FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

I must say I was surprised a few months ago when I learned that Queen of All Saints Parish would not be involved in a merger with another parish, at least not in the initial models proposed by the All Things New committees. Based on my observation of realignments of parishes at other American dioceses and on conversations at gatherings of priests, I came to the belief that every parish in our archdiocese would have to merge with at least one other parish, if not more. Surely, I, and others, reasoned, this would be the only way we could allocate enough priests

to care for the spiritual needs of the people.

I was wrong. And surprised. When it was made known that our parish would continue as it is - at least from the parish side - I was happy for all of you. Merging parishes is not an easy process. There's a lot of grief, anger, suspicion, and fear. But there's also hope, faith, and charity, and determination. I've witnessed a lot of all these values and emotions through the years. And while the mergers of parishes with which I've been involved produced wonderful communities dedicated to God and one another, I just as soon would not want this community of QAS to go through that.

So, indeed, I was glad to see in the initial models that we would be a stand-alone parish. I wasn't ready to declare it a "done deal" - you shouldn't either. Those who attended the Listening Sessions last week saw and heard a lot of proposals for Area Five, the area of South County in which Queen of All Saints was placed. This area includes parishes that are bordered by the City limits, the Mississippi, Jefferson County, and Crestwood. Only the parishes of St. Francis of Assissi, St. Margaret Mary, and us are left alone in all the models proposed. Part of that is because of geography (in our case, our proximity to the Mississippi and the Meramec Rivers) and part of that is due to our size and our strengths. We as a parish are financially sound, our buildings are in good shape, and, most importantly, we are a vibrant community with excellent enrollment in our school and generous outreach to the poor. The other parishes in our area, however, are going to have to merge. This will mean the parishes will be very large, in some cases with as many as 4,500 households (we have 2,000), and longer drives to Mass and parish gatherings. Most of the parishes in the archdiocese, urban, and suburban, and rural, are going to undergo this merging process - and it won't be easy.

We should not, though, clap our hands and figure we're done with all this. What we heard last week was just a proposal. New ideas about what to do in our area and what to do with us could still emerge. But for now I'm glad that QAS will not have to endure the merging process.

You probably heard that decisions about the schools in the archdiocese are being postponed for a year. Originally, final decisions on elementary schools like our were going to be promulgated in the second week of January, 2023. That decision now will not be announced until 2024. Here, our school is in good shape. We provide a quality education. We have projects which allow the students to learn the value and joy discovered in serving others. Our principal and staff approach their tasks with great zeal. And, best of all, we do so surrounded by faith. Christ is praised, called upon, and thanked every day. I have confidence that our school will be one of those staying open in the future.

It is vital to understand, each one of us, that we're still part of All Things New. Now, we have to do something new. As a parish we simply cannot go on as before. We can't say "whew" we got through that and forget about it. We have to do more to fill up the pews on Sundays. Fifty years ago, this parish was founded to praise God. If the praise of God is not the foremost activity of this parish, especially in the most sacred prayer that is the Sunday Mass, then we have lost our way, we have gone off course. That, then, should be the resolution we make in All Things New. Reach out to those we don't see on Sunday. Invite them to the Mass. Let them be enriched with the sacraments and supported by our prayers.



CYC Basketball Officials and Scorekeepers Needed


Anyone interested in officiating or scorekeeping should contact Rob Gerber at RobGerber@Kenrick.edu.

The season starts January 6, 2023.




