Do you become silent? Do you react in anger or do you react with love? Fortunately, as one Body of Christ, we are united with the saints already in Heaven. Ask your favorite saint for guidance in defending the Faith.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Allow me to share some thoughts as Election Day draws near. I begin by noting that a wonderful guide for forming our conscience is available at the website of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. (Google USCCB to find this document).

Secondly, I will quote from the article by Archbishop Rozanski in the St. Louis Review: "First: If you don't hold that abortion is the pre-eminent moral issue of our time, and if you don't struggle to justify voting for a candidate whose record or policy would favor or even expand abortion, then you probably aren't forming a Catholic conscience in preparation to vote."

The Archbishop continues: "Second: If you think that other serious issues like race, immigration and the environment can be dismissed or ignored, and if you don't struggle to justify voting for a candidate whose record would be contrary to Catholic teaching on these matters, then you probably aren't forming a Catholic conscience in preparation to vote."

Archbishop Rozanski emphasizes that he is not going to tell people how to vote. Every Catholic is obliged to form his/her conscience, an obligation taken with great seriousness. I won't tell people how to vote, either, but I will offer a few thoughts.

When I consider all the issues before me, two rise to a higher level, two are very important to me. One, it's very important to me that every child conceived is allowed to be born. Every living embryo, fetus, baby should have the same opportunities and gifts that I had when I was in my mother's womb. Every one of those conceived should be allowed to feel the sun on their face, know the comfort of being held or hugged, savor a good steak or a hot fudge sundae, know the joy of running through a field or the satisfaction of getting an "A" on the test. I ask myself, "How are we a great country when we allow some people - sometimes on just a whim - to deprive the developing baby these experiences?"

Abortion is the most despicable occurrence in our time, yet many say it's just one issue among many to be considered. Fair immigration laws, health care, education, civil rights, and the environment are pro-life issues, too. Such people get no argument from me. But what if we change that most despicable fact from abortion to slavery? What if the candidate had terrific ideas about all sorts of issues, but also insisted that slavery should be legal? And if going back to pre-1865 is far-fetched, then how about something contemporary - the slavery of the sex-trade industry. What if a candidate supported that?

Too egregious? Well, how about segregation? What if a candidate had brilliant ideas on immigration, health care, the economy, and the environment, but believed these goals should be accomplished by a segregated population?

Would such a person get my vote? Yours? Would such a person gain more than two minutes of our attention?

Yet, to me, abortion rises to the level of indignation and the horror of slavery or segregation. In fact, one could argue that abortion is worse. So, I would have a hard time voting for such a candidate, knowing that such a person could come back to me and say, "After I took office I was able to expand abortion laws in this country and, in fact, passed laws that made you pay for more abortions. Your vote for me made that possible. Your vote made it possible that more unborn babies would not feel the warmth of the sun or sleigh down a hill. Thanks for your vote."

Abortion's horror, then, is paramount in my mind. But I also consider this: If and when a child is born, will that person be allowed the liberty to practice religion as he/she sees fit? A recent article in the Post-Dispatch noted that new Supreme Court Justice Amy Barrett served on the board of a private Christian school that had, in the opinion of the writer, anti-LGBT policies, along with policies against pre-marital sex and cohabitation. Such policies were seen as awful and discriminatory, and anyone who held to such beliefs should be embarrassed. Someone like that certainly is not fit to hold office in our country!

This isn't the first time Christians have been attacked, called names, sued in court, or seen as unfit because of our beliefs. So I ask myself: What candidate will work for religious liberty while in office? Who will try their best to assure a Catholic Christian like me may practice my faith with all sincerity, unafraid that my religious views will be restricted? Would I be pleased if the candidate for whom I voted passed or signed into law mandates which would forbid Catholic schools and universities from receiving certification unless said school teach as normal practices which Scripture and Church teaching deem sinful? Would it be a good thing if Catholic hospitals and medical professionals were forced, under threat of losing their licenses, to perform procedures that are immoral in the eyes of the Church?

