FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

All the invoices have been paid and all the deposits made for the 2022 Parish Picnic. It appears that the final net profit will be \$59,000, a fantastic sum. Our parish owes a debt to Michael and Jenny Schmidt, Todd and Laura Schmidt, Tony and Jaime Trupiano, and a whole bunch of other people and organizations who proved to be able volunteers, whose work made the picnic a great success.

A mighty word of gratitude goes to Dave Sinclair Buick for donating a car for the raffle and to all the businesses who sponsored the picnic. The participation of these businesses was a valuable asset.

Of course, a picnic's success depends on the patrons. So, thanks to all of you who came that day to enjoy the goodness found at Queen of All Saints.

I immensely enjoyed my stay last week at the Trappist Monastery outside Dubuque, Iowa. Fr. Brendan Freeman, O.C.S.O., my uncle, is the superior there, providing spiritual direction and guidance for the 18 monks who compose the community. Not only was it wonderful to have a few days of quiet and prayer at the monastery, but also to enjoy our family reunion, which featured my own family from St. Louis, along with my aunt and uncle from Des Moines, and cousins who came from New York, Atlanta, and Chicago. We had a great time telling stories, laughing, eating, and, of course, praying at Mass. God blessed us with fantastic weather and safe travel.

One of the things I noticed when I arrived at the monastery on the 18th was a change in the monks' Order of the Day. Trappist monks, like many other forms of monks, follow the Rule of St. Benedict. In the sixth century Benedict gathered a group of men who sought the solitude of a countryside or a mountain. To enable this group to grow spiritually, Benedict crafted some helpful rules to promote a Christian way of living that would enable the community to grow in faith and to exhibit Christian fellowship. This Rule of St. Benedict remains the way of life some fifteen centuries later.

There were some, however, who thought that the Rule was not adhered too strictly, that monks were lax in the application of the Rule. First at a place in France called Citeaux (from which we get the Cistercian) and later at a place in the Normandy region called Le Trappe (from which we get the word Trappist), monks began to live a stricter interpretation of the Rule of St. Benedict. So, for instance, Benedictines live in monastic communities behind cloistered walls, but they also may come out and serve the people ministerially. In St. Louis this can be seen at St. Louis Abbey, where the monks come out and run Priory High School. The Trappists are forbidden to have outside ministry. The Benedictines may have a time during the day where the monks congregate for recreation and discussions. The Trappists do not have such a time. That's why they have the initials OCSO - Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance. They're really strict!

At any rate, I noticed the change in the Order of the Day. The change was in their time of arising and the first time they gathered in their church to chant the Divine Office. The new time of arising was 4:15am; their first prayers, called Vigils, now begins at 4:30am. Prior to October 1, they arose at 3:15am and prayers began at 3:30am. This, sadly, is a concession to their old age. I think two of the monks are under age 50, maybe two more are under 70. The rest would be older, many in their 80's and 90's. The monks go to bed at 8:00pm and the extra hour of sleep is helpful to the old guys.

Still, during the reunion, my cousin's son asked my uncle why they awakened early in the first place, what's the point in getting up at 3:15am or 4:15am? My uncle answered, "because it's still night and most people are in bed. Yet the night has many dangers. So we get up to pray for you. We don't sleep so you can sleep safely." What a gift that is to all of us! Others are sacrificing so that we may have God's protection. And it's not just the Trappists and Benedictines who do such a special thing, but other monastic and cloistered communities, too, like the Poor Clares in our area, or the Carmelite nuns in Ladue, or the Pink Sisters in North St. Louis City. Many of these religious orders are struggling for vocations, they are aging and some are near to closing. But they get up, they pray, they pray for you and me.

That makes them like St. Paul, who writes to the Thessalonians in our Second Reading, "We always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his calling, and powerfully bring to fulfillment every good purpose and every effort of faith...." How comforting. Our purpose and efforts are powerful because of those religious orders who gather very early every day to pray for us.

Don't forget that Tuesday, the 1st, is the Feast of All Saints, a holy day of obligation. I also invite you to Mass on the 2nd, All Souls Day.

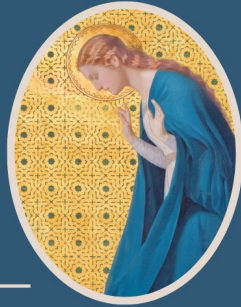
YOU ARE INVITED

WORD OF LIFE

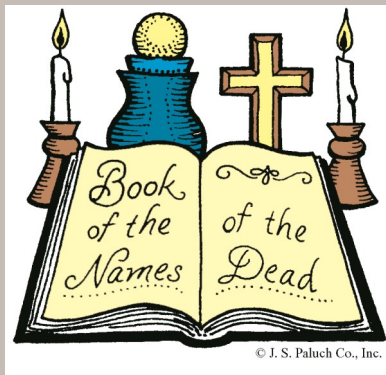
