workshop on the Gospel of Luke. I will return Thursday afternoon. Know that you will be in my prayers, especially at Mass.





Blood is amazing stuff. Did you know that adults have approximately 16 pints of blood in their body at any given time? One collection unit of blood is about 1 pint. It takes roughly 14 hours for your body to replace a donated pint of blood. In the U.S. alone, 41,000 units of blood are used each day. Only about 5% of healthy Americans donate blood. Multiple donations account for over 80% of the blood used for transfusions.

There is no substitute for blood.

You have the power to help people you may not even know. All is takes is for you to roll up your sleeve and donate a pint of blood. Remember, whole blood and blood products such as platelets can't be manufactured; they can only be given freely through the compassionate generosity of donors.

n 1531, when the indigenous peoples of Mexico were subjugated and the practice of human sacrifice was still a recent memory, the Mother of God appeared to St. Juan Diego as a pregnant native woman, now known as Our Lady of Guadalupe.

She sent him with miraculous flowers in his cloak to tell the bishop to build a church where people could receive her Son and her loving, tender care. When St. Juan Diego opened the cloak before the bishop, an image of Our Lady was revealed that remains to this day. The chapel was quickly built, millions embraced Christianity, and the Church increased its protection of the indigenous peoples.

By embracing the mission entrusted to him, St. Juan Diego helped bring Christ's transforming love to

cultures gripped by oppression and death.

Today, we again see the dignity of human life disregarded. Unborn children are destroyed through abortion, and ill people are encouraged and assisted to take their own lives. How do we respond?

The essence of our identity is that we are created in God's image and likeness and loved


by Him. Nothing can diminish the priceless worth of any human life. Every person is *cherished*.

embrace our daily mission to help others encounter God's transforming, life-giving love.