Every person conceived allowed to be born. Every person born allowed to worship and serve God without government interference. These issues top my list of considerations. When I pray about my vote, these issues cause me to pray for the wisdom of God. What are your issues? What makes you plead for heavenly guidance? Don't go to the polls without praying first.

These are my thoughts, anyway as we approach this momentous Election Day. May the Holy Spirit guide all those who have yet to vote.

May God bless this nation, and all of you.

ROSARY FOR A PEACEFUL ELECTION



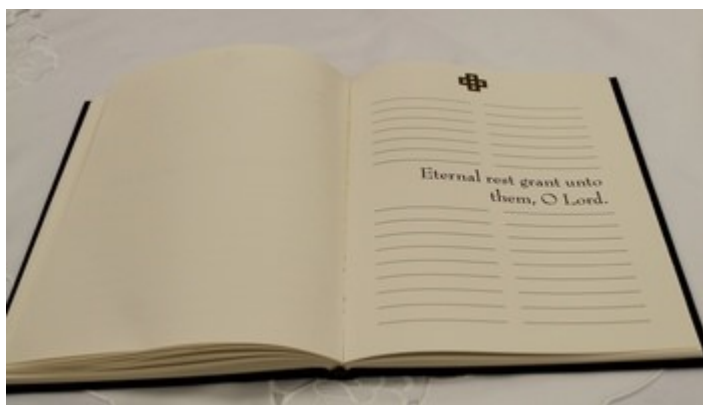

Rachel's Vineyard Retreat

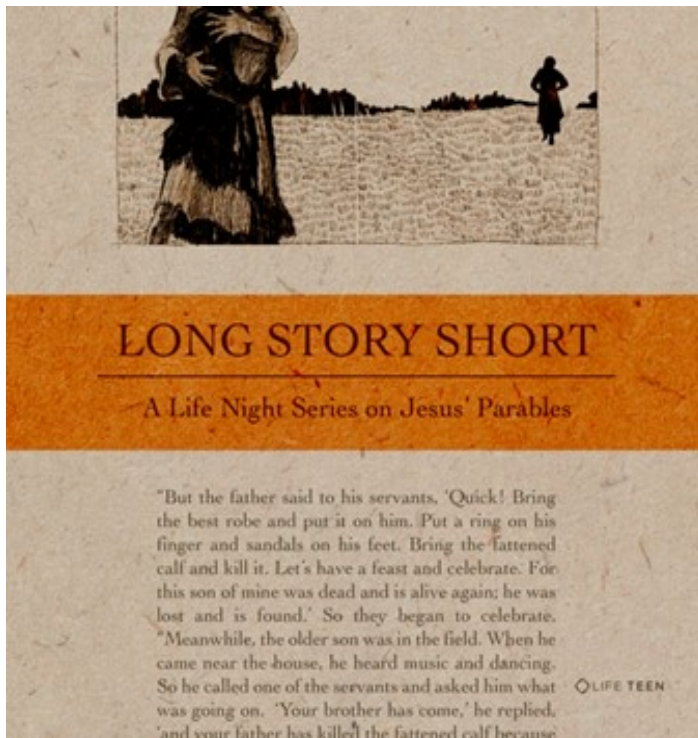
November 13-15, 2020

Rachel's Vineyard, offered through the Archdiocese of St. Louis Abortion Healing Ministry, has helped 320,000-plus women and men globally since its founding in 1993 by psychologist Dr. Theresa Burke (see <https://rachelvineyard.org/>).

A trained and compassionate team, including a priest and professional therapist, will gently lead participants through the critical steps of healing after abortion and encountering the merciful love of Jesus Christ, the Divine Physician. The retreat will be held in a comfortable, prayerful, and confidential setting in the St. Louis area, with proper Covid-19 precautions in place.
